Video overview: Today's Gospel reading about being Jesus' disciple is both beautiful and challenging. In it we hear that no one is worthy to be called Jesus' disciple unless he hates his mother/father/sister/brother/spouse for Jesus' sake, takes up his own cross to follow Jesus, and renounces his possessions. To modern readers, this probably doesn't sound like very good marketing on Jesus' part; all three of these requirements for following Jesus are quite challenging. We have to remember, however, that Jesus is speaking in a Jewish context. In Hebrew tradition, to hate one thing and love another simply meant to give preference to one over the other. Jesus is saying that to be his disciple one must put Jesus—that is, God—above even one's own family. If God is not in first place, then nothing is in its right place. In this Gospel reading we hear that great crowds are following Jesus. He has become very popular—everyone wants to be near him. But then Jesus turns to the crowds with the challenge to love him above all other loves. It can be easy for us to get very excited and enthusiastic about the Christian faith, but it's much harder to imitate Christ in the face of our day-to-day struggles. As you delve into this week's Scripture readings with the participants, the key question is: Are you walking in the footsteps of Christ?

Featured study: Who am I to judge?


Reflection: In this Gospel passage our Lord explains how we overcome the problem of that effect of original sin that our first reading describes, the loss of integrity in our powers. Jesus uses here what scholars call a Semiticism in this text, in this case a hyperbolic statement or a wild extreme to make a clear point. In saying that we should "hate" our family members and even our own lives, he does not mean that we should really hate them. That would overturn the fourth commandment to honor father and mother, which Jesus himself upholds in Mark 7:10-13 and his own command that we should love our neighbor as ourselves. He means rather that we must put everything in its proper place to reorder our lives and our loves. Since our emotions, which are bodily in origin, tend to try to override our higher faculties as an effect of the fall, we tend to love lesser things above those higher things that should mean the most. We tend to prefer our own bodily comforts, even when it may hurt others. And even our laudable love for family members can get in the way of the highest goods of the human race at times. Think of the man who refuses to go to war because of his love for his family, when it is precisely to protect them that he ought to go. All lesser loves can get in the way of that love which is most important, our love for God. And, in fact, all lesser loves will be made stronger if we get that highest love right.

Baptisms:

English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held online.

Bautizos:

Bautizos en Español son cada 3er Sábado del mes a las 9:30 am. Clases pre-bautismales son el Domingo anterior al bautizo de las 9am-1pm.

Marriage:

As a minimum requirement, couples must contact the parish office and set an appointment at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Marriage preparation classes online.

Matrimonio:

Se requiere que las parejas contacten a la oficina parroquial cuando menos seis meses antes de la fecha de matrimonio. Clases prematrimoniales son en persona.

First Eucharist:

A two year family formation program preparation is required. Children must be a minimum of 6 years old. Classes run from September-May and registrations are open June-August.

Primer Comunion:

Programa de dos años en el programa de formación familiar es requerido. Los niños deben tener 6 años cumplidos o más. Inscripciones son Junio-Agosto y las clases son Septiembre-Mayo.

Youth Confirmation:

Candidates for Confirmation must be at least 12 years old and in 7th grade to start the program. A two-year religious education preparation is required prior to receiving the Sacrament.

OUR DESTINATION IS HEAVEN: POPE FRANCIS SPEAKS ABOUT DEATH

Pope Francis spoke about old age and the expectation of death at his general audience Wednesday.

Reflecting on the Virgin Mary's bodily Assumption into heaven, he recalled the hope Christians have in the resurrection of their own body at the end of time. "We recently celebrated the Assumption into heaven of the Mother of Jesus. This mystery illuminates the fulfillment of the grace that shaped Mary's destiny, and it also illuminates our destination," he said at the Vatican on Aug. 24. "Our destination is heaven."

The audience began with a reading from Saint Paul's Letter to the Romans 8:22-24 "It is no coincidence," Francis said, "that the Apostle Paul speaks of the pains of childbirth."

"Just as, in the moment we come out of our mother's womb, we are still us, the same human being who was in the womb; so, after death, we are born to heaven, to God's space, and we are still ourselves, who have walked on this earth," he said. Pope Francis also recalled Jesus' promise to his disciples before he left the earth: "And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also (John 14:3)."

Francis explained that when Jesus speaks about the Kingdom of God, he describes it as a wedding feast, as a party with friends; and the pope urged everyone to take Jesus' words about the Kingdom seriously, keeping in mind the eternal "destination" of their earthly lives.

"In our old age, my dear contemporaries — I'm speaking to the old men and women — the importance of the many 'details' of which life is made — a caress, a smile, a gesture, an appreciated effort, an unexpected surprise, a hospitable cheerfulness, a faithful bond — becomes more acute," he said.

"The essentials of life, which we hold most dear as we approach our farewell, become definitively clear to us."

"The best of life is yet to come," he said, addressing the elderly.

"Our whole life appears like a seed that will have to be buried so that its flower and its fruit can be born. It will be born, along with everything else in the world," he continued. "Not without labor pains, not without pain, but it will be born." Read more on: www.catholicnewsagency.com/news
