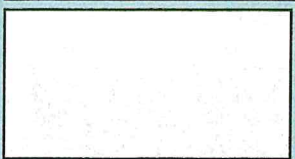

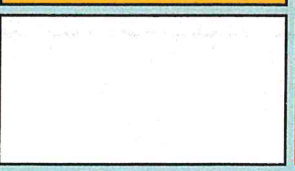

Peter said to him in reply, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." He said, "Come." Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus. - Mt 14:28-29

Review: Have you ever been in a storm at sea? If you have, you know how terrifying it can be. Now imagine being in a storm in a small wooden boat ... and not knowing how to swim! (It's been suggested that most fishermen in Jesus's time didn't know how to swim.) This is the scene we have in today's Gospel. Jesus has just performed the miracle of the feeding of the 5,000 and has sent his disciples ahead of him, saying he will meet them on the other side of the Sea of Galilee. It's the darkest time of night and the wind is against the boat. As any sailor will tell you, that's when a boat is most likely to capsize. In the darkness, the disciples see Jesus coming toward them, walking on the water. They cry out in fear and Jesus responds, "Take courage. It is I." In doing so, he utters the Divine Name, indicating that he is more than a teacher or miracle worker; he is God. Peter isn't sure that this is really Jesus so he asks the figure to command him to come. Jesus obliges with a single word: Come. Now this is where the story gets really interesting. As long as Peter keeps his eyes fixed on Jesus, he is fine. The minute he notices that he is walking on water in the middle of a raging storm, he sinks. After crying out for help, he is rescued by Jesus, who calms the storms and comforts the disciples. Peter's lesson is our lesson, too. We need to trust Jesus, not only in the good times, but also when the storms of life batter us. Would that we could know his presence in our lives, in our dark days, our bright days and every day.

Featured study: Say yes to Christ, allowing Jesus to be Lord of Your Whole life

Reflection: In this Gospel text we can see a reflection of the themes from the First Reading. Elijah had just received a miraculous meal (1 Kings 19:5-8) before beholding his vision of the power and gentleness of God on the mountain. In Matthew 14, the feeding of the five thousand precedes Jesus's retreat to the mountain to commune with his Father, and then he comes down and demonstrates his divine power by walking upon a storm-tossed sea. Peter is cast in a role like Elijah, who is a man of remarkable faith, capable of prophesying boldly to kings, and yet who fears for his life. Peter, too, is bold enough to be the only one who invites Jesus to call him out on to the turbulent waters and yet who doubts when he sees just how stormy that sea is. We, too, are people of faith who still fear and second-guess our earlier commitments to God. Sometimes our faith, expansive and even heroic at the outset, turns to "little faith" when the struggles begin. Peter supplies an iconic response for all of us, crying out to the Lord for help when his faith turns from heroic to "little." Note that Jesus immediately responds, taking Peter's hand. He will always do the same for us.



From the Pastor



19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Many of us may struggle to overcome habitual sin. In the back of your mind, you might feel that the chance you will commit sin again is really high. You might even begin to wonder why you should keep confessing these sins? Isn't that dishonest? Anyone who has felt the tyrannical power of sin — and who hasn't? — has pondered this kind of question. Consider this: What was the probability Peter would walk on the stormy water? Zero? But when Jesus called, he did it. This should alter our mindset from focusing on our own weaknesses to the greatness of the Lord's love for us. The question for us should not be one of human probabilities about our sin, but rather whether or not we will trust the Lord's grace in our lives. This week the Lord is calling you and me to do the impossible: overcome sin with love. The only way to do that is to trust he is calling, and then to walk with the eyes of faith locked on him. And if we sink, he will raise us up again and again. Of that, we can be 100% sure.

Vatican News

'Pope at Angelus: Seek, find, and welcome God's precious love'

Offering his customary catechesis on the Sunday Gospel, Pope Francis spoke about Jesus' parable of the merchant in search of precious pearls when upon finding one of great value, he goes and sells all he has to buy it.

The Pope then described three actions of the merchant that we also can put into practice in our own lives: he first seeks, then he finds, and finally he buys the precious pearl.

The first action of the "enterprising merchant" to go out and seek precious pearls demonstrates his desire to "cultivate dreams of good" and search for something new, the Pope explained, as the merchant was not simply satisfied with what he already had, but knew there were even greater possibilities.

This curiosity and drive is what we need in seeking the "newness of the Lord, because the Lord is not repetitive" but always making "the realities of life new," said the Pope.

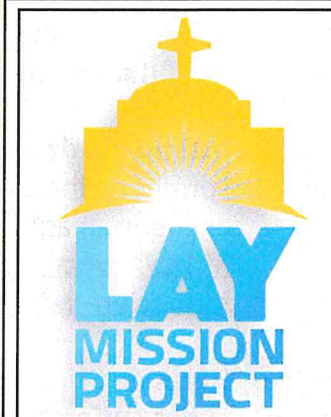
While searching for the precious pearl, the merchant then finds what he is looking for, as he has a sharp eye and knows how to recognize a pearl of great value, the Pope went on to say.

He likened it to the person who goes through a fascinating oriental market full of a variety goods, carefully examining and discerning everything on display. The Pope said this methodic process of careful discernment offers a teaching for us in that we also must discern what is good and precious. He said we need to seek what matters and is of value for our lives, to train ourselves to see the "precious gems" of life from what is of no use or benefit.

Candidates, on the other hand, are those who are already Christians by baptism and are seeking full communion with the Catholic Church. These include Catholics who have been baptized but have not had the other Sacraments of Initiation, as well as Christians of other denominations who have had a valid baptism. Curious Catholics are all of us to one extent or another who wish to nurture and nourish our faith through improved understanding of all our Faith has to offer us drawing us closer to Jesus. The OCIA sessions are ideal for that. We will be meeting every Sunday morning with sessions starting after the 8:00am Mass usually concluding in time to attend the 10:00am Mass.

Bautizos:

Bautizos en Español son cada 3er Sábado del mes a las 9:30 am. Clases pre-bautismales son el Domingo anterior al bautizo de las 9am-1pm.

Marriage:

As a minimum requirement, couples must contact the parish office and set an appointment at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Marriage preparation classes online.

Matrimonio:

Se requiere que las parejas contacten a la oficina parroquial cuando menos seis meses antes de la fecha de matrimonio. Clases prematrimoniales son en persona.

First Eucharist:

A two year family formation program preparation is required. Children must be a minimum of 6 years old. Classes run from September-May and registrations are open June-August.

Primera Comunión:

Programa de dos años en el programa de formación familiar es requerido. Los niños deben tener 6 años cumplidos o más. Inscripciones son Junio-Agosto y las clases son Septiembre-Mayo.

Youth Confirmation:

Candidates for Confirmation must be at least 12 years old and in 7th grade to start the program. A two-year religious education preparation is required prior to receiving the Sacrament.

Confirmación para Jóvenes:

Candidatos para Confirmación deben de tener los 12 años cumplidos y cursar el séptimo grado. El programa es de dos años de educación religiosa antes de recibir el Sacramento.

OCIA and Adult Sacramental:

For adults seeking one or more Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, First Eucharist, or Confirmation). Sessions begin in the fall. Please contact the parish office for more information.

OCIA y Sacramentos para adultos:
