Video overview: One of the most challenging stories in the Gospels is the good Samaritan. It begins with the “Law” of the Jewish people. At the time, the law consisted of many specific commands. The thought of following and remembering 613 different laws is intimidating by anyone’s standards. But this was what the Jewish people in the time of Jesus were called to do, according to the Old Testament. In Jesus’ time, most good rabbis had what they would call their “yoke.” By this, they meant a summary statement of the entire Old Testament law—all 613 of them! One rabbi was famously challenged to recite the law while standing on one foot. He said “Do to others what you would have done to you. This is the whole law, everything else is just commentary.” Jesus is doing something similar in the Gospel reading for this Sunday. He asks a would-be follower to tell him what is in the law. The man responds, “You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself.” Elsewhere, Jesus summarizes the law this way as well. In the parable that follows, Jesus seeks to explain what this law means. After a man asks him; “Who is my neighbor?” Jesus proceeds to tell one of his most famous parables—the story of the good Samaritan. It offers a difficult lesson, one in which our “neighbor” might turn out to be the person we most dislike. Through this story, Jesus redefines holiness—the goal of all those Old Testament laws—as mercy.

Featured study: The gospel according to Luke

Reflection: Tons of ink has been spilled over the interpretation of this famous parable and little more can be added here. But the critical issue—in keeping with the theme of the first reading, “Heed the voice of the LORD”—seems to be contained in Jesus’ final words, “Go and do likewise.” This sophisticated scholar of the law who seeks to “test” Jesus and to “justify himself,” has his own convictions tested and is finally moved to see that mercy is the issue and not justice. Even the lawyer’s question itself, “Who is my neighbor?” is turned around by Jesus, who asks instead, “Which of these three...was neighbor to the robbers’ victim?” That is, the issue is not so much, “Who do I have to treat as my neighbor?”—to which the usual response would have been, “the sons of your own people” (Leviticus 19:18, RSV). The real question is “Have I been neighbor to everyone, treating each as one of my own?” The scholar of the law must himself admit that the hated Samaritan, “the one who treated him with mercy,” is the one who acts as neighbor, to the man, a Jew, who was not one of his “own people.” The word for “mercy” in the Greek is *eleos*, the same word we use in a different form when we say at the start of Mass, Kyrie *eleison*, “Lord, have mercy.” As the Our Father teaches us, we must give mercy to get it, and so we, like the lawyer, must “go and do likewise.”

Year Two (2023-2024): Year of Parish Revival

During the Parish Year, pastors will invite their parishioners and staff to become even more truly and deeply eucharistic communities through small groups, increased exploration of the sacrifice of the Mass, eucharistic adoration, catechetical studies on the Real Presence of Christ, parish-sponsored processions, and other activities to enable deeper encounters with Our Lord in the Eucharist.

Year Three (2024-2025): Year of the National Eucharistic Congress and Missionary Sending

During the third year, the Church will gather for the first National Eucharistic Congress in almost fifty years, where approximately 80,000 Catholics are anticipated to draw close to Jesus in the Eucharist by way of a pilgrimage to Indianapolis from July 17-21, 2024. The intended fruit of the Congress is to prepare the faithful from around the country to go out to the peripheries of their communities as “eucharistic missionaries” filled with the flame of divine charity for those around them. Following the vote of the U.S. bishops at the November 2021 general assembly, a new corporation has been formed to plan and implement this milestone event.

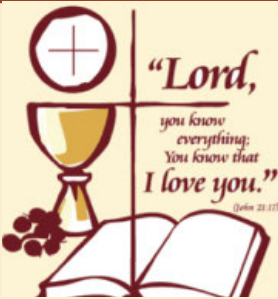

Hello Youth & Young Adults of SJV!

In today's readings, Jesus teaches us that loving our neighbor is not a matter of mere vicinity to other humans; rather, our neighbor is anyone whom we have the opportunity to love as Jesus would love. It is the beggar on the corner asking for food; the prisoner seeking redemption; the atheist asking questions; the young single mother seeking assistance with an unexpected pregnancy; the baby in her womb, helpless and innocent.

We, as Catholics, are called to protect and provide for those who are in most need, from conception to natural death. Every single life is worth protecting, guarding, and loving. To protect life from the moment of conception is not a political matter – it is a matter of morality. It involves the virtues of justice and charity; justice, in that we are giving them their due respect and protection because they are beings made in the image of God, and charity in that love is only love when lived out in sacrifice to one another. Thus, abortion, by its very definition as ending the life of an unborn human, violates the natural and divine law by taking innocent life, and is against the virtues of charity and justice.

Abortion is, at its very heart, anti-Christ. For, what does Christ say?

“This is my body, which is given up for you.”

And what is at the heart of the “my body, my choice” slogan in favor of abortion?

“This is my body, which is not given up for you.”

WINNING 2025 JUBILEE YEAR LOGO UNVEILED AFTER GLOBAL COMPETITION

The Vatican evangelization chief unveiled on Tuesday the winning logo of the 2025 Jubilee Year, chosen after a worldwide competition.

Archbishop Rino Fisichella, pro-prefect of the Dicastery for Evangelization, presented the logo and the preparations for the Catholic Church's next holy year at a June 28 press conference.

A jubilee is a Holy Year of grace and pilgrimage in the Catholic Church, which typically takes place every 25 years. The motto of the 2025 Jubilee is "Pilgrims of Hope" — "Peregrinantes in Spem" in Latin.

A panel narrowed the selection to three projects, which were presented to Pope Francis, who chose the logo designed by Italian Giacomo Travisani.

A Vatican press release described the logo as "four stylized figures to indicate all of humanity from the four corners of the earth."

"They are each embracing another, indicating the solidarity and brotherhood that must unite peoples," it continued. "It should be noted that the first figure is clinging to the cross. The underlying waves are choppy to indicate that the pilgrimage of life is not always on calm waters."

"Oftentimes personal circumstances and world events call for a greater sense of hope. This is why the lower part of the cross is elongated, turning into an anchor, which dominates the movement of the waves. As is well known, the anchor has often been used as a metaphor for hope," it said.

The Catholic Church's last Great Jubilee was held in 2000 with the motto "Christ Yesterday, Today, Forever."

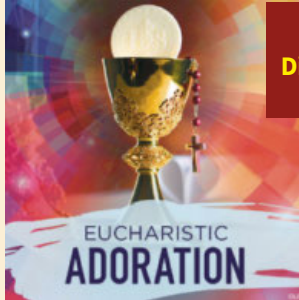
