

Review: On the first Easter, it seems as if practically everyone, but the enemies of Jesus, had forgotten that he said he would rise on the third day. In the Gospel accounts, only those who opposed Jesus are reported as remembering that he predicted his death and resurrection. They assumed that his followers would also remember and attempt to steal his body as "proof" that he had risen from the dead, so they asked the Romans to post a guard at the tomb. They need not have bothered since the disciples had apparently forgotten-or completely misunderstood-what Jesus had told them over and over. Instead, the fearful Apostles were in hiding, and the women were planning to anoint a dead body. However, just as the failure of those closest to Jesus to believe in his Resurrection led to the proclamation of the Jesus's living presence throughout the world, so can we grow in faith and trust in his living presence as well. Though the mysteries of the Faith are not readily understood, we should ask for the grace to believe—to grow in the virtues of Faith, Hope, and Charity. With these gifts, we have the power to recognize the importance of the Resurrection, and how it can transform our lives. Alleluia, he is risen. He is risen indeed.


Reflection: There is so much to consider in this Gospel passage; even the first few words give us a whole world of things to ponder. "On the first day of the week," we are told, "Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning." As already noted, the first day of that week in that year was the feast of First Fruits. Again, St. Paul calls Jesus the first fruits of those who are to rise from the dead. That means that we are part of the full harvest, of which Jesus is the first fruits. According to the Jewish practice, that full harvest of which the feast of First Fruits was but a promise, came on the harvest feast of Pentecost, fifty days after. As we know from Acts 3, on Pentecost the Holy Spirit fell on the apostles and disciples, bringing a great harvest of souls (three thousand, in fact). The "first day" is also saturated with meaning on other levels. Jesus had rested in the tomb on the old Sabbath of Israel. Just as the Creator God had rested after his week's work of making the world on the seventh day, Jesus, who has re-created the world by his Passion week, rested in the sleep of death on that Sabbath. Now, he rises to new life on a new first day, as a sign of the first day of the first creation, the day when God had made light, and of the new creation he has worked in his Paschal Mystery. Just as the light dawns on the new creation, Mary's arrival early in the morning is a sign of the new light and life that this Easter brings life.





Vatican News

'Pope to Catholics: Always walk together with fraternal

"The world doesn't end with ourselves, and we only really discover it by walking together, day by day." Pope Francis stressed this on Saturday when meeting in the Vatican with some 2,000 pilgrims from two parishes of the northern Italian city of Rho, in the Archdiocese of Milan. The group was accompanied by the parish priest, Fr. Michele Di Tolve, whom the Pope has known personally since his days as a cardinal.


Noting that their parishes bring together "different and complementary generations, backgrounds, services and gifts," Pope Francis reminded the Italian parishioners that the "richness" of this variety and communion" is the essence of the Church and "the most powerful means" by which the Gospel can be proclaimed, "even before uttering any word."

'The Church is a body made up of many members, all at the service of one another and all animated by the same love: that of Christ. And when the Church is not like that, it falls into worldliness, it falls into clericalism, which is a very bad thing." He emphasized the importance of walking together as brothers and sisters, "because fraternity makes people freer and happier." The parish is blessed place where we go to feel loved This is why, said the Pope, the parish community is so important,

"because it is the place where, in following Jesus, we meet, get to know each other, enrich one another, it's people of different generations and from different cultural and social backgrounds, all with something unique to give and to receive."





Baptisms:

English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held online.

Bautizos:

Bautizos en Español son cada 3er Sábado del mes a las 9:30 am. Clases pre-bautismales son el Domingo anterior al bautizo de las 9am-1pm.

Marriage:

As a minimum requirement, couples must contact the parish office and set an appointment at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Marriage preparation classes

Matrimonio:

Se requiere que las parejas contacten a la oficina parroquial cuando menos seis meses antes de la fecha de matrimonio. Clases prematrimoniales son en persona.

First Eucharist:

A two year family formation program preparation is required. Children must be a minimum of 6 years old. Classes run from September-May and registrations are open June-August.

Primera Comunion:

Programa de dos años en el programa de formación familiar es requerido. Los niños deben tener 6 años cumplidos o más. Inscripciones son Junio-Agosto y las clases son Septiembre-Mayo.

Youth Confirmation:

Candidates for Confirmation must be at least 12 years old and in 7th grade to start the program. A two-year religious education preparation is required prior to receiving the Sacrament.
