Video overview: In this Sunday’s Gospel reading, Jesus says that God is “not God of the dead, but of the living” (Luke 20:38). You might think that’s a pretty obvious statement. But it has profound implications for how we live as Christians because this reality underlies something at the heart of Catholic teaching—the Communion of the Saints. The saints, those who have died and gone before us in faith, remain connected to us through Jesus Christ. They aren’t detached spirits floating about in some mystical realm but fellow members of Christ’s body who remain deeply concerned about God’s plan for salvation here on earth. They have been through the same struggles we have and they now stand before God’s throne in heaven, cheering us on as we live out our lives and missions here on earth. They are alive in the body of Christ, just as we are. Because they are alive in Christ, we can ask them to pray for us and intercede for us. This is our basic understanding of the Communion of Saints—through Jesus, we are all “in communion” with each other. We can ask the saints, as our brothers and sisters in heaven, to lift us up to our God and intercede on our behalf. The readings for today reaffirm that belief by reminding us that God is indeed the God of the living—those of us still on earth as well as those who now live directly in the Divine Presence.

Featured study: The Saints by Dr. Scott Hahn

Reflection: Sadducees were a party of uncertain origin. Although they had clear religious affiliations, they might best be described as cultural Jews. They were disinterested in devotional Judaism but wanted to maintain their social status as leaders in the Jewish community. They were extreme religious conservatives in the sense that they denied the canonical character of everything in the Hebrew Scriptures except the first five books called the Torah or Pentateuch. Although Jesus’ teaching would’ve been far from the materialist doctrine of the Sadducees, he meets their criteria for valid argument by only referring to the Mosaic text in proving the immortality of the soul. Jesus overcomes what the Sadducees would’ve thought of as an unanswerable objection to the belief in the afterlife. The fallacy in the Sadducees’ position is that life after death must be entirely different from life here. One of the aims of marriage is the propagation of the species. But, if there’s no more death, there would be no further need for propagation either. Extinction is no longer a possibility in an eternal life and so the marital relationship would be drastically altered.

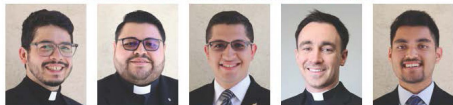

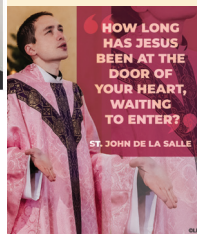

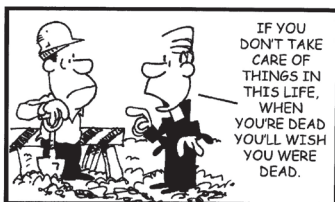

On Thursday, we celebrate the memorial of St. Leo the Great, a fifth-century pope during a very turbulent time politically and doctrinally. There were heated debates about the nature of Christ. The Bishops met for a council to discuss the issue, and Leo wrote a document explaining that Jesus is one person with two natures. This was then proclaimed by the bishops as being the true apostolic faith, proclaiming "Peter has spoken through Leo!" Simultaneously, Barbarian forces swept through Europe, leaving destruction in their wake. As they approached Rome (which lacked forces to defend itself), Leo donned his vestments and met the leader, Attila, on the battlefield. Leo was able to negotiate with Attila to save Rome. Little did he know that Attila also had a vision in which he saw Ss. Peter and Paul standing alongside Leo. In other words, St. Leo was not alone, and his bravery saved countless lives. St. Leo is known both for his staunch orthodoxy and faithfulness, as well as his love for his people. This is something we all should imitate: stand firm in our beliefs, never letting the winds of the time sway us, and yet still striving after peace and bringing Christ to all those we encounter. Whether we are defending our faith or defending the innocent, know that we are not alone. God is with us always, just as He was with St. Leo the Great.

English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held online.

Bautizos:

Marriage:

As a minimum requirement, couples must contact the parish office and set an appointment at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Marriage preparation classes online.

'Lazy, tepid, sad': Pope Francis explains how desolation can be turned to good

Pope Francis explained on Wednesday how times of spiritual desolation — described by St. Ignatius of Loyola as feelings of inquiet, temptation, sadness — can also help bring us closer to God.

"No one wants to be desolate, sad. We would all like a life that is always joyful, cheerful, and fulfilled. Yet this, besides not being possible — because it is not possible — would not be good for us either," the pope said during the general audience on Oct. 26.

In fact, he added, feelings of sadness or remorse can be the impetus for turning away from a life of vice.

Pope Francis continued his lessons on discernment with a reflection on spiritual desolation at his weekly gathering with the public in St. Peter's Square.

Quoting from St. Ignatius of Loyola's spiritual exercises, he said desolation is defined as "darkness of soul, disturbance in it, movement to things low and earthly, the inquiet of different agitations and temptations, moving to want of confidence, without hope, without love, when the soul finds itself all lazy, tepid, sad, and as if separated from its Creator and Lord."

He said one thing to know about desolation is that it is an invitation to self-reflection.

"It is important to learn how to read sadness," Francis said. "We all know what sadness is — everyone. But do we know how to read it? Do we know what it means for me, this sadness of today?"

Pope Francis said we should also be aware of how the devil may try to use feelings of sadness or desolation to tempt us away from intentions to live with virtue.

"For those, on the other hand, who have the desire to do good, sadness is an obstacle with which the tempter tries to discourage us," he explained.

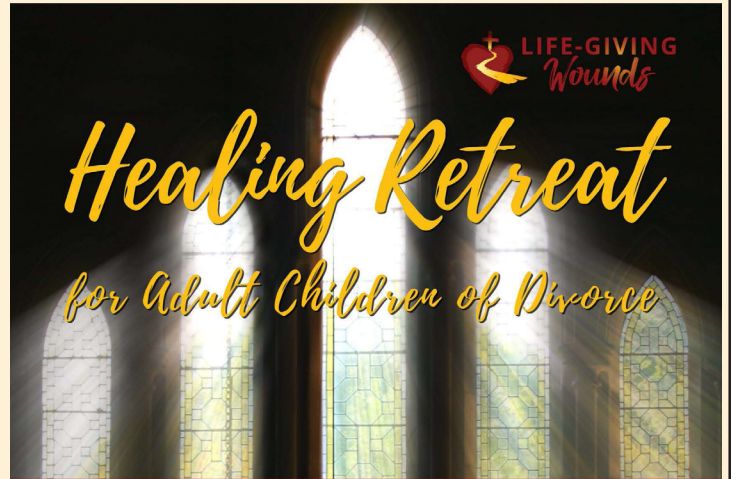
"It is important, for those who want to serve the Lord, not to be led astray by desolation," he warned, encouraging people to first pause and consider their state of mind before taking any drastic decisions.

"A wise rule says not to make changes when you are desolate," he said, without the help of a good spiritual guide.
