


Video overview: It may seem odd that, just as the secular world begins to celebrate peace and joy during the holiday season, we are asked in this week's Gospel to consider our sinfulness. The words of John the Baptist echo across the centuries: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" Isn't John's talk about sin, God's wrath, and the need for repentance a bit of a downer as we prepare for Christmas? It might seem that way, at least until we think about what it means to "repent." To repent is not just to realize that we have done bad things, or to to berate ourselves continually for our errors. Repentance does mean that we confess our failures, but that's just the beginning. True repentance also entails turning toward those attributes and actions that will allow us to unite more closely with Our Lord. It involves an honest examination of conscience and a firm commitment to change. That's what John is telling us in this week's reading when he accuses the Pharisees and Sadducees of being a "brood of vipers." He is, in very dramatic fashion, asking them to judge their actions against their words; to see if they are living according to the Word of God or merely mouthing words about God. He is calling them to make the dramatic change that lies at the heart of true repentance. We are asked to do the same thing. What gives us hope is that Jesus, whose birth we will celebrate in a few short weeks, will bring with him the Holy Spirit. This is one of the reasons the Church includes this reading during Advent- for it is the Holy Spirit who breaks through the walls of our sinfulness and pride and illuminates our hearts. It is only through this illumination that we are able to set our feet on a new path, which leads to the abundant life that Jesus has promised is waiting for us.

Featured study: Daily Reflections - The Nativity of St. John the Baptist - June 23, 2022

**Reflection:** John the Baptist is the man who stands at the seam of the Old Testament and the New. St. Augustine teaches that John's birth to elderly parents (Elizabeth and Zechariah) represents the antiquity of Israel, and that his leaping for joy while still in his mother's womb at the Visitation of Mary suggests the newness of his coming prophetic proclamation. In his appearance and actions, John sums up the whole of the Old Testament. His clothing is the same as Elijah's, the greatest prophet of the Old Testament. He calls Israel out into the desert for purification as Moses did and prepares the people to be led into the new Promised Land by the new Joshua (Yeshua=Jesus). His diet consists of locusts, which are symbolic of pestilence, and honey, which is the food of the Promised Land. John the Baptist's most prominent virtue is humility. "I am not worthy to carry his sandals," he says of Our Lord. Carrying one's sandals at this time would be the work of a slave-and John sees himself as unworthy of even that office! If we're to prepare ourselves and others for the coming of the great King this Advent, then we should first turn our attention to our need for a humility like that of St. John the Baptist, the first herald of Christ.







#### **YOUTH MINISTRY TODAY: 11am-12pm Fireside Room**

#### Hello friends!

On this Second Sunday of Advent, St. John the Baptist preaches in the wilderness and is "a voice of one crying out in the desert, prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." Eusebius of Caesarea, a third century bishop and "Father of Church History," explained that this passage not only refers literally to the wilderness in which St. John begins his preaching, but also to the state in which the world finds itself at the advent of Christ. "The prophesy," he writes, "meant that God was to come to a deserted place, inaccessible from the beginning. None of the pagans had any knowledge of God, since his holy servants and prophets were kept from approaching them." I think this also applies to us in a most profound way. All too often, we allow our hearts to become hardened from unrepented sin; our souls become dry and arid from a lack of prayer and fasting, a barren desert devoid of life of God, who wishes to dwell within us. But God cannot dwell within us because we have refused to allow Him to do so. This is where Christ comes to us. He doesn't stand from afar saying "come to me." Rather, he comes to the desert of the world by becoming man, and to the desert of our heart by his Holy Spirit.

The question I pose is this: will you allow Him to come into your heart?

#### Pope Francis: Through the paradox of the cross, Jesus 'embraced our death' Read more on: www.catholicnewsagency.com/news

On the Solemnity of Christ the King, Pope Francis said Jesus, through his death on the cross, opened his arms to embrace all people and everything about them, including their death, pain, and weakness.

"Only by entering into [Christ's] embrace do we come to realize that God went to this extreme, even to the paradox of the cross, in order to embrace everything about us, even what was furthest from him: our death — he embraced our death — our pain, our poverty, our weakness, and our frailties. He embraced all of that," the pope said Nov. 20 in the Asti Cathedral in northern Italy.

Pope Francis visited the Italian province of Asti, 30 miles east of Turin, Nov. 19-20. The pope's father, Mario José Bergoglio, lived in the Diocese of Asti before migrating to Argentina in 1929. Pope Francis' maternal grandparents also immigrated to Argentina

In his homily for the final Sunday of the liturgical year, Pope Francis said he wanted, in the land of his own roots, to reflect on "the roots of our faith."

"Those roots are planted in the barren soil of Calvary, where Jesus, like the seed that falls to the earth and dies, made hope spring up," he said.

Pope Francis encouraged Catholics to ask themselves: "Is this king of the universe also the king of my life? Do I believe him? How can I celebrate him as the Lord of all creation, unless he also becomes the Lord of my life?"

Today, Jesus our king looks at us from the cross, the pope said. "It is up to us to choose whether we will be onlookers or involved."

"Am I a spectator or do I want to be involved?" he said. "We see the crises of the present time, the decline of faith, the lack of participation ... What are we to do? Are we content to theorize and criticize, or do we roll up our sleeves, take life in hand, and pass from the 'if' of excuses to the 'yes' of prayer and service?"

The pope said: "All of us think we know what is wrong with society, all of us; we talk every day about what is wrong with the world, and even with the Church — many things are wrong with the Church. But then what do we do? Do we soil our hands like our God, nailed to the cross? Or do we stand with hands in our pockets, as mere onlookers?"
