

Video overview: Today's Gospel reading may surprise us. Jesus' words don't seem to fit the peaceful "forgive your enemies," "turn the other cheek" image of Jesus that we're used to. In fact, he says quite explicitly that he didn't come to establish peace, but rather, division. What does Jesus mean? Why does he sound so harsh?

To understand Jesus' words, we must understand the difference between intentions and reality. Jesus does not say that he desires division; he simply says that it will happen. Maybe you've experienced this. Maybe you've felt alone in your desire to go deeper into your faith. Maybe family members or friends have thought you were strange for becoming Catholic or seeking to live out your Catholic faith more fully. Christians who live out Jesus' teachings will begin to stand out in the world. They will be noticeably different. And that sometimes causes division. They will be misunderstood, looked down upon, or openly criticized by those who do not share the same Christian values.

Put simply, it's not easy to be a Christian. However, as Christians, we are to take heart in our struggles for they are the path Jesus has set for us. Jesus doesn't promise us any earthly reward. Instead, he promises the cross. He tells us that if we are going to be his disciples, we will have to pick up our cross and follow him. The Christian life is centered on this reality. It acknowledges that we are going to have struggles, pain, and sorrow in our lives. The question is, what are we going to do when we encounter such difficulties. Ultimately the message of the Gospel gives the answer: if we have the courage to turn over our struggles to God, then, like Jesus on Easter Sunday, we, too, can be raised from the dead, and in doing so, those things that are so painful for us in this lifetime will be glorified.

Featured study: Love Unveiled: The Catholic faith

Reflection: For many of us the missing critical dimension of our faith is that sort of zeal that our Lord showed on our behalf. The greatest obstacle we face in this regard is that ours is a culture that stresses personal comfort and fulfillment above all. As C.S. Lewis put it, "For wise men of old, the cardinal problem of human life was how to conform the soul to objective reality, and the solution was wisdom, self-discipline, and virtue. For the modern, the cardinal problem is how to conform reality to the wishes of man." That quality of culture teaches us to be dissatisfied with discomfort, with struggle, with sacrifice, and it saps our spiritual energies.

Jesus in this Gospel passage is shown hungering for the sacrifice that will win the salvation of the human race, even despising the shame of the cross, as our second reading from Hebrews says. He is a warrior for the good of souls. That is a particularly apt image with reference to this passage from Luke where he asks, "Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." He, of course, doesn't will the opposition he will face from evil men and spirits, nor is he shy in facing it, even unto death, for those who need his help. St. Thomas Aquinas notes that zeal is proportionate to the intensity of love, and the love of true friendship creates a zeal that energetically repels anything that might harm one's friend. From Jesus, who has made us his friends and loved and defended us from death, we can learn to love him zealously in return.





Baptisms:

English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held online.

Bautizos:

Bautizos en Español son cada 3er Sábado del mes a las 9:30 am. Clases pre-bautismales son el Domingo anterior al bautizo de las 9am-1pm.

Marriage:

As a minimum requirement, couples must contact the parish office and set an appointment at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Marriage preparation classes online.

Matrimonio:

Se requiere que las parejas contacten a la oficina parroquial cuando menos seis meses antes de la fecha de matrimonio. Clases prematrimoniales son en persona.

First Eucharist:

A two year family formation program preparation is required. Children must be a minimum of 6 years old. Classes run from September-May and registrations are open June-August.

MAY JESUS BECOME YOUR GREAT FRIEND,' POPE TELLS YOUNG PEOPLE

May Jesus become "your great friend," "your companion along the way," and "life," Pope Francis has told young people.

The Holy Father's remarks came in his audience with the young people of the 'Alpha Camp' he received on Friday.

Alpha Camp is a Church-sponsored week-long camp for young people in Central Italy, dedicated to exploring life, faith and meaning.

The Pope recognized that those before him must have countless questions, and urged them to bring them forth, as "God loves questions."

Christ never abandons you and will restore you

The Holy Father reminded the youth before him of his Apostolic Exhortation to the world's young people *Christus vivit* where he encourages them to treasure their relationship with Christ.

"I started with these words: 'Christ is alive! He is our hope. In a wonderful way, He brings youth to our world and everything He touches becomes young, new and full of life... Christ is alive and He wants you to be alive!"

Jesus is your friend

In the Pope's address, he stressed to those gathered that Jesus, is not a 'moral precept' but a person and friend, who is close to them.

He encouraged them to turn to Him as such, and added that they should always be led by Him.

When faced with the evil that is within us and around us, the Pope insisted that we are not to evade reality nor close in on ourselves, but to shoulder, each one of us, our own share of responsibility.

Jesus, he recalled, tells us to bear "our own cross" with love and with joy.

Jesus loves us more than we do ourselves

Knowing Jesus helps us to bear our daily crosses, the Pope said, gives us true peace and security.

The Holy Father recalled that when he was a young person too, at age 17, his relationship with Christ became so strong that he discovered his own vocation to be a priest. Pope Francis suggested that it is never too early to be led and have a strong, fruitful relationship with Jesus.

"A group from the Holy Land (Bethlehem & Jerusalem) will be selling religious articles after Masses to support the Catholic Christian minorities in Bethlehem. 
