Video overview: We're called to think about the end of our life every single day. While we should always be prepared for the end of the world, we should anticipate more readily the end of our lives. Thus, Jesus invites us to live fully present in our here and now. Focusing too much on deciphering the end times diverts us from truly focusing on God and how we are meant to be in relationship with him in every moment.

Featured study: Unlocking the book of Revelation.

Topic of Interest: "I assure you that this generation shall not pass away until all these things take place." Jesus is speaking about the destruction of the Temple (not the world), and the disciples ask when this destruction will occur. Jesus replies that it will occur within a generation; forty years. This example, was from the "generation", that defied Yahweh in the exodus and would die off before Israel could enter into the Promised Land. Jesus spoke of the sun and moon being darkened and the stars falling from the sky? For the Jews, the Temple and Jerusalem were understood to be symbols of God's whole creation. The veil in the Temple had the sun, moon and stars recognizing God's domain. The early Church absorbed this understanding and saw the beginning of a new world, the Christian world or age. We still divide time into two ages: "B.C." and "A.D.," which mean, "Before Christ" and "Anno Domini" ("The Year of the Lord"). And so, when the Church looks ahead to the return of Christ at His Second Coming, she believes that the events of that time will parallel the events of 70 A.D. Just as the old world passed away with the destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple, the whole world will pass away at some future time, the day and the hour of which remain unknown to all but God.
