Video overview: Luke's familiar story of the prodigal son, should be looked at more closely in the historical setting so we see that for Jesus' original audience in the first century it would have been a shocking story. The younger son is desperately restless. He goes about seeking fulfillment for his life in all the wrong places. In asking his father for his share of the inheritance right away, he is essentially telling his father, "I wish you were dead" because the inheritance usually wouldn't come until after his father's death. He then sells his share of the inheritance and squanders it on prostitutes. The son is looking for happiness in wealth and pleasure rather than in his relationship with his father. But this son isn't the only character to act in a surprising way. When the father sees him returning, he runs to meet him. Fathers were expected to act with dignity, so running to meet anyone—let alone a son who has shamed the family— would have been shocking. Indeed, the action is completely incomprehensible to the older son. He has remained obedient to his father, but he views his father more as a master and himself as a servant. In this story the father goes out to meet both his sons and invite them into the feast—and into a better understanding of his love.

Featured study: Prodigal Son

Reflection: The story of the prodigal son expresses a summary of the Christian understanding of who God is, who we are in relation to him, and what the process is that he has willed for our salvation. This story has been used to explain the errors of Pharisaism by looking at the attitudes of the elder brother toward his younger brother. Pharisaism is generally defined as a rigid practice of the external forms of religion or morality without genuine regard for the proper reasons for doing so. A Pharisee doesn't recognize his own need of a savior, and that kind of blindness can afflict both those who are too intent upon the following of rules as well as those who don't think that there ought to be any rules at all. Neither recognizes their need for mercy. Jesus doesn't free us of the obligation to act rightly; he mercifully gives us the power (grace) to act rightly and gives us his mercy when we don't deserve it.

The Significance of Palm Sunday

On Palm Sunday, a week before Easter, the Catholic Church recalls Jesus' messianic entrance into Jerusalem before his crucifixion. As Jesus rode into the city on a small donkey, the Jews gathered around him, throwing cloaks and palm branches on the road and exclaiming praises as he passed by.



So at Palm Sunday Masses, there is a blessing of palms which the faithful hold as they process into church. The blessed palms are later kept in the home as a witness to faith in Jesus Christ, the Messianic King, and in his Paschal victory.

During Palm Sunday Mass, the Gospel account of the Passion of Christ is announced, with the priest, deacon, readers and congregation reading aloud, respectively, the responses of Christ, the Apostles and the crowds who appear throughout the Passion.

Beginning Palm Sunday, some churches cover or veil -with purple cloth - the religious artwork in the church -except stained glass windows and the Stations of the Cross. Crucifixes are unveiled after the Good Friday ceremonies and all other images just before the Easter Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday.

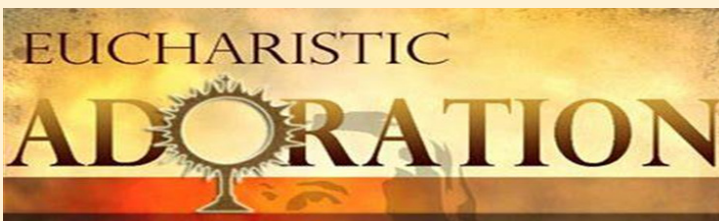


First Saturday Holy Rosary Act of Reparation SJV † SPP

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The Stations of the Cross devotion is centered on the Passion of Christ. While many Catholics pray the meditative prayer on their own across the year, it can be an especially poignant experience during Holy Week, when the entire church recalls the way of Jesus' suffering and death. In fact, on Good Friday, many churches host parish-wide Stations of the Cross. By praying the Stations of the Cross, a person makes a spiritual pilgrimage to the principal scenes of the salvific Passion of the Lord, aided by artistic representations of those scenes, for example, Pilate's condemnation of Christ to death and the nailing of Christ to the Cross. Usually, Stations of the Cross are found inside churches, spaced in intervals on the walls, but sometimes outdoors such as in the cloisters of monasteries. Each year, in Anchorage, Catholics gather to pray the Stations of the Cross, walking through the city.

Youth & Young Adults Corner

In my letter last week, I said that Catholicism was more than just boxes to check. So what is it about, then? At its core, our faith is about relationship. Think of it like this: 1 John 4 says that “God is love.” Now this might sound like some cheesy hallmark phrase to you and me because, to be honest, we’ve heard it repeated to the billionth degree, right? But it is actually a profoundly important verse.

You see, love cannot exist in a vacuum. By definition, love requires three things: a Lover, a Beloved, and a Gift. We see this expressed in our everyday lives, such as when friends exchange gifts to express love for one another. This is where we see the Trinity: the Father (Lover) loves the Son (Beloved) and the love exchanged between them is the Holy Spirit (Gift). In other words, in God’s own existence, He exists as a relationship of persons eternally loving one another in total sacrifice and self-gift. What does this have to do with you?

When we were baptized, we were literally adopted into the life of the Trinity! In Christ, we received the gift of the Holy Spirit at baptism, and we truly became sons of God. The problem is our choices: we deny the Lover, dismiss the Beloved, and disregard the Gift. But our God is a loving and forgiving God, and just like the father in today’s gospel reading, He is anxiously awaiting your return, no matter what you’ve done.

Anointing of the Sick

Baptisms:

English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held online.

Bautizos:

Bautizos en Español son cada 3er Sábado del mes a las 9:30 am. Clases pre-bautismales son el Domingo anterior al bautizo de las 9am-1pm.

Marriage:

As a minimum requirement, couples must contact the parish office and set an appointment at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Marriage preparation classes online.

Matrimonio:

Se requiere que las parejas contacten a la oficina parroquial cuando menos seis meses antes de la fecha de matrimonio. Clases prematrimoniales son en persona.

First Eucharist:

A two year family formation program preparation is required. Children must be a minimum of 6 years old. Classes run from September-May and registrations are open June-August.

Primer Comunión:

Programa de dos años en el programa de formación familiar es requerido. Los niños deben tener 6 años cumplidos o más. Inscripciones son Junio-Agosto y las clases son Septiembre-Mayo.

Youth Confirmation:

Candidates for Confirmation must be at least 12 years old and in 7th grade to start the program. A two-year religious education preparation is required prior to receiving the Sacrament.

POPE TO CONSECRATE RUSSIA AND UKRAINE TO IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY

The consecration of Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary by Pope Francis will take place during the Celebration of Penance on 25 March in St Peter's Basilica.

Pope Francis will consecrate Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on Friday, 25 March, during the Celebration of Penance that he will preside over at 5pm in St Peter's Basilica.

The Director of the Holy See Press Office, Matteo Bruni, said in a statement: "The same act, on the same day, will be performed in Fatima by Cardinal Konrad Krajewski, papal almoner," who is being sent there by the Pope.

Cardinal Konrad Krajewski was one of two papal envoys sent to Ukraine last week in an expression of the pope's concern for the war-torn country's population.

The day of the Feast of the Annunciation of the Lord was chosen for the consecration.
