

Word of Life

31st Sunday in Ordinary Time: Love Your Neighbor For Love of God

One of the scribes, when he came forward and heard them disputing and saw how well he had answered them, asked him, "Which is the first of all the commandments?" Jesus replied, "The first is this: 'Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." (Mark 12: 28-31)

One of the many traps that has stalked - and at times hunted down - Catholics in these post-council years has been trying to separate the love of God from the love of neighbor. For a time, the love of God was presented as a competitor to the love of man. It was even said that if you loved your neighbor for the love of God deep down you did not love your neighbor. In this way an attempt was made to sever the root of love, the religious motivation. For no other reason than to love man for man that love soon languished, beginning by ceasing to love those who were not "nice": enemies, unpleasant people, and those from another country, another culture or another religion.

On the other hand, those who have withstood the test - those who have continued to nurture their human love with religious motivations, with prayer, with the Eucharist, with confession - have seen their love of neighbor strengthened, because when the human motive to love was no longer enough, there was still the enormous flow of divine motive. If you don't do things for him - God tells us, referring to our neighbor - do them for me. It is a question, then, of understanding that there is only one commandment: that of love. And that this unique commandment has two inseparable dimensions: God and man. You cannot love the first without loving the second and vice versa. But love of God precedes love of man since it is his root, his food, his continuous source of renewal. The love of man, on the contrary, is proof that our love of God is true and not just a rhetorical theory.

Resolution: Love others. And when it is difficult, remember that we owe a great debt to God and that we must repay it by doing good even to those who do not deserve it.



From the Pastor | Palabras Del Pastor

My dear parishioners,

I would like to dedicate this reflection to the veneration of relics, since it is something we have been doing lately, and because we just celebrated All Saints.

"Besides sacramental liturgy and sacramentals, catechesis must take into account the **forms of piety and popular devotions** among the faithful. The religious sense of the Christian people has always found expression in various forms of piety surrounding the Church's sacramental life, such as the **veneration of relics**, visits to sanctuaries, pilgrimages, processions, the stations of the cross, religious dances, the rosary, medals, etc." (1)

Saint Thomas Aquinas states in his Summa Theologiae that "it is manifest that we should show honor to the saints of God, as being members of Christ, the children and friends of God, and our intercessors" (2) and that "God Himself fittingly honors such relics by working miracles at their presence" (3). In fact, we see in Sacred Scripture how devotion to the relics of God's holy ones have been a source of grace, witnessing thus to the power of their intercession. Here are some examples: "Elisha died and was buried. At that time of year, bands of used to raid the land. Once some people were burying a man, when suddenly they saw such a raiding band. So, they cast the man into the grave of Elisha, and everyone went off. But when the man came in contact with the bones of Elisha, he came back to life and got to his feet." (2 Kings 13:20-21). "So extraordinary were the mighty deeds **God accomplished at the hands of** Paul that when face cloths or aprons that touched his skin were applied to the sick, their diseases left them, and the evil spirits came out of them." (Acts 19:11-12).

A First Class Relic is a part of the body. Second Class Relic is something that belonged or was used by a saint (i.e. a rosary). A Third Class Relic is usually a piece of cloth that is passed by a First Class Relic.

We believe in the Communion of Saints. Miracles do exist and the intercession of God's friends in heaven are effective and true. The One True God is not someone who is jealous, but someone who finds joy in sharing with His children the richness of His graces. We are fortunate to be accompanied by God's holy ones in our journey to heavenly bliss. Let us not disregard their help. By honoring them, we acknowledge God's work and holiness in them.

Mis queridos feligreses,

Quisiera dedicar esta reflexión a la veneración de las reliquias, ya que es algo que venimos haciendo últimamente, y porque acabamos de a Todos los Santos.

"Además de la liturgia sacramental y de los sacramentales, la catequesis debe tener en cuenta las formas de piedad de los fieles y de religiosidad popular. El sentido religioso del pueblo cristiano ha encontrado, en todo tiempo, su expresión en formas variadas de piedad en torno a la vida sacramental de la Iglesia: tales como la veneración de las reliquias, las visitas a santuarios, las peregrinaciones, las procesiones, el vía crucis, las danzas religiosas, el rosario, las medallas, etc."

Sto. Tomás de Aquino afirma en su Suma Teológica que "debemos venerar a los santos de Dios, como miembros de Cristo, hijos y amigos de Dios e intercesores nuestros. Y, por tanto, debemos venerar dignamente cualquier reliquia suya, y en memoria de los mismos; especialmente sus cuerpos, que fueron templo y órganos del Espíritu Santo, que habitó y actuó en ellos, y que están destinados a configurarse con el cuerpo de Cristo por medio de la gloria de la resurrección. Por eso el propio Dios honra oportunamente estas reliquias, realizando milagros ante la presencia de esos cuerpos."(2)

De hecho, vemos en la Sagrada Escritura cómo la devoción a las reliquias de los santos de Dios ha sido fuente de gracia, testimoniando así el poder de la intercesión de ellos. He aquí algunos ejemplos: "Eliseo murió y lo enterraron. Bandas de moabitas penetraban en el país al inicio de cada año. En una ocasión, estaban unos enterrando a un hombre y, al avistar una de estas bandas, lo arrojaron en la tumba de Eliseo y huyeron. Entonces el cadáver entró en contacto con los huesos de Eliseo, cobró vida y se puso en pie." (2 Reyes 13,20-21). "Dios hacía por medio de Pablo milagros no comunes, ¹²hasta el punto que bastaba aplicar a los enfermos pañuelos o ropas que habían tocado su cuerpo para que se alejasen de ellos las enfermedades y saliesen los espíritus malos." (Hechos 19,11-12)

Una reliquia de primer grado es una parte del cuerpo. Una eliquia de segundo grado es algo que perteneció o fue utilizado por un santo (por ejemplo, un rosario). Una reliquia de tercer grado suele ser un trozo de tela que se pasa por una reliquia de primer grado.

Creemos en la Comunión de los Santos. Los milagros existen y la intercesión de los amigos de Dios en el cielo son eficaces. El Único Dios Verdadero no es alguien celoso, sino alguien que encuentra alegría en compartir con sus hijos la riqueza de sus gracias. Tenemos la suerte de estar acompañados por los santos de Dios en nuestro camino hacia el cielo. No despreciemos su ayuda. Al honrarlos, reconocemos la obra y la santidad de Dios en ellos.

Communion to the Sick / Homebound


All Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (**EMHC**) to the sick / homebound are required to have:

- The Commissioning Rite to give Communion to the Sick.
- "The Administration of Communion to the Sick by an Extraordinary Minister" booklet.
- A corded burse.
- A pyx.
- A purificator.
- Safe Environment compliant if bringing Communion to the sick/ homebound that are not family members.

To bring Communion to the sick, the EMHC will bring their empty and purified pyx before Mass along with their burse. To purify a pyx, clean it with water, and consume the water. Wipe it with a purificator, wring out any excess water from the purificator in the ground.
