Video Overview: The short reading from Daniel is often interpreted to refer prophetically to the end of time. This preoccupation, however, does not properly reference the Second Coming of Christ. “Christians today do not think enough about the second coming of Christ; we tend to reflect exclusively on our death and our appearance before the judgment seat of God. The ‘last judgment’” is, in any case, more than simply a judgment and should not be approached purely in a spirit of fear lest we are punished. It is also God’s great act of reconstruction, and we can be sure that God will produce something unimaginably new and great.

Featured Study: Session 10: The Last Things; [View Symbolon - Knowing the Faith Series](#). What does the Church really teach about death, judgment, Heaven, and Hell? It's time to separate the myths from the reality. Use the participant guide.

Topics of Interest: The Prophet Zechariah sees a vision of the future messianic king of a reunited Israel, but he is not a king of the typical sort. This king will “banish the chariot” and “the warrior’s bow.” And he will establish a peace that extends well beyond the boundaries of the present country of Israel. He is a “savior,” but not a military one. His dominion is rooted not in might, but in righteousness, in meekness. He will arrive, not on a war horse, but on a mere “colt, the foal of an ass.” The Hebrew Moshiah refers to the anointing that kings (as well as priests and prophets) would have received as a sign of office.
