

Video overview:

Do you ever have the experience of hearing one of the stories from the Gospels for the hundredth time and suddenly realizing how strange it is? Often, we have heard these stories since we were children, that they can go in one ear and out the other without much notice. We can go our whole life without realizing how strange Jesus really was. This Sunday we have one such Gospel reading. Every Lent we hear this story of Jesus going to the desert for forty days to be tempted by Satan. But isn't this an odd thing for Jesus to do? Why would he intentionally go out into the desert like this? In her wisdom, the Church gives us this reading at the beginning of Lent because Jesus is giving us an example of what the season of Lent is meant to be for us. Lent is a time to remember the reality of our life on earth. In the way that Lent prepares us for Easter, our life on earth is meant to prepare us for heaven – the eternal Easter. We are battling against evil in the desert of this world, with the hope of the resurrection on the other side. Lent draws us into this reality and prepares us for this battle.

<u>Featured study</u>: Into the Desert. A Lenten study on Prayer. Powerful. Topic of Interest:

The use of this short reading from Mark for the First Sunday of Lent is of very ancient origin. It introduces the struggle against Satan that we are to share with Christ during the Lenten season. As Jesus will say later, "No one can enter a strong man's house ... unless he first binds the strong man" (Mk 3:27, RSV). Jesus combats the evil that tries to take the world—his house—from him. If our "house" is to become a temple of the Holy Spirit, the influence of evil must be swept away. The Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are meant to do this under the influence of God's grace. Jesus, by fasting and praying in the desert, repeats, completes, and perfects all the purifications of the past. He is the new Adam, the new Noah, the new Moses, and the new Israel. Jesus does perfectly what these others had done imperfectly and shows us, as members of his Body, how to overcome sin. When Jesus returns from the desert, he invites us to join him with the words that could be considered the primary theme of Lent: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."



PROTOCOLS FOR INDOOR MASS

- The resumption of indoor Mass permits a limit of 25% of our normal seating capacity i.e. 175 persons maximum. Overflow seating will be in the hall.
- Sign in for contact tracing & temperature screening. Counters open 30 minutes before Mass Times.
- The Sunday Mass schedule is to remain unchanged until the volume of parishioners necessitates adding a 4th English Mass and a 2nd Spanish Mass.
- For the reception of Holy Communion, we are resuming the normal procedure of parishioners approaching the sanctuary in single-file line.
- COVID-19 precautions remain in place. Please maintain physical distancing & keep mask on at all times.
- Avoid congregating after Mass to allow time for disinfecting the Church.
- A donation box for Sunday and Special Collection is available at the entrance.
- The Church will remain open for private prayers daily from 9am – 6pm.



Lenten Regulations

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

In order to foster a spirit of repentance and unite ourselves more closely to Christ, Church law requires the observance of Abstinence and Fasting during Lent.

ABSTINENCE

All persons, 14 years and older, are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. "...[Any] parish or diocesan institution or group which sponsors an event which includes a meal is not to serve meat on any Friday during the year". Other forms of abstinence, for example abstinence from alcoholic beverages, television, video games, the internet, and social media, are also beneficial.

FASTING

Everyone from ages 18 to 59 is obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Voluntary fasting on other weekdays of Lent, especially on Wednesdays and Fridays, is highly recommended. Fasting is understood to mean that one full meal may be eaten. Two other small meals may be eaten, but together they should not equal a full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted.

When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, neither the law of fasting nor the law of abstinence obliges. If in doubt, one's parish priest or confessor should be consulted.

PRAYER

Catholics are urged to read and pray with sacred Scripture more intently during Lent, and to deepen their faith by reading the Catechism of the Catholic Church. The faithful are encouraged to participate in special devotions offered by the parish, especially Eucharistic adoration. Other devotions such as the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, visits to the Blessed Sacrament, and praying for vocations to the priesthood and religious life are also encouraged.
