Word of Life

22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time: Heart by Heart

"He responded, 'Well did Isaiah prophesy about you hypocrites, as it is written: 'This people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines human precepts.'" (Mark 7: 6-7)

Continuing with last week's theme, this Sunday's Gospel by a different evangelist shows us Jesus' disappointment at the response of His people, His beloved people, His chosen people that He had come to save. "This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far from me,' the Master even said, echoing an ancient prophecy.

What about us? Could we also say that? Certainly, we honor Him with our lips, which is not bad in and of itself, and it is becoming increasingly necessary to do so in order to give public witness to our faith. But it should also be true that, while doing so, we try to do it with our hearts. That is what this week is about: deepening our cordial, emotional and loving relationship with Christ, it will be about telling Him, by our prayers and good works, that we love Him, that He is Number One in our lives and that, for Him and with Him, we are willing to do whatever He asks of us. It is a week to exercise "For You, Jesus" in everything we do so that the Lord is convinced that, although we are sinners and sometimes fail, He can count on our hearts. Modifying Quevedo's poetry a bit, we should say to the Lord, both with works and words, "Dust I am, more dust in love" or "I am a sinner, but I love you. I love You, Lord, because You deserve it, because with Your mercy You have conquered my heart. And my chief sorrow is not loving You more, not loving You enough, not always being faithful to You so that You can be proud of me for my entire life.

Resolution: As often as possible when you are doing something, tell the Lord, "For You, Jesus." Consciously, show your love for Him by taking on difficult and thankless tasks.

I want to wrap up the catechesis on forming the conscience for living the Gospel in the public sphere by quoting the Bishops' address to all "voters and candidates, citizens and elect-

"... In light of ethical principles, we bishops offer the following policy goals that we hope will guide Catholics as they form their consciences and reflect on the moral dimensions of their public choices. Not all issues are equal; these ten goals address matters of different moral weight and urgency.... We hope Catholics will ask candidates how they intend to help our nation pursue these important goals:"

"Address the preeminent requirement to protect the weakest in our midst—innocent unborn children—by restricting and bringing to an end the destruction of unborn children through abortion and providing women in crisis pregnancies the supports they need to

make a decision for life.

"Keep our nation from turning to violence to address fundamental problems—a million abortions each year to deal with unwanted pregnancies, euthanasia and assisted suicide to deal with the burdens of illness and disability, the destruction of human embryos in the name of research, the use of the death penalty to combat crime, and imprudent resort to war to address international dis-

putes."
"Protect the fundamental understanding of marriage as the lifelong and faithful union of one man and one woman and as the central institution of society; promote the complementarity of the sexes and reject false "gender" ideologies..."
"Achieve comprehensive immigration reform that offers a path to

citizenship, treats immigrant workers fairly, prevents the separation of families, maintains the integrity of our borders, respects the rule of law, and addresses the factors that compel people to leave

"Help families and children overcome poverty: ensuring access to and choice in education, as well as decent work at fair, living wages and adequate assistance for the vulnerable in our nation..." "Provide health care while respecting human life, human dignity, and religious freedom in our health care system.

"Continue to oppose policies that reflect prejudice, hostility toward immigrants, religious bigotry, and other forms of unjust dis-

"Encourage families, community groups, economic structures, and government to work together to overcome poverty, pursue the

common good, and care for creation…" "Establish and comply with moral limits on the use of military force... with a special view to seeking a responsible and effective response for ending the persecution of Christians and other religious minorities in the Middle East and other parts of the world."

"Join with others around the world to pursue peace..."

YOU MAY HAVE A SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM OR OTHER CLAIM AGAINST THE DIOCESE OF SACRAMENTO

On April 1, 2024, The Roman Catholic Bishop of Sacramento aka Diocese of Sacramento filed a chapter 11 bankruptcy petition for protection under title 11 of the United States Code.

If you were sexually abused by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim so as to be received by October 1, 2024, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Diocese. Claims based on acts or omissions of the Diocese that occurred before April 1, 2024, must be filed on or before October 1, 2024, even if such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or certain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before April 1, 2024.
