Video overview: John’s Gospel explains God’s ways are not our ways, and God’s Kingdom is not like the kingdoms of the earth. Some 1st century Jews expected a king of strength to crush their political enemies as Isaiah identified Jesus as both Lamb and as a conquering king, yet Jesus comes as an infant child, to suffer and crucified. Jesus suffers so that we may enter into his very suffering and through his death, experience the Resurrection of the Dead and everlasting joy. While we will not experience true rest until Heaven, God’s Kingdom exists already here on this earth, through the grace of Christ in his sacraments, which have been given to the Church in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

Featured study: Jesus, the Word made flesh

Topic of Interest: Jesus acknowledges to Pilate that he is a King, but not of this world but If Jesus was really their King, why didn’t he allow the people to declare him King? Jews wanted a political and material kingship, but Christ gave them a spiritual kingship. Those who had received bread and fish from Jesus thought of his Kingdom in worldly terms, but St. Paul said, “The Kingdom of God is not a matter of eating or drinking, but of justice, peace, and the joy that is given by the Holy Spirit” by the truth that this is Christ’s Kingdom: “The reason I was born into the world, is to testify to the truth. Anyone committed to the truth hears my voice.” Thus, Jesus’s dominion extends over those who seek and follow the truth. In the words of Jesus, “You shall know the truth, and the truth will set you free” and the truth is that Jesus is the Son of God. Indeed, as Christ said, “I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life”. Thus, God is the source of all truth, and everything is thereby under the Kingship of Christ. In his first encyclical, Redemptor Hominis, Pope John Paul II stated that Christ came to witness to the truth, which means it is also the mission of the Church. The truth of Jesus Christ will fully liberate man, not mere political or legal measures. Christ denied the false views of the zealots to bring freedom to Israel by the sword, i.e. political freedom. The sword Jesus allows is the sword of his Word, which frees captives and extends the Kingdom in spirit and in truth. WINTER SHELTER

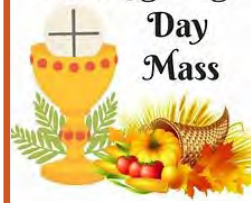

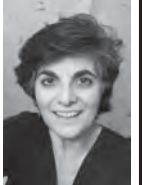
