<u>Video Overview</u>: Christ the Teacher, finally, his exhausted and exasperated disciples try to get him to send away the hungry throng, as much for the sake of the people (who need to eat) as for their own sake, so they can have a break. But Christ wants to teach them a lesson: just as the Son of Man (Jesus) has come to serve, to give and not to count the cost, so his followers must do the same. "Feed them yourselves," he quips. Imagine the look on the disciples' faces! Five thousand men, with another few thousand women and children, and the Master tells the Apostles to give them a meal. They point out that they really have barely enough food even for themselves, let alone to feed thousands of hungry hangers-on. But however, little they have, when they put it into the hands of the Lord it becomes more than enough.

Featured Study: Put Greed in the search window. Echo Part III: Episode 34: The Tenth Commandment.

Topics of Interest: St. Matthew emphasizes Christ's example of self-forgetting love in this episode by drawing a parallel between it and the culmination of Jesus' self-giving, the Eucharist. The four verbs that describe what Jesus does with the five loaves in this scene are the same four verbs that describe what Jesus does with the bread that becomes his body during the Last Supper – the same ones every priest still uses today in the sacrifice of the Mass: *took... blessed... broke... gave.* It is a summary of Christian theology. Jesus did that with human nature: taking flesh, praying to his Father, suffering his passion, and spreading the Good News. He does it with each of his disciples: he calls them, pours out his grace on them, gives them a share in the cross, and sends them into the world to make more disciples. The Eucharist is Christ's ongoing love affair with the souls for whom he died, and it makes what it teaches (self-forgetting love) actually happen in those who receive it with faith.

Feast of St. John Vianney

Born: 1786
Died: August 4, 1859
Canonized: 1925 by Pope Pius XI
Feast Day: August 4
Patron Saint of: parish priests

Saint John Mary Vianney is familiarly known as the **Curé of Ars** and as such is the heavenly patron of all parish priests.

He was born of poor parents in Dardilly, France, in 1786. He began his studies for the priesthood at the age of nineteen and only after many failures and difficulties was he ordained in 1815.

He was appointed pastor of the village of Ars where the Faith had practically vanished. Here he labored for the rest of his life gaining a worldwide reputation as a priest who practiced great penance, exercised a wondrous power in the confessional, and softened the hearts of sinners by his preaching.

After many trials, not the least of which was an **obsession by the devil**, Father Vianney, exhausted by his labors and his penance, returned his soul to **God** in 1859. He was canonized in **1929** and his feast is celebrated on **August 4**.

St. John Vianney, pray for us. Amen.

It is difficult to limit the number of invitees to a vigil or funeral service. In an effort to help, we now stream services on our YouTube channel. We provide families a link prior to the service and keep the recording after the service. Our funeral staff can provide more details regarding "Livestream" option at St. Mary Funeral Center.

Graveside services (committals) continue. A limited number of immediate family members, practicing physical distancing, are permitted next to the grave. Additional family members and guests may attend, but they must stand nearby and practice physical distancing. A Priest or Deacon, a Funeral Director and grounds crew team would be in attendance at a committal. Current committal guidelines are:

- A 25' perimeter will be established around the grave site.
- Up to eight (8) family members inside the perimeter.
- Up to one hundred (100) individuals may be allowed to attend.


