

<u>Video Overview</u>: Today's Gospel account reveals the two sides of Christ's love. He mercifully loves us wherever he finds us, even in our sin, but he loves us too much to leave us there and thus calls us to a higher standard. Jesus shows them the wounds in his hands and side. These wounds are the effects of sin. The disciples realized their own sinfulness when they saw the risen Lord. He also tells them, "Peace be with you." In the ancient Jewish world

"peace" described right relationship with God reflected in your actions to men. Jesus speaks words of comfort and forgiveness. These are the two sides of Christ's love: He comes to show us the truth of our sin and its consequences, but he also comes with mercy and forgiveness. He comes to offer "peace." The place where we experience these two aspects of Christ's love most profoundly is in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We might be reminded of this sacrament when Jesus tells the apostles that as the Father has sent him, so he now sends them. Jesus was sent by the Father for the forgiveness of sins, and now he is sending his apostles, enabled by the Holy Spirit, to participate in this ministry of forgiveness.

<u>Featured Study</u>: Pardon and Peace; Fr. Francis Randolph presents a very positive and practical understanding of the immense value of the Sacrament of Confession for the modern Catholic. Father Randolph helps the reader to see how the Sacrament of Confession meets the deepest needs of the penitent on the spiritual, emotional, and psychological levels.

Topics of Interest: As a Church we're present on Easter morning to witness the manifestation of the risen glory of Jesus Christ. We share the joy and recognition of St. Mary Magdalene and that of the apostles to whom she acts as an apostle of the Resurrection. But, just as we're represented collectively as a Church in the characters of the Magdalene and the apostles, we're also absent and remain doubting on that first Easter day in the person of Thomas. The Second Sunday of Easter could be called Thomas' Easter. He represents that part of us that holds out against faith, relentlessly asking for proof, for confirmation. Thomas is a particularly good model for our age. He demands an empirical, tangible demonstration that Jesus is risen in the flesh. In John's Gospel, seeing is believing. John seems to emphasize the evidence that sight supplies to the identity of the Lord Jesus. Sight and blindness are metaphors for enlightenment and sin. So there's tension between the evidence that Jesus gives us and our human insistence that he continuously reinforce our faith with signs.







Dear Friends in Christ,

This week, I will publish on our diocesan website (www.scd.org), the list of priests and deacons who have been credibly accused of sexual abuse of minors and young people in the Diocese of Sacramento. The list will account for our history of sexual abuse over the last seven decades and is a necessary reckoning for our local Church.

I am repulsed and heartbroken by the evil acts that were perpetrated upon the innocent by those entrusted with their care. When you read the list you will experience your own feelings of shock, anger and disgust. This undoubtedly will reopen wounds for some.

The pain and suffering of the victims from the betrayal and loss of innocence has continued for decades and will never go away. So too should our prayers never cease for God's mercy and healing upon these victims.

I apologize for the sins and failures of the past. I am determined that such acts of abuse should never again occur in our diocese. I pledge to you that I and my brother priests are zealous in our efforts to ensure that our parishes and other Church ministries are safe environments for our children and young people. Our work follows the implementation of the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People in 2002 which greatly reduced the frequency of these sins. However, even one such event is one too many. We are determined to remain vigilant.

In these days of reckoning for our local Church, I ask you to join me in praying for the victims of sexual abuse and the purification of God's Holy Church.

Se me parte el corazón por los actos viciosos que fueron cometidos a inocentes por los encargados del cuidado de ellos. Cuando lean la lista, experimentarán sentimientos de conmoción, coraje y disgusto. Esto, sin duda, volverá a abrir heridas para algunos.

El dolor y el sufrimiento de las víctimas por la traición y la pérdida de la inocencia han continuado durante décadas y nunca desaparecerán. Así también, nuestras oraciones nunca deben de parar por la misericordia y la sanación de Dios sobre estas víctimas.

Les pido perdón por los pecados y fallas del pasado. Estoy decidido a que tales actos de abuso nunca vuelvan a ocurrir en nuestra diócesis. Les prometo que yo y mis hermanos sacerdotes estamos comprometidos a nuestros esfuerzos por asegurar que nuestras parroquias y otros ministerios de la Iglesia sean lugares seguros para nuestros niños y jóvenes. Nuestro trabajo continúa en la implementación de la Acta para la Protección de Niños y Jóvenes del 2002, que disminuyo en gran medida la frecuencia de estos pecados. Sin embargo, uno más de esos eventos es demasiado. Estamos decididos a permanecer vigilantes.

En estos días de gran prueba para nuestra Iglesia local, les pido que se unan a mí para orar por las víctimas de abuso sexual y por la purificación de la Santa Iglesia de Dios.
