

Word of Life

20th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Receive Communion in Order to Live in Him

"... 'Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you... Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." (John 6: 53; 56)

Christ offers Himself to us as the true food that replenishes our strength and invites us to "consume Him" and encourages us to make use of the first hat He offers us: His own and blood, His own life, Himself. That's to say, Jesus gives us the gift of

the Eucharist and asks us to receive Him in Holy Communion.

Not doing so, when we are prepared, is something that goes against our own interests. After this gift from the Lord, what remains obvious is His love. Christ loves us, and because He loves us, He wants to help and sustain us in our struggles, console us in our tribulations and accompany us in moments of pain and joy. Christ loves us and the Eucharist is one of the greatest proofs of His infinite love. Knowing this, we must ask ourselves, "Do we love Him? Do we reciprocate His love with all our might? De we tell Him that He can depend on us the same as He tells us that we can depend on Him?"

The answer to love is love. So, let's learn to love Christ with our whole heart, with every fiber of our being because that is how He loves us. Let's live in Him by working and helping our neighbor, praying, receiving the Eucharist, and being in God's grace through Confession. Let's live in Him so He may enjoy living in us. Let's live with Him, with His strength, so that we can respond with the love He has the right to expect from us. Moved by gratitude, let's live for Him who has done so much for us. In that way, we will fulfill what we say at Mass, "Through Him, with Him, and in Him, O God, Almighty Father... all glory and honor is yours, forever and ever..."

Resolution: Receive Holy Communion as much as possible, but do so well prepared. And so, confess if you have serious sins or if you have not confessed for a long time.

Palabras Del Pastor

My dear parishioners,

Last week we saw the first of the four main principles of the Church's social teaching: the dignity of the human life. This time we will see the second which is: The Common Good. "The Common Good is "the sum total of social conditions which allow people, either as groups or as individuals, to reach their fulfillment more fully and more easily." Human dignity is respected and the common good is fostered only if human rights are protected and basic responsibilities are met. Every human being has a right to life, a right to religious freedom, and a right to have access to those things required for human decency.'

"...In short, we should seek "to build that kind of society

where it is easier for people to be good."

"... We must "place at the center of all political, social and economic activity the human person, who enjoys the highest dignity, and respect for the common good."" Pope Francis, Fratelli Tutti (On Fraternity and Social Friendship), nos. 18 and

"Marriage and the family are the central institutions of social life – the primary school of virtue, where we first experience common rather than merely individual goods – and so these institutions should be supported and strengthened."

"... We must hear "both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor" and respond to climate change with actions to better protect creation....

"We recognize and protect the right to religious liberty, our first and most cherished freedom. The protection of conscience and religious liberty is an indispensable element of the common good – a fundamental human right that knows no geographical boundaries."

"Laws and policies must prioritize those who struggle to make ends meet and must preserve the social safety net and pro mote decent jobs, affordable housing, and childcare."

El Bien común es "el conjunto de aquellas condiciones de la vida social que permiten a los grupos y a cada uno de sus miembros conseguir más plena y fácilmente su propia perfección". La dignidad humana es respetada y el bien común promovido sólo si se protegen los derechos humanos y se cumplen las responsabilidades básicas. Cada ser humano tiene el derecho a la vida, el derecho a la libertad religiosa, y el derecho a tener acceso a aquellas cosas que requiere la decencia humana."



English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held once a month on Sunday from 11:30am-2:30pm.

Bautizos:

YOU MAY HAVE A SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM OR OTHER CLAIM AGAINST THE DIOCESE OF SACRAMENTO

On April 1, 2024, The Roman Catholic Bishop of Sacramento aka Diocese of Sacramento filed a chapter 11 bankruptcy petition for protection under title 11 of the United States Code.

If you were sexually abused by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim so as to be received by October 1, 2024, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Diocese. Claims based on acts or omissions of the Diocese that occurred before April 1, 2024, must be filed on or before October 1, 2024, even if such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or certain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before April 1, 2024.
