

Review: When St. Paul commands us to "pray always" in his first letter to the Thessalonians, we tend to let it go in one ear and out the other. "Of course, he can't possibly mean that! He really just means to pray a lot." We so easily filter the words of Scripture based on what we think God wants from us, but then we end up missing his true message. God actually wants us to always be praying, just like St. Paul told us! But how can that be? It might make more sense to us if we better understand what prayer truly is. Prayer is not only reciting the rosary, mental Scripture prayer, or going to Mass. Prayer is being in communion with God. To pray always is nothing other than to always stay connected to the Lord-in other words, to become a saint. Our readings today point towards this vision God has for us, particularly when Jesus gives us the image of the vine and the branches. He promises that if we remain in him, we will bear much fruit. If always staying connected to the Lord seems out of reach, then let's remember that when God gives a command he always gives us the grace to respond. How can we stay attached to the vine and learn to pray always?

<u>Featured study</u>: *Prayer: A surge of the Heart*. This inspiring presentation challenges us to make more time for God in our lives and highlights the importance of an ever-deepening life of prayer. Make time for this video in your life today.

Reflection: Last Sunday, Jesus referred to himself as the Good Shepherd who lays down his life for his sheep. Today, he uses the imagery of the vine, the source of divine life for all who believe in him and obey his Word. This passage is an exhortation to abide in Jesus to achieve fruitful discipleship given as part of Jesus's Farewell Discourse to his Apostles on the night before his Passion and Death. Jesus wants to teach his Apostles about discipleship to help prepare them to carry on the mission following his death.] Jesus discloses that the key to fruitful discipleship is to abide in him. Only those who abide will bear fruit, but they will be pruned so they can become even more fruitful. Branches that do not bear fruit will be cut off and burned. The vine analogy highlights the promise of the beautiful intimacy that Jesus offers to all those who believe in him but also the horror that awaits those who reject him. When we abide in Jesus and nurture our relationship with him, he abides in us and gives us the grace to bear fruit for the kingdom. Further, this mutual abiding is the necessary source of our prayer life so that our wills become aligned with God who will provide what we ask. Yet, we must expect some pruning along the way in the form of challenges and obstacles so that we do not grow weak or tepid. Bearing good fruit is proof of our discipleship. Since the Father is glorified in the Son and, as his disciples, we share the same mission with Christ, our fruitfulness glorifies the Father. In contrast, those who reject Christ, the life-giving vine, will bear no fruit and will be cut off and thrown into the fire, perhaps an allusion to Hell.




National Day of Prayer

Let us pray: Loving God, today, we seek your wisdom to preach the good news in our country. Grant wisdom and faith to our elected leaders, the people we choose to lead our country, to make choices that are based upon your teaching. Where laws are made that go against your will, give us courage to change policy, not based upon our comfort, but upon principles taught in Scripture.

We ask all this in the name of Jesus, who lives and reign with you, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

MORE GIFTS OF BAPTISM

We know that the Paschal Candle symbolizes Jesus as the light of the world and that He has shared His light with each of us. Baptism is a gift from God. The white dress shows we are pure, that we have no sin, and that we are children of the light, children of God. Now we focus on other gifts:

The word of God from the Holy Bible tells us He is our Good Shepherd who laid down his life for His sheep. The baptismal water is poured over us as we are called by name and takes away our original sin. Then we receive the oils. The Oil of Catechumens is put on our chest and hands to anoint us and to give us the strength of Jesus. The Oil of

Chrism is put on our head to crown us as children of the Kingdom of God. You see, at our Baptism we received so many gifts!

English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held once a month on Sunday from 11:30am-2:30pm.

First Eucharist:

A two year family formation program preparation is required. Children must be a minimum of 6 years old. Classes run from September-May and registrations are open June-August.

Vatican News

By Deborah Castellano Lubov , Apr. 14, 2024 Pope at Regina Coeli: How beautiful is it to share our faith

How beautiful it is to encounter the Lord, and when we have done so, we must transmit the joy of this to others... Pope Francis gave this comforting reminder during his Regina Coeli address on this third Sunday of Easter. In his address, the Holy Father reflected on the day's Gospel reading according to St. Luke, which takes place the evening of Passover.

The passage narrates when the Apostles are gathered in the Upper Room, and in particular, when the two disciples return from Emmaus and tell of their encounter with Jesus. The Holy Father went on to reflect on how this moment transformed their lives, and how likewise, encountering Jesus, changes everything for all faithful.

The Pope highlighted that despite how life changing our encounter with the Lord is, and how "it is the most beautiful thing we have to tell," we still often struggle to talk about it. "Each one of us could say so much about this; not by being a lecturer to others," he clarified, "but by sharing the unique moments in which we perceived the Lord alive and close, who kindled joy in our hearts or dried our tears, who transmitted confidence and consolation, strength and enthusiasm, or forgiveness, tenderness, peace." The Holy Father stressed how important it is to share this in the family, in the community, and with friends.







