Video overview : Jesus speaks of scary things—wars, famines, persecution, plagues, earthquakes, and signs falling from the skies. Yet in the midst of his warnings about the judgement coming on earth and the persecution his followers will face, Jesus exhorts his disciples, "By your perseverance you will secure your lives." Perseverance is the key. Will the disciples remain faithful to Jesus when their faith is tested most—when they face trials, sufferings, and even persecution? For first-century Christians who might be hated for the sake of their faith in Christ, the words of Jesus would provide reassurance and hope. Jesus will always strengthen and comfort those who persevere in faith. We can rest in this same hope today. Just as the early Christians persevered in times of trial, so too are we called to persevere in the daily crosses the world might inflict upon Christ's followers today. While not all of us are called to literally die for the faith like the early Christian martyrs did, we all are called to die to ourselves in many little ways each day through the sacrifices we make for our faith and by persevering through the misunderstanding, ridicule, and even hostility we might face for remaining faithful to Christ in our secular world today.

Featured study: The Power of Perseverance with Paul Kapsalis 16 min

Reflection: Jesus' warning in outline form that elaborates on the prophecy He uttered in Luke 19:41-44 about the fall of the Temple. The importance of that event owes much to the symbolism represented in the construction of the Temple and its significance to the Jewish people. The Jews believed that God had designated the Temple Mount in Jerusalem as the place where he had specifically directed that his name would be hallowed. Jewish lore held that the Temple rested at the center of the universe and at a place where heaven, earth, and the underworld intersected. The Temple was constructed in three parts (Outer Court, Holy Place, and Holy of Holies) which corresponded to the three great divisions of creation (water above the heavens, land, and the water around the land). The Temple was a kind of microcosm, a universe miniature. When Jesus foretells its destruction, he's in effect saying that the old world is passing away and that time is pregnant with a new age which is about to come to birth. That new age is the kingdom of God, the New Covenant in Christ. That's the world we inhabit as Catholics, citizens of that kingdom, and heirs of that covenant.



Baptisms:

English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held online.

Bautizos:

Bautizos en Español son cada 3er Sábado del mes a las 9:30 am. Clases pre-bautismales son el Domingo anterior al bautizo de las 9am-1pm.

Marriage:

As a minimum requirement, couples must contact the parish office and set an appointment at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Marriage preparation classes online.

Matrimonio:

First Eucharist:

A two year family formation program preparation is required. Children must be a minimum of 6 years old. Classes run from September-May and registrations are open June-August.

Youth Confirmation:

Pope Francis: 'It is good to adore in silence before the Most Blessed Sacrament'



It is good to "waste time adoring" Christ present in the Holy Eucharist, Pope Francis said on Saturday.

"I urge you to especially devote yourselves to the prayer of adoration — this is important," he told a group of religious sisters at the Vatican October 22.

"It is good to adore in silence before the Most Blessed Sacrament," he said, "to be in the consoling presence of Jesus and there to draw the apostolic impetus to be instruments of goodness, tenderness and welcome in the community, the Church, and the world."

Francis said the world today has lost the sense of what it means to engage in the form of prayer known as adoration or worship; "to waste time adoring." "This prayer is not often done: I ask you to do it. Adore, immerse yourself in divine love and give it with full hands to those you meet on your path," he urged.

Pope Francis met Saturday religious women belonging to two communities: The Comboni Missionary Sisters and the Order of the Most Holy Savior, also known as the Bridgettines.

He said the sisters' mission of hospitality is improved with time spent contemplating Christ.

"Welcoming, one of the characteristic aspects of your mission, will be more fruitful to the extent in which the prayer of contemplation will make you come out of yourself and focus your life on Jesus Christ, letting him do things in you, letting him act in you," he said.

"This inner movement," Francis added, "will make possible a service to others that is not philanthropy or welfarism, but openness to the other, closeness, sharing; in a word: charity."


