Video Overview: In Ecclesiastes, we hear that the pursuit of worldly riches is vanity because in the end we have to let them all go. Luke refers to a man complaining to Jesus that his brother hasn't divided the inheritance equally. Jesus gives us the divine perspective on wealth with a story of a wealthy man who has a crop so big it doesn't fit into his barns. He decides to build bigger barns to store up his great wealth. But God tells him he will die that very night and will not be able to enjoy his wealth because of his selfishness. Jesus tells his listeners, this is how it will be, for everyone who stores up treasures for himself rather than being rich in what matters to God and what really lasts. Acquiring wealth is vanity if we acquire it just for ourselves. So, Jesus is asking us whether, in our saving and our success, are we focusing on earthly success or that which will have an eternal reward.

Featured Study: Put Greed in the search window. Echo Part III: Episode 34: The Tenth Commandment.

Topics of Interest: One sign of a deep faith is the ability to embrace the poverty of spirit that Jesus teaches. *"I have learned, in whatever state I am, to be content. I know how to be abased, and I know how to abound; in any and all circumstances I have learned the secret of facing plenty and hunger, abundance and want. I can do all things in him who strengthens me;"* Phil 4:11-13. Rejoicing in plenty is OK, but the real danger is the greed that comes from a habit of plenty. How can we know if we can be content without our goods, if we've never been without? In the West, greed is associated with idolatry, illegitimate worship, financial security at any cost, status, our sexual appetites, celebrity, and when it begins to win our hearts and becomes the focus of our desire and efforts, we have begun to turn toward false worship. Remember: *"All Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit..."* and to keep us from hearing those frightening words, *"You fool,"* from the mouth of Jesus.

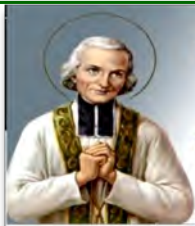

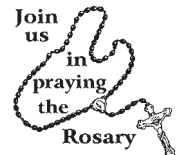

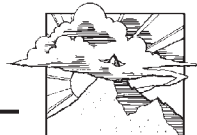
