Video Overview: Pope Paul VI insisted that the “task of evangelizing all people constitutes the essential mission of the Church;” the body of Christ; everyone, including the laity. We might be thinking, “Me? Evangelize? Isn’t that a Protestant thing?” Jesus shares his formula for the best way to evangelize and spread the Gospel message and it backs it up again in Matt 28:18-20, the Great Commission. It’s spreading his message with joy and gratitude, and we receive when we can rest in the peace of Christ. What Jesus is telling the disciples, and by extension all of us, is that we are to bring to all the nations the blessing of God that had been given first to Israel.

Featured Study: Evangelizing Catholics, by Dr. Scott Hahn. A 5 Star video that says its all about us.

Topics of Interest: Jesus appoints 70-72 others to serve and teach others his own ministry. But by their very number we see that the “kingdom of God” that Jesus instructs them to announce, means that the role of Israel is to be “a light to the nations” is coming to fulfillment (Is 42:6, 49:6). In Jewish tradition, 70-72, is the number of the nations descended from Noah and his sons after the flood (Gen 10) and the number of the offspring of Jacob who went with him into Egypt (Ex 1:5). Deut 32:8 even seems to connect these two, saying, “When the Most High gave to the nations their inheritance, when he separated the sons of men, he fixed the bounds of the peoples according to the number of the sons of God [that is, Jacob]”. So, the seventy of Israel is God’s “portion” (Deut 32:9) of the seventy nations, and specially set aside for his purpose to bring the truth of his covenant love (Is 42:6) to the world. As Is 49:6 puts it, “I will give you as a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth.” When Jesus sends out the 72, he is telling us, the kingdom, now “at hand,” and will reach to the nations!

WHAT'S HAPPENING?

This is just a quick update on activity going on parish property. Most of the projects are major repairs required to bring parish operation up to date.

Tree removal and sidewalk repairs. Due to the drought, trees on the property stretched their root system looking for water. Foundations and sidewalks were damaged. The current projects should resolve some safety and liability issues. The cost for this is estimated at \$22,000.

W-Fi system update. The current system does not provide the coverage and access needed for parish operations, especially faith formation and ministries. Approximate cost is \$3000-5000.

Office expansion is needed for social service ministries to the community. There will be a build out of additional office space in the building shared with food locker. The cost for materials about \$3000.

The goal is for all the above to be completed prior to start of school and faith formation year in August.

The sound system in the church has failed. Urgent repairs are being made as the search for a new system is underway. Total costs is speculated to exceed \$75,000. This will be major capital improvement.

Be aware in the near future - an ongoing monthly second collection will be started. The funds will be directed to helping keep our parish facilities in good repair and up to date.

You are invited to attend the California Assembly Public Safety Committee meeting to voice your opposition to Senate Bill 360. This meeting is open to all.

The “seal of confession” is one of the most sacrosanct of Catholic beliefs and penitents rely on this unbreakable guarantee to freely confess and seek reconciliation with God. A priest who breaks the seal is automatically excommunicated (Canon 1388).

Yet now, the California Assembly Public Safety Committee is debating SB 360, a bill proposing to eliminate the penitential communication exemption for priests and **employees of the Catholic Church when it comes to child sexual abuse.**

SB 360 would undermine that, create confusion, deter counseling and discourage spiritual counseling without gaining any protection for children.

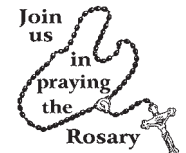
