<u>Video Overview</u>: When you hear the parable of the sower and seed, you are good soil, right? Jesus is challenging you to look deeper at your lives to assess what kind of soil you really are. Too often, sin camouflages itself by our busyness, worry, work, and other activities which keep us from receiving fully the teachings of Christ. The good seed that was sown in our lives can begin to wither and die. The soil of our lives isn't all that good. But it doesn't have to be that way. God, the Divine Sower, is always willing to sow new seeds in our lives. However, just as a lot of work goes into preparing—and tending—the soil of an actual garden, so too we have to make sure that the soil of our souls is prepared and cared for so that we can be in the right frame of mind and heart to receive the Word of God in new, deeper ways, now and for the rest of our lives. Commit to daily Scripture study with a group so that they can be your mirror and not you.

Featured Study: Do unto others. Echo Part III: Christian Morality.

Topics of Interest: Most people don't recognize that this parable is all about studying Scripture in order to prepare yourself to live out the will of God. Some think Jesus intends that some of his hearers will fail to understand him and forgo salvation! That's not what this Gospel means; remember, God "desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth," 1 Timothy 2:4. Think about how Jesus's parables function. "Why do you speak to them in parables?" the disciples ask. Jesus responds, "Because knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven has been granted to you, but to them it has not been granted." While that last phrase might suggest God withheld something that makes understanding the parable possible, the reality is that the meaning of the parable depends upon our free decision to be cultivated by God's grace and use it to study the word of God. The good soil (or good soul) that receives the seed (which is the word of the parable itself) is willing to be tilled by God's grace. That is why Jesus says, "To anyone who has {freely received God's grace} more will be given." But Jesus also warns that "from anyone who has not (those who refused to receive God's grace) even what he has will be taken away." We are given the choice: either to become "good soil" and receive the riches of grace, or to reject God's Word.

UPDATES ON VIGILS, FUNERAL MASSES & BURIALS DURING THE COVID-19 CRISIS

Catholic Funeral and Cemetery Services (CFCS) offers parishioners the complete range of mortuary services, including cremation, vigils, funeral masses and graveside committal services. These services had been tightly restricted under the shelter-in-place orders, but have now been adjusted as follows:

Vigils, visitations and funeral masses may now all take place at each of our CFCS locations, but with some seating limitations, e.g., St. Mary's Chapel (up to 48 people) and Calvary Mausoleum (up to 100 people). Funeral masses at St. John Vianney must follow the parish's own restrictions (100 maximum).

Graveside committal services are now allowed at each of our CFCS cemeteries for up to 100 people. A perimeter around the grave will be established and up to 8 family members are allowed within that perimeter. All other guests must remain outside the perimeter.


