Video Overview: Animal herds journey toward a destination moving as one body in their willingness to struggle and suffer side by side to keep them protected through their unity. Imagine if Christians united like this to suffer for each other for the glory of Christ. Jesus redeemed all humanity in himself and even commanded his disciples to *“Be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you”* (John 17:21). And yet theological, cultural, and liturgical disputes have split the Body of Christ from its intended unity. So, to achieve a united front we must turn to the Good Shepherd for guidance and be willing to suffer for our fellow Christians in Christ’s love. This unity will allow us to endure whatever sufferings may come our way, in the hopes that all Christians will be reunited one day with our great King and Eternal Shepherd.

Featured Study: View ECHO Part I: *The Creed* Series; episode 10: The Church. The Church was founded by Christ to be the visible Kingdom of God on earth, and to bring about the unity of all humanity in Christ and through the Holy Spirit.

Topics of Interest: As consoling as the image of the Good Shepherd is to us, those who heard Jesus’ words, picked up rocks to stone him when they questioned his status as Messiah. Jesus protests that he has made his claim clearly, then extends the image of himself as shepherd to identify himself with the Father from Ezekiel 34:11, which they would have all known and would have been attuned to the association he was making between himself and God. And Jesus responds, *“But you do not believe because you are not amongst my sheep”* (John 10:26). In keeping with the division of the sheep that was prophesied in Ezekiel 34, we’re told twice in John’s Gospel that “there was a division” among the Jews over Jesus (John 9:16; 10:19, RSV). Jesus explains clearly that the determining factor that decides whether or not anyone belongs to the Father is whether or not one “hears” in the words of Jesus the voice of the Shepherd prophesied in Ezekiel 34. By following Jesus’ voice we receive eternal life and remain safely in the hands of the Father.

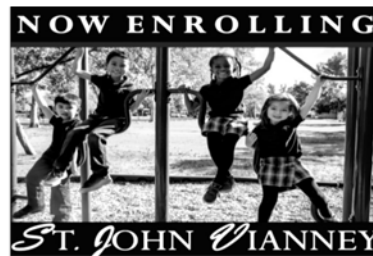

How Hard Is It to Get into Seminary?

Given recent scandals and headlines, one might reasonably ask, "Who are they letting into seminary these days?!" It's a good question—which thankfully has a good answer.

It is no exaggeration to say that today it is harder to become a Catholic priest than a Secret Service agent.

Gone are the days when a pastor could simply write a note to the seminary rector and say, "Jimmy is a good lad from a good family; he'll make a fine priest one day." Unfortunately, laxity in the past, coupled with suspect formation in some seminaries, led to the ordination of many men who never should have become priests.

Highly aware of this, today's Vocation Directors are extremely selective when accepting seminarians. In fact, the majority of training for new Vocation Directors is devoted to screening candidates using extensive interviews, psychological testing, a battery of background checks, and much more. The process is exhaustive—and quite often exhausting for the young man himself.

One might think that the growing clergy shortage would tempt dioceses to accept sub-par candidates, but actually the opposite is true. "Quality not quantity" is a frequent mantra at the annual convention of Diocesan Vocation Directors (NCDVD). In a very real way, today's Church is "looking for a few good men."

On World Day of Prayer for Vocations, please pray both for our Vocation Directors and for the young men they are mentoring on their journey to the priesthood.



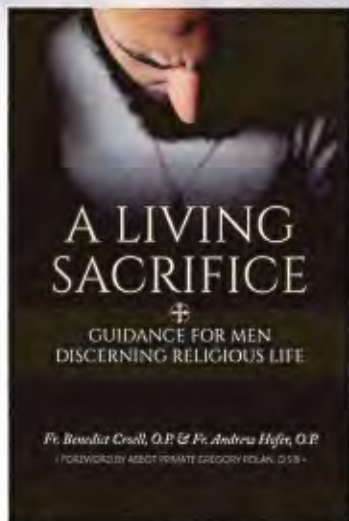
The Blessing of a Well-Trained Priest

Above: A brand-new priest prays a special blessing on the day of his ordination. To reach this point, most men have been in formation in seminary for six to eight years. They have taken dozens of graduate-level classes, completed pastoral training, prayed for literally thousands of hours, and have been closely evaluated the whole way. Seminary training has improved so dramatically in the last twenty-five years that many observers say it is the best it has ever been in this country.



MEN IN VOWS

It's no easy task for a guy to figure out whether God may be calling him to make vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. *A Living Sacrifice* offers a road map to help men find their way. The authors have real credibility: Fr. Benedict Croell worked with hundreds of men as a vocation director, over 100 of whom entered his community, while Fr. Andrew Hofer oversaw their formation for several years. It's an invaluable read, both as an introduction to religious life and a guide for finding a religious community that's a good fit for a man's gifts and personality.
