Video overview: The imagery of sight and blindness pervades the readings for this Sunday. The Church uses this metaphor to help us understand how we are blinded by sin and are in need of Christ’s light in order to follow him. In modern society, we think of freedom as the absolute ability to do whatever we want, as long as we don’t hurt anyone else. As Christians, this gravely distorts our understanding of sin. It follows from that definition of freedom that there really is no sin; as long as what we do affects ourselves, then it cannot harm anyone else. This is not a Catholic understanding of sin and freedom. We believe that we are only free as far as we are able to *do the good freely*. We grow in freedom the more that we resist evil and choose what is good. Moreover, sin is not private, because it gravely offends our relationship with God, it hurts our union with others, and we only hurt ourselves by sinning. In the Bible, we see attachment to sin described as blindness. The one who is full of sin is actually made blind to reality. The more we sin, the less we are able to see the truth clearly. Through Jesus Christ, we are able to overcome our blindness and step into his light. Do we have the spiritual strength to let go of our petty attachments, and choose Christ above all else?

Featured study: True Beauty: Broken, Healed & Holy, Part 2 with Crystalina Evert

Topic of Interest: When we choose sin, our ability to judge between right and wrong is diminished. Sin leads to more sin, so that it becomes a vice, which is a habit of sin that eventually no longer disturbs our consciences. We rationalize our sin to the point that we become blind to it. Not only does sin make us blind to the evil in our life, but it also makes us blind to the true good. In other words, we become blind to the words of the Scriptures, in which God is calling us to return to him. Consider your own life, paying attention to times when you allowed a certain vice rule over you. Did you notice a difference in the way that you saw or responded to God during that time?



From the Pastor

Protocol for Indoor Masses

FILIPINO-AMERICAN APOSTOLATE (FAA)

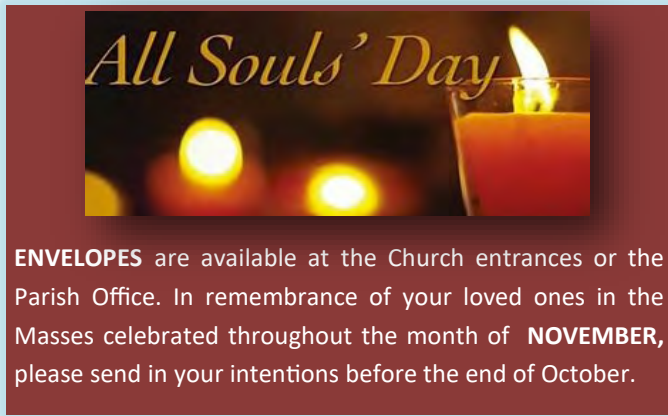
Meets every last Friday, 7pm-8:30pm, SW Room (Hall)

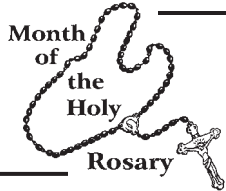

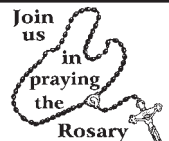
