<u>Video Overview:</u> If the first Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of a new liturgical year, why does the Gospel focus on endings as it talks about the sun and moon darkening and the stars falling from the sky? We're supposed to be preparing to celebrate Jesus' birth as the Messiah, not hear about the end of the world. What's going on here?

Featured Study: "Making sense out of suffering" - Dr. Scott Hahn. We all experience suffering at some time in our lives. Our tribulations range from small disappointments to serious tragedies. Listen as Scripture scholar and lay theologian, Dr. Scott Hahn, makes sense out of suffering by drawing from the wisdom and insight of God's Word. He helps us find the meaning of our suffering by showing us how to unite it to the suffering of Christ on the Cross.

Topics of Interest: What we need to understand is that inherent in every beginning is also an ending. The Jewish believers who first heard Jesus make this prophecy would have understood its deeper metaphorical meaning, not that the literal End of Days was at hand, but that the world was about to experience an ending to an old way of life and the beginning of new life marked by hope and encouragement. They would have heard these words and remembered their own salvation history, how God brought down mighty kingdoms and raised up his people. They would have seen them as a sign of God's power and rejoiced, not just in what God has done in the past, but also in what he is doing in the present time. That's the message we are supposed to get from these readings as well.

SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION DECEMBER 8, HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION

This coming Saturday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, the patronal feast of the United States. On this day we acknowledge the beautiful reality that the Blessed Virgin Mary was conceived Immaculately, without the stain of original sin. This truth resonates into all of our beliefs in the Catholic Church.

Because this truth about our faith is so important, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is a holy day of obligation. This means that a faithful Catholic must attend mass either on the Vigil of the solemnity (Dec. 7) or on the solemnity itself (Dec. 8).

While it is true that an evening Mass on the day of a Holy Day of Obligation would meet the requirements a faithful Catholic is obliged to, one cannot attend a single mass to meet two obligations. Thus, if one chooses to attend mass at our Saturday evening Mass at 5:30pm to meet their requirement for the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, they would still be obliged to attend another mass to meet their Sunday obligation.
