

November 27, 2022, First Sunday of Advent — Formed.org.

Video overview: Happy New Year! If this strikes you as a bit premature, it isn't really because this Sunday marks the start of the new Church year. In the Catholic Church, the first Sunday of Advent is the beginning of the cycle of readings, holy days, and holidays for roughly the next 365 days. It's also the time of year not only when we are called to prepare



our hearts for the coming of Jesus at Christmas, but also when we are asked to examine our lives and take stock, spiritually speaking. The readings for today all carry a common theme: Wake up! Wake up from the slumber that keeps marriages mediocre, careers unfulfilling, moral lives stagnant. Wake up to the possibility of a new beginning, a new way of living that welcomes Jesus into the cribs of our days, the mangers of our souls. We are told to awaken from the slumber that is robbing us of a deeper and more meaningful relationship with our God and begin to live the new and abundant life that we have been promised. Sometimes people use today's Scripture passages, especially those in the Gospel about two men working in the field and one being taken away, in light of a relatively new and profoundly un-Catholic theology of the "Rapture," which says that the faithful will be taken to heaven and the unbelievers "left behind." We will see that the opposite is true. It is those who are left behind in covenant with God who are saved, and like in the days of Noah, it is those who are unfaithful who will be swept into exile from God. This Advent, we not only want to make a new beginning with the Church, but we also want to be sure that we are with those who are "left behind" in covenant with God at the end of all time.

Featured study: https://www.catholic.com/magazine/online-edition/answering-the-rapture-challenge This is what the Catechism teaches on the Rapture and what it is and what it isn't (i.e. the Protestant misunderstandings).

Reflection: The warning that Jesus levels at his disciples isn't so much a caution against sin as it is against being "unconcerned." This is the way that he describes the attitude of those who were swept away in the flood at the time of Noah. Their mistake was in being unconscious of God in the midst of ordinary activities. Jesus heightens this warning as he describes the time of his second coming in verses 40 and 41. Certainly nothing suggests sin in either activity, yet one will gain an everlasting reward and the other not. What separates the two destinies? In a word-wakefulness. It isn't for us to know when the Lord will come, but we need to be aware that he will come. We're called to live in a state of wakefulness, of spiritual attention. Like the homeowner who doesn't know exactly when the thief will come testifies to the fact that he must "keep a watchful eye," the Lord for whom we wait tells us, "You also must be prepared."



Hello friends! It's the First Sunday of Advent! In our materialistic society, Thanksgiving to Christmas is viewed as the "Christmas Season," which abruptly ends on Christmas Day. But we Catholics... well, we're a different breed. If we are to live a truly liturgical spirituality –a life in which the liturgy and liturgical calendar form the basis of our lives – then we should live the weeks of Advent as the Church intends it. These weeks of Advent preceding Christmas are a time of reflection, of anticipation, and of penance. Just like the Israelites of the Old Testament, we reflect on our sinfulness and need for a savior, and we anticipate the coming of Our Lord Jesus Christ on the day of His birth. In recognition of this, we are called to conversion and penance, which is why the liturgical color of Advent is the same as Lent – purple!

Over the next few weeks, we encourage you to put aside the streaming shows, the social media, and the video games, pick up your bible and rosary, and dive into the mysteries of Christ. Don't let this be a season simply of Christmas shopping; let it be a season of preparation as we welcome Christ into our world and into our hearts.

Perseverance is a reflection of God's love, Pope Francis says

The virtue of perseverance reflects to the world the unchanging love of God, Pope Francis said in his Angelus message Sunday.

"Perseverance is the reflection in the world of God's love, because God's love is faithful, it never changes," Francis said Nov. 13 in a short message.

He referenced the day's Gospel, in which Jesus tells those gathered to hear him that "in history almost everything collapses: there will be, he says, revolutions and wars, earthquakes and famines, pestilence and persecution, and so on."

It is as if Jesus is saying "one should not place too much trust in earthly realities, which pass," the pope said. "They are wise words..."

He said Jesus is trying to teach us the virtue of perseverance.

Francis explained that perseverance indicates a high level of strictness, but Jesus did not mean being inflexible and rigid with our own standards.

"Jesus asks us to be 'strict,' uncompromising, persistent in what he has at heart, in what counts," he underlined.

"Because, what truly counts, very often does not coincide with what attracts our interest," he said. "We prioritize the works of our hands, our successes, our religious and civil traditions, our sacred and social symbols. They are important things, but they pass away."

The pope said Jesus wants us to focus on building "on his word, on love, on goodness." "Here, then, is perseverance: it is building goodness every day," he said. "To persevere is to remain constant in goodness, especially when the reality around us urges us to do otherwise."

Francis gave a few examples of what it means to not persevere in goodness: putting off prayer because you have a lot to do; not following the rules because you see others dodging them; discontinuing your service to the Church, community, and poor because others use their free time for pleasure; not seeing results; and boredom.

"Let us ask ourselves: how is my perseverance? Am I constant, or do I live faith, justice, and charity according to the moment?" he said. "In short, do my prayer and service depend on circumstances or on a heart that is steadfast in the Lord?"


