

Video overview: The Holy Spirit came upon the apostles and empowering them to preach with confidence. One of the interesting things is the parallel between how the Spirit came down in fire, loud sound, and personal revelation to the apostles on that Pentecost day and how Moses received the Law on Mount Sinai, where similar things happened. But the crucial point is the transformation that took place in the lives of the apostles, who changed from timid souls cowering in a locked room to fearless witnesses of what Jesus accomplished through his death and resurrection. These same changes occur today in those who live according to God's Spirit by experiencing the same life-transforming power of God that changed the apostles two thousand years ago. 1 Cor 12:3-7, 12-13 ties the coming of the Holy Spirit to Baptism. Not only does everyone receive "the manifestation of the Spirit for some benefit," but all are baptized into one body, where all "drink of one Spirit." In like manner, the Gospel links the Holy Spirit with the forgiveness of sins—the sins wiped away at Baptism and the forgiveness of sins committed after Baptism. The Holy Spirit does not come only once to us but continues to dwell within our souls and transform us.

Featured study: The Holy Spirit and the life of Grace

Reflection: In this scene from the Resurrection account of John, we have a kind of mini-Pentecost. The dramatic events of Pentecost day that will reveal the Church to the wider world are already being played out in this Resurrection event, which is itself connected in John's Gospel to the moment of Jesus' death on the cross, when "he bowed his head and gave up his spirit" (John 19:30, RSV). His last breath is the sign of the forgiveness of sins that is now set in motion in the Church on "that first day of the week." This text from John 20 is considered to be the clearest sign of the institution of the sacrament of Confession or Reconciliation in the Gospels. What Jesus had promised to Peter in particular and then to the Twelve collectively in Matthew 16:19 and 18:18, "Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven," now finds a precise form in the ministry of mercy. When we think of the gift of the priesthood to the Church, do we first think of the gift of God's mercy that it brings to us? Often we think of the Pope, bishops, and priests as "authority figures," as a kind of necessary concession to the needs of ordering a human society on earth. But the mystery of the priesthood is much deeper and richer than mere organizational requirements, as real as they are. In the Church, Peter and the apostles, their successors, the Pope and bishops, are a gift of his mercy to us.



From the Pastor

PENTECOST - Happy Birthday, Church!

This weekend, the Church celebrates Pentecost, one of the most important feast days of the year that concludes the Easter season and celebrates the beginning of the Church.

The timing and origins of Pentecost: Pentecost always occurs 50 days after the death and resurrection of Jesus, and ten days after his ascension into heaven. The timing of these feasts is also where Catholics get the concept of the Novena - nine days of prayer - because in Acts 1, Mary and the Apostles prayed together "continuously" for nine days after the Ascension leading up to Pentecost. Traditionally, the Church prays the Novena to the Holy Spirit in the days before Pentecost.

The name of the day itself is derived from the Greek word "pentecoste," meaning 50th.

What happens at Pentecost? In the Christian tradition, Pentecost is the celebration of the person of the Holy Spirit coming upon the Apostles, Mary, and the first followers of Jesus, who were gathered together in the Upper Room.

The Holy Spirit also gave the apostles the other gifts and fruits necessary to fulfill the great commission - to go out and preach the Gospel to all nations. It fulfills the New Testament promise from Christ (Luke 24:46-49) that the Apostles would be "clothed with power" before they would be sent out to spread the Gospel. Pentecost is considered the birthday of the Church - Peter, the first Pope, preaches for the first time and converts thousands of new believers. The apostles and believers, for the first time, were united by a common language, and a common zeal and purpose to go and preach the Gospel.

POPE FRANCIS: ASK THE LORD FOR THE GIFT OF PEACE

In his Sunday Regina Caeli address, Pope Francis reflected on Jesus' words to the disciples at the Last Supper in the Gospel reading from John: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you."

Speaking to an estimated 25,000 pilgrims gathered on a bright day in St. Peter's Square in Rome, the pope noted that Jesus also makes a point to add, "Not as the world gives do I give it to you" (John 14:27).

"What is this peace that the world does not know and the Lord gives us?" Pope Francis asked.

"This peace is the Holy Spirit, the same Spirit of Jesus. It is the presence of God in us, it is God's 'power of peace,'" he explained. "It is He, the Holy Spirit, who disarms the heart and fills it with serenity. It is He, the Holy Spirit, who loosens rigidity and extinguishes the temptations to attack others. It is He, the Holy Spirit, who reminds us that there are brothers and sisters beside us, not obstacles or adversaries.

"It is He, the Holy Spirit, who gives us the strength to forgive, to begin again, to set out anew because we cannot do this with our own strength. And it is with Him, with the Holy Spirit, that we become men and women of peace," Pope Francis said.

"This is the source of the peace Jesus gives us," he added. "For no one can leave others peace if they do not have it within themselves. No one can give peace unless that person is at peace." (Read more: www.catholicnewsagency.com/news)


