<u>Video Overview</u>: The two disciples on the road to Emmaus in today's reading came to know the Lord in the **breaking of the bread**; the Eucharist. Their encounter with Jesus parallels the way Jesus comes to meet us in every Mass. First, just as Jesus spoke to the two disciples on the road about the Scriptures, so Jesus speaks to us through the Scriptures in the Liturgy of the Word. Then, just as Jesus explained the Scriptures to the disciples on the road, so do we have those words interpreted for us by the priest. We can then begin to understand what they mean for our lives. The first half of the Mass, like the first half of the journey to Emmaus, focuses on the Word of God. Then, as we experience the breaking of the bread, Jesus gives us his very self, his Body and Blood. At that moment, our eyes can be opened, and we are able to see Jesus in our midst. When we receive the Lord with an open and receptive heart, we know that he is alive...and with us. We begin to have a glimpse into the awesome plan of God for our own lives. The second half of the Mass, like the second half of the Emmaus story, centers on meeting and recognizing Jesus. Finally, like the disciples who run back to Jerusalem to share the Good News, we too, at the end of every Mass, are commissioned to be ambassadors of Christ who has revealed himself in the Word and in the Eucharist.

Featured Study: The Mass: Emmaus and the Mystery of the Eucharist

Topics of Interest: We see Jesus seeking two disciples who are leaving Jerusalem in despair over Jesus's death and apparent failure. Jesus's meticulous care in gathering up and confirming his disciples in faith after his Resurrection ought to give us great confidence in his love for all, even those who have walked away from him. The lesson for us is that without the gift of faith, even the obvious can seem obscure. This story in Luke also gives us some direction as to where to find the grace necessary to overcome our ignorance. We're told that in the breaking of bread, they recognized him. That term is widely considered to have been a kind of code term in the early Church for the celebration of the Eucharist.


"This is the right time, the opportune moment. An act of contrition done well, and our souls will become white like the snow"

"Do what the Catechism (of the Catholic Church) says. It is very clear: If you cannot find a priest to confess to, speak directly with God, your father, and tell him the truth. Say, 'Lord, I did this, this, this. Forgive me.' and ask for pardon with all your heart."

Make an act of contrition, the Pope said, and promise God, "I will go to confession afterward, but forgive me now.' And immediately you will return to a state of grace with God."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, N.1452, says: "When it arises from a love by which God is loved above all else, contrition is called 'perfect' - contrition of charity. Such contrition remits venial sins; it also obtains forgiveness of mortal sins if it includes the firm resolution to have recourse to sacramental confession as soon as possible."


