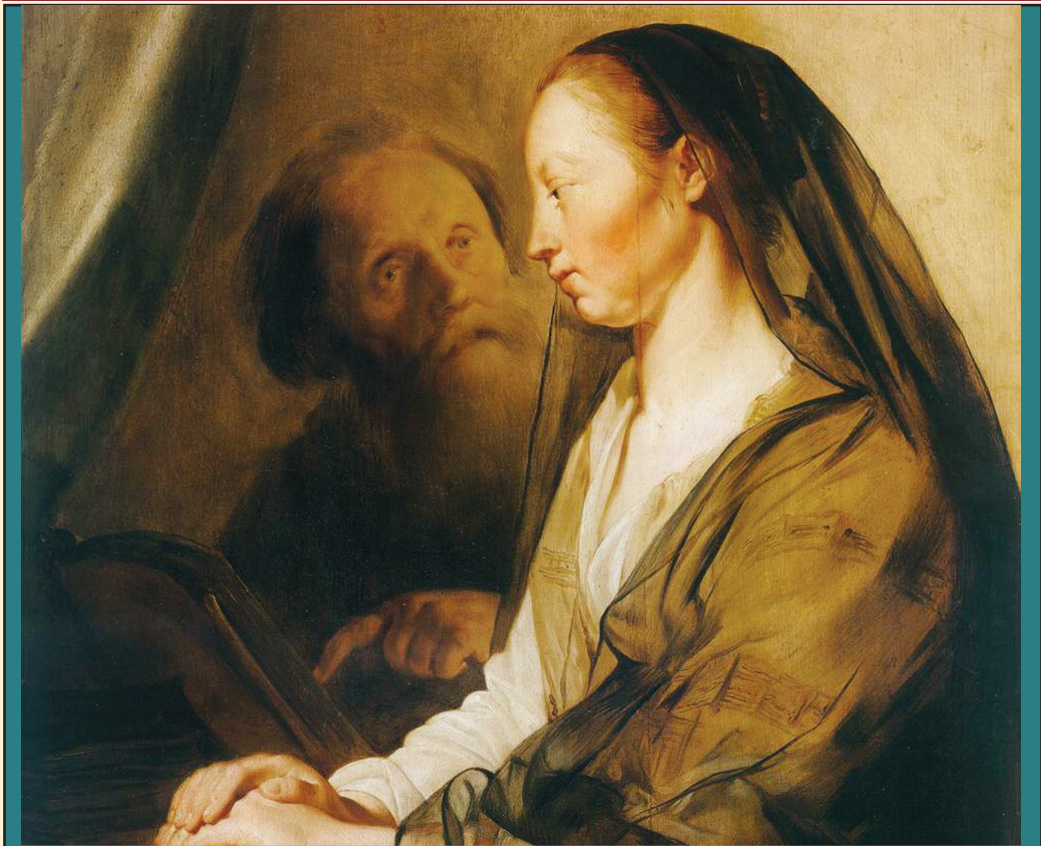

Video overview: One of the lessons Jesus wants us to learn is the importance of persistence in prayer. In today's Gospel reading we encounter a passage commonly known as "the parable of the unjust judge." This isn't a parable about justice or judges. Rather it is another teaching about persistence and prayer. In this story, the widow keeps coming back to the judge. Finally, because of her persistence, the judge grants her justice. Jesus isn't telling us that we must nag God before he will answer. Rather he is saying that we must be willing to keep asking, even when it seems like the answer is delayed. He is giving us a lesson in the importance of persistence. True, heartfelt prayer isn't easy. We are created for prayer-communication with God-but because of our fallen human nature, we would often rather do other, easier things. As we look to the Gospels, especially the Gospel of Luke, which shows our Lord at prayer more than any other, we can learn how to pray. One simple acronym that may be of use is "MATA": Mercy, Asking, Thanksgiving, Adoration. First, we need to confess our sins: ask for God's mercy. Then we make our requests; ask God for what we need. The parable in the Gospel reading addresses this, telling us that we are not to ask just once or twice, but to be persistent, humbly turning to God with all our needs. After asking, we must not forget to say thank you. Finally comes the most important part—adoration, praising God. The Gospel passage tells us that we need to be both persistent and consistent in our prayer—not because God won't hear us unless we are, but because through our persistence and consistency we are better able to be faithful to the promptings of the Spirit and enter into communion with the one who loves us.

Featured study: Prayer: a surge of the heart

Reflection: The need to pray is always linked to Jesus' description of the events leading up to "when the Son of Man comes," or end of time when Christ will come again. Understanding the context of this passage helps us to see that constancy in prayer isn't simply a requirement so that the petitioner will get what he or she wants. Rather, constant prayer ensures that we'll be on the side of God's justice when he comes because our prayer is a demonstration of faith. It takes faith to pray, and faith is the means to our justification, holiness, and righteousness in the sight of God. In order for Jesus to find justice, righteousness, or holiness when he comes again as judge of the living and the dead, believers must be steadfast in prayer. So, Jesus isn't so much suggesting that we nag God until we get what we want, as is sometimes thought, but that we pray often, indeed constantly, so that we'll be the holy, faith-filled people he longs to find upon his return. Otherwise, his justice can only work to our disadvantage. What's just for the sinner and just for the righteous are two very different things, and it's prayer in faith that makes the difference.

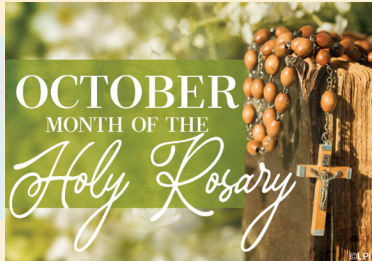

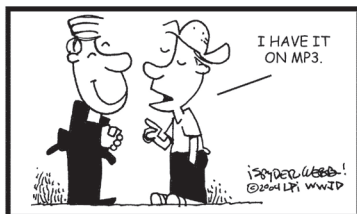

Baptisms:

English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held online.

Bautizos:

Bautizos en Español son cada 3er Sábado del mes a las 9:30 am. Clases pre-bautismales son el Domingo anterior al bautizo de las 9am-1pm.

Marriage:

As a minimum requirement, couples must contact the parish office and set an appointment at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Marriage preparation classes online.

Matrimonio:

First Eucharist:

A two year family formation program preparation is required. Children must be a minimum of 6 years old. Classes run from September-May and registrations are open June-August.

Vatican's Synod on Synodality organizers say synod is 'fruit' of Second Vatican Council

In a message marking the 60th anniversary of the opening of Vatican II, the organizers of the Synod on Synodality called the Synod of Bishops a "fruit" of the council. Quoting Pope Francis, the synod's general secretariat on Monday said the synod was "indeed one of [the Council's] most precious legacies."

"The purpose of the synod was and remains to prolong, in the life and mission of the Church, the spirit of the Second Vatican Council," the message said.

"The concept of 'synodality' is found throughout the council, even though this term (only recently coined) is not found expressly in the documents of the ecumenical assembly."

In March 2018, the Congregation for the Doctrine of Faith's International Theological Commission produced a document on the theological roots of synodality in the Church: "Synodality in the Life and Mission of the Church."

The CDF document noted that in the history of the Church, synods and councils were nearly interchangeable terms for formal ecclesiastical assemblies.

Speaking of the Church as "synodal" by its nature is something novel, the commission said, and required "careful theological clarification."

The Vatican's message on Monday said the "synodal process currently underway is also within the Council's wake."

In October 2021, the Catholic Church began the first phase of a global two-year synodal process that will culminate in a meeting of the Synod of Bishops in Rome in 2023.

Cardinal Mario Grech, the secretary general of the Synod of Bishops, is the meeting's chief organizer.

The Maltese cardinal said the question that the Synod on Synodality was trying to answer is "what is the type of Church that the Holy Spirit is enlightening us to have for today?"

The Oct. 10 message concluded with the words of Pope Benedict XVI that the "synodal dimension is constitutive of the Church: it consists of a coming together of every people and culture in order that they become one in Christ and walk together, following him, who said: 'I am the way, and the truth, and the life.'"

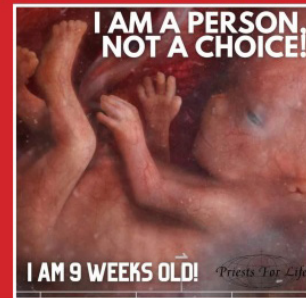

My Webster's dictionary defines the word "mass" as "a quantity of matter usually of considerable size." My American Heritage dictionary describes the same word as "a unified body of matter with no specific shape."

On the other hand, Webster defines "**Mass**" as "the liturgy of the Eucharist," and American Heritage defines "**Mass**" as "in Roman Catholic and some Protestant churches, the celebration of the Eucharist."

Despite the distinction made in both dictionaries, secular publications, almost invariably, write "mass" when "Mass" is intended and Catholic publications, quite often do the same.
