

Review: We tend to believe good times will last forever. (Just look at what happened before the Great Recession of 2008.) While it's nice to be optimistic in that respect, we tend to worry that the bad times will last forever as well. The truth is that life is a series of contrasts-mountaintop experiences followed by deep valleys. This week's Gospel, about the Transfiguration, clearly shows us that we all live amid contrasts. The disciples are so excited by what they have witnessed that they want to build tents to commemorate the event, and then, almost immediately, they are nearly paralyzed by fear. The same is true for us, especially when it comes to our faith. At times we have bright moments when all seems so clear and obvious, and then we begin to experience doubts and uncertainty. Sometimes it even seems as if God himself has withdrawn from us. We must not be surprised by these contrasting experiences, but instead we should use this week's reading as preparation for what we will do when the contrasts occur. For us, as for Abraham in the first reading, the disciples, and all who have gone before us in faith, it is only when we listen attentively to God's beloved Son that we will have the courage and grace to deal with all that life is sure to hand us.

Featured study: The Last Things. Never give up on GOD, remember to believe no matter what.

Reflection: This Gospel reading represents a confluence of themes from the Old Testament. Mt. Tabor has been spoken of as a second Mt. Sinai-where the Ten Commandments and the ceremonial law of the Old Covenant were received. This fits nicely into Matthew's theme of Jesus as the new Moses. Several elements in this narrative also suggest a connection with the Jewish Feast of Booths (Sukkot). It's significant that Jesus' coming to Mt. Tabor also results in a manifestation of God's glory and the presence of a cloud, both of which are associated with the Feast of Booths. Jesus is thereby simultaneously portrayed as the new Law, the new manifestation of God, and the new Temple; all of which were elements of importance in the Jewish celebration of the Feast of Booths. It's sometimes overlooked that Moses and Elijah were the only two figures in the Old Testament who spoke directly with God, both on Mt. Horeb (another name for Mt. Sinai). If Tabor is intended to represent a new Sinai, then we ought to consider the possibility that Matthew is showing us that Jesus is more than simply a new Moses or Elijah; he's also the God who spoke to Moses and Elijah on Mt. Horeb-as he's now shown doing on Mt. Tabor.

HOLY WEEK REKINDLES ANCIENT CHURCH TRADITIONS PART 2

In Holy Week, the days just before Easter, one can catch Catholics in

some ancient religious practices – some are so rare, they're done only once a year. Over the next few weeks, we will look at a few of these practices in more detail.

VEILED IMAGES

Beginning Palm Sunday, some churches cover or veil – with purple



cloth – the religious artwork in the church – except stained glass windows and the Stations of the Cross. In some places, the images are removed altogether.

The custom of veiling crosses and images helps us to concentrate on the great essentials of Christ's work of Redemption.

Still, the somber custom is believed to come from a 9th century German practice of extending a large cloth called the

"Hungertuch" (hunger cloth) before the altar from the beginning of Lent. The cloth – which hid the altar – was not removed until during the reading of the Passion on the Wednesday in Holy Week - at the words, "the veil of the temple was rent in two." Crucifixes are unveiled after the Good Friday ceremonies and all other images just before the Easter vigil Mass on Holy Saturday.

'Pope Francis: Ashes remind us of the truth about

The rite of the imposition of ashes on the foreheads of the faithful - which takes place during the liturgy at the beginning of Lent marks the beginning of our "return journey" to God, Pope Francis said during his homily for the Mass of Ash Wednesday.

The Holy Father explained that the imposition of ashes is an exhortation both to return to the truth about ourselves, and to return to God and to our brothers and sisters.

The ashes, he said, remind us of who we are, recalling the "essential truth of our lives: that the Lord alone is God and we are the work of His hands." Lent, then, becomes a time to remember that we rely on God, and at the same time "to drop the pretense of being self-sufficient."

The Pope then turned to a second step in the journey back to God: returning to God and to our brothers and sisters. By dropping every presumption of self-sufficiency, and all forms of idolatry of self, we can begin to learn that "life is a relationship we receive from God and our parents," and that we can always revive and renew our relationships "thanks to the Lord and those he puts at our side. Lent, then, is a season of grace when we can rebuild our relationship with God and with others, opening our hearts in the silence of prayer and emerging from the fortress of our selfsufficiency."

Finally, in order to make this journey, Pope Francis reminds the faithful of the three great paths of almsgiving, prayer, and fasting, that are traditionally encouraged during Lent.
