Video Overview: Most of us admit there's someone we still haven't forgiven. The great spiritual truth is that forgiveness is more for us than the other person (Matt 6:15). If we do not forgive, we hold that person in bondage to their sin, and we hold ourselves in bondage both to the sin and the sinner as well. Sometimes we don't even want to forgive, yet we have to begin the process, and it is a process, as you ask for *the desire to forgive*. Eventually, that desire takes root, we learn to let go of our mistaken notions about forgiveness and come to understand of what forgiveness really consists. Forgiveness doesn't mean that the sin doesn't matter or that we forget what happened to us. It doesn't mean everything is "all better," and it certainly doesn't mean that restitution and justice aren't needed. True forgiveness is a free will action, prompted by God, that frees us from bondage. It's not an emotion; it's an act of the will by making a decision to let go of the chains that bind us, and then moving forward. Remember that the Lord tells us that everything can be worked to the good, for those who believe. The key is our cooperation with God's requirement to forgive, and to receive that you need to be willing to take that first step.

Featured Study: St. Giuseppe Moscati.

Topics of Interest: After Peter was given the "keys of the kingdom", we see how the Church has the power to bind and loose with a certain authority in the world. Christians are to be "watchmen" over others who may stray from the truth, it's a prophetic responsibility we receive by Baptism. We are to speak honestly and directly to or "brothers and sisters" who have strayed from the path of love that Paul describes in Romans. Jesus tells us to guard against making this a personal grudge against the one giving the correction. We must understand objectively it is a matter of proper Christian conduct. You might be tempted to think that when Jesus says, "If he refuses to listen...treat him as you would a Gentile or a tax collector," that he means reject him all together. But we need to recall that the person who recorded this Gospel for us was a tax collector named Matthew. Luke tells us about how Jesus treated the tax collector named Zacchaeus (Luke 19). Likewise, St. Paul is sent to preach the good news to the Gentiles by Jesus (Acts 9:15). Sometimes Christian love will have to be tough love, giving clear signs of God's disfavor at sin, but love and mercy are to have no limits for those in Christ.
