


Video Overview: The prophets were not fortune tellers – they were messengers. They were chosen by the Lord to remind His people that He was real and had a good plan for them. The prophets were sent to call the Israelites back to their true God. The message God entrusted to them was meant to grow a deeper faith in the hearts of God’s people.

But not all of God’s people responded with greater faith. Some were too overcome by fear to surrender in trust to the Lord. We each still face this same choice today. When the Lord’s word is spoken into our life we can either respond with fear or receptivity. God is always calling us to respond with greater trust and wonder, and He gives us His own Spirit to make it possible.

The Featured: “The Story of the Nativity;” 59 minutes. Join top scholars as they explain the story behind the story of the birth of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, and the miraculous conception, the birth of John the Baptist, Mary and Joseph’s journey to Bethlehem, the Star of Bethlehem, and the birth of Jesus. This is an invaluable tool for believer and unbeliever alike to learn more about Jesus of Nazareth and about the truth of Christmas.

Topics of Interest: The contrast between the two annunciations is subtle but striking! Read about the receptivity and wonder of Mary with Gabriel versus Zechariah’s fear which gives way to doubt. Some of us may find ourselves in Zechariah’s position so you might think about the need for the nine month retreat of Zechariah, and how that may apply to us.

Dear Parishioners:

I wanted to take a moment and thank you once again for your ongoing and generous contributions to The ONE Campaign. This initiative is important for two reasons. First, it strengthens and grows many projects and ministries throughout the Diocese of Sacramento. Second, by your continued support of the campaign, our parish benefits. We continue to receive 25 percent of every dollar to help fund our needs. To date, our 25 percent share has totaled \$143,942. So far, your generosity has helped provide:

- * Ten student scholarships (\$20,000 per year)
- * New organ and hymnals
- * New chairs for the choir and confessionals
- * An audio-visual program for the church
- * A complete youth formation program called "Life Teen"
- * New LED lights for the church and parking lot

When The ONE Campaign began in 2013 our parish pledged over \$685,000. To date we have collected more than **\$575,000**. We continue to receive 25 percent of every dollar paid on your commitment for our own parish needs. Although The ONE Campaign will eventually come to an end, currently this is best way for our parish to generate additional revenue for the priorities identified by our Pastoral Council and the Finance Committee in the parish strategic plan. Meet Our New Pastor --- *IN HIS OWN WORDS* ---



My name is Father Giovanni Gamas. I was born on March 15, 1979 and raised on the island of Bohol in the Philippines to Timoteo and Norma Gamas. I have four brothers and a sister. I am the second to the eldest, my older brother is also a priest. My sister is a graduate of geodetic engineering and is also a teacher. One of my younger brothers is a lawyer, the other one is a computer engineer but is also studying law. The youngest one is a geodetic engineer. My father is a retired geodetic engineer. My mother is a retired high school teacher. My grandparents were all farmers.

I grew up in a very Catholic family and my parents were active members of our local church. My father was a past grand knight of the Knights of Columbus and my mother was a member of the Catholic Women's League. My brothers and I were all altar boys when we were growing up. We served at Mass every Sunday. My parents were very religious and our Catholic faith had a great influence on my decision to become a priest.

My education began in public elementary and intermediate schools, but continued in a Catholic High School. When I was in 4th grade, I started thinking of becoming a priest, there after I took more interest as my education continued to be focused around Catholicism. During the course of my studies I learned to speak four languages: Cebuano (my native dialect), Tagalog (our national language), English and Spanish (I studied Spanish for 10 weeks in Morelia, Michoacán, Mexico in 2004). After graduating High School, at the age of 17, I enrolled in a Seminary College in Tagbilaran City, Bohol, in the Philippines, following in the footsteps of my older brother. I graduated from Seminary College in 2001 with a Bachelor's Degree in Philosophy. Thereafter, I applied at the Diocese of Sacramento to continue my priestly studies in the United States. I came to the United States in December of 2001; upon my arrival I studied at Sacramento City College for a semester. Then, I was sent to Mount Angel Seminary in Oregon to continue my theological studies. I graduated from Mount Angel in May of 2007 with a double Master's Degree in Theology and Divinity. After a long journey (11 years) of seminary formation, at the age of 28, I was ordained a priest on June 29, 2007 by Most Reverend William Weigand at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament, in Sacramento together with six other men. They called us the "Magnificent Seven".



After my ordination, I was assigned as the parochial vicar of St. Joseph Church in Elk Grove for a few months. Then, I was moved to St. Basil Parish in Vallejo and stayed there for almost 3 years. After that, I was assigned as the parochial vicar of Holy Rosary Church in Woodland for 2 years. Then, the Bishop assigned me as the Chaplain of St. Francis High School and parochial vicar of St. Joseph a Church in North Sacramento. After that I was appointed Pastor of St. Monica Church in Willows and stayed there for almost 5 years prior to coming here to St. John Vianney Parish.


Yo soy el Padre Giovanni Gamas. Nací el 15 de marzo de 1979 y crecí en la isla de Bohol en las Filipinas, mis padres son Timoteo y Norma Gamas. Tengo cuatro hermanos y una hermana. Soy el segundo hijo y mi hermano mayor también es sacerdote. Mi hermana es graduada en ingeniería geodésica y también es maestra. Uno de mis hermanos menores es abogado, el otro es ingeniero de computadora pero también estudia derecho. El más joven es un ingeniero geodésico. Mi padre es un ingeniero geodésico jubilado. Mi madre es una maestra jubilada de secundaria y preparatoria. Mis abuelos todos eran granjeros.

Crecí en una familia muy católica y mis padres eran miembros activos de nuestra iglesia local. Mi padre fue un "Grand Knight" de los Caballeros de Colón y mi madre era miembro de la Liga de Mujeres Católicas. Mis hermanos y yo fuimos monaguillos cuando estábamos creciendo. Servimos en la misa todos los domingos. Mis padres eran muy religiosos y nuestra fe católica tuvo una gran influencia en mi decisión de ser sacerdote.

Mi educación comenzó en escuelas primarias públicas, pero continuó en una escuela secundaria católica. Cuando estaba en el cuarto grado, comencé a pensar en ser sacerdote, tomé más interés en mi educación cuando empezó a centrarse en el catolicismo. Durante el curso de mis estudios aprendí a hablar cuatro idiomas: Cebuano (mi dialecto nativo), Tagalog (nuestro idioma nacional), inglés y español (estudié español durante 10 semanas en Morelia, Michoacán, México en 2004). Después de graduarme de la preparatoria, a la edad de 17 años, me inscribí en un Colegio del Seminario en Tagbilaran City, Bohol, Filipinas, siguiendo los pasos de mi hermano mayor. Me gradué del seminario en el 2001 con una Licenciatura en Filosofía. A partir de entonces, solicité a la Diócesis de Sacramento para continuar mis estudios sacerdotales en los Estados Unidos. Vine a los Estados Unidos en diciembre de 2001; a mi llegada estudié en Sacramento City College por un semestre. Luego, fui enviado al Seminario Mount Angel en Oregon para continuar mis estudios teológicos. Me gradué de Mount Angel en mayo de 2007 con una doble Maestría en Teología y Divinidad. Después de un largo viaje (11 años) de formación en el seminario, a la edad de 28 años, fui ordenado sacerdote el 29 de junio de 2007 por el reverendo William Weigand en la Catedral del Santísimo Sacramento, en Sacramento junto con otros seis hombres. Nos llamaron los "Siete Magníficos".



Después de mi ordenación, fui asignado como el vicario parroquial de la Iglesia de San José en Elk Grove por unos meses. Luego, me trasladaron a la Parroquia de San Basilio en Vallejo y me quedé allí por casi 3 años. Después de eso, fui asignado como el vicario parroquial de la Iglesia Holy Rosary en Woodland por 2 años. Luego, el Obispo me asignó como Capellán de St. Francis High School y vicario parroquial de San José una iglesia en el norte de Sacramento. Después de eso fui nombrado párroco de la iglesia de Santa Mónica en Willows y me quedé allí por casi 5 años antes de venir aquí a la Parroquia St. John Vianney.
