

<u>Review</u>: A meal with Jesus Christ himself: What would it be like if Jesus asked to share dinner with you and your family tonight? For starters, how would you dress? What would you serve? How would you prepare your home? Beyond that, what would you discuss? What would you share with him, and what do you think he would say in response? Each Sunday Jesus invites you to share a meal with him-to encounter him in the most intimate of ways. How do you approach the Mass? Do you show up late, wearing what you worked in all day, and with your laundry list of "to-do's" on your mind? Jesus wants to encounter us and touch our hearts every time we meet him in the Eucharist. Take some time this week to reconsider the invitation of the Mass.

Featured study: The Road to Emmaus by Tim Gray. Terrific.

Reflection: The Gospel reading today recounts the story of what happened to two disciples after they unknowingly encounter the Risen Christ on the Road to Emmaus. When they return to Jerusalem to share their good news with the other disciples, Jesus suddenly appears in the room. As in John's account, Jesus offers peace, but here the disciples are troubled and question his appearance. Luke's account emphasizes the physical nature of Jesus's resurrected body. In response to his disciples' questioning, Jesus exhorts them to look at and touch his body to assure them that he is flesh and bone rather than a spirit or ghost. They experience joy at his presence yet are still incredulous (v. 41, so Jesus asks for and proceeds to eat a piece of fish to assure them further. This appearance of Jesus in his resurrected body prefigures the resurrection of the body for all of us at the end of time. Jesus reigns in Heaven in his resurrected body, one that can pass through locked doors and appear and disappear at will and is no longer bound to the laws of nature and the limitations of time and space yet is able to consume food. We assert belief in this promise for ourselves when we recite the Creed each Sunday at Mass. Now Luke recounts how Jesus confirms that all the prophecies about him have come true, thereby uniting the Old and New Testaments and proving that he is truly the Messiah. He reminds them that he necessarily had to suffer, die on the Cross, and rise from the dead for the remittance of sin. Now, the disciples are charged with the mission to preach repentance and the forgiveness of sins in Christ's name, beginning in Jerusalem and going out to all nations. Thus, the message in Luke's Gospel (as in John's) is that mission lies at the heart of discipleship, and the mission is mercy and the forgiveness of sins. Once again, this narrative should reassure us of Christ's peace and joy as we are reminded that as believers, we are called to participate in his mission of mercy.

From the Pastor

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP: How to Fail Your Way to Heaven

You know what are some of my favorite moments in Scripture? The little "Easter eggs" of Jesus' humanity, things like Jesus falling asleep, Jesus drawing in the sand, Jesus playing with kids. And how about Jesus rising from the dead, appearing to his disciples and saying, "So, have you got anything to eat?" It's right for us to always keep in mind that Jesus is God. But we also have to remember that he was man. He got hungry. He cried when he felt sad and laughed when he felt happy. He got tired. He got bored.

Because he was God, none of those feelings ever led him into sin, like they do us. He never spent a car ride trying to pass the hours by seeing how annoyed he could make his older sister. He never smacked Peter over the head for saying something really stupid. But he did unleash some Biblically righteous anger on those traders in the temple, didn't he? And he wasn't shy about calling Peter "a Satan" when his friend tempted him to take the easy way out.

It's the tightrope walk we all try to balance every day, honoring our human emotions while still answering God's call to be better. Being perfect isn't the domain of the Christian — that's the domain of Christ only. Trying and failing, then trying again (and failing again) and again and again? That's the domain of the Christian.

English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held once a month on Sunday from 11:30am-2:30pm.

Vatican News

By Deborah Castellano Lubov, Apr. 1, 2024 Pope at Regina Coeli: Lord's Resurrection brings immense joy, transforms our lives

"The Resurrection of Jesus is not just wonderful news or the happy ending of a story, but something that changes our lives completely and forever..."

Pope Francis offered this powerful reminder to the faithful gathered in St. Peter's Square before reciting the Regina Coeli prayer on Easter Monday at noon.

The Holy Father drew inspiration from today's Gospel reading according to Saint Matthew that describes the women meeting Jesus at the empty tomb.

The joy born from the living encounter with the Risen One, the Pope said, is "a powerful emotion," which impelled them to spread the word, and tell what they had seen....Yet, he argued, the joy experienced by the women on Easter morning, was a much greater and powerful experience, because the Resurrection is not just "wonderful news or the happy ending of a story," but rather "something that changes our lives completely and forever!" "It is the victory of life over death" and of "hope over despondency," the Pope said, as he went on to reflect on the power of the Lord's presence to fill anything with light. "With Him," he said, "every day becomes a step in an eternal journey, every 'today' can hope for a 'tomorrow,' every end a new beginning, every instant is projected beyond the limits of time, towards eternity." ...For this reason, he urged, "let us hasten to seek Him in the Eucharist, in His forgiveness, in prayer and in lived charity!"

Media release from the Diocese of Sacramento - April 1, 2024




Jaime Soto, Bishop of Sacramento, has filed for reorganization of the Diocese of Sacramento's debts in U.S. Bankruptcy Court. He had announced in December the diocese's plan to file bankruptcy.

The diocese's filing comes as it faces more than 250 lawsuits alleging sexual abuse of minors by clergy and other employees reaching back to the 1950's. This wave of new claims followed a 2019 law allowing victim-survivors to file lawsuits regardless of when the abuse occurred. The likely cost of the lawsuits far outstrips the diocese's funds available for litigation or settlement.

Bishop Soto described the bankruptcy filing as the best way left to him to provide some compensation to victim-survivors of abuse.
