Video overview: We've all heard the saying "Have an attitude of gratitude." For Christians, this is more than a greeting card saying; it is a basic command of Christian life. The theme of gratitude underlies this week's Gospel reading that tells of ten lepers who were healed by Jesus. In the reading, ten lepers earnestly long for healing since leprosy was one of the great curses of their time, causing those who suffered from the disease to live apart from family and friends. All ten turned to Jesus in faith with their request. However, after they are healed, only one of the ten returns to thank him for answering their prayer. While Jesus makes it clear that it was the man's faith that healed him, the story has another lesson as well. Although we must begin our prayer requests in faith, they should end in gratitude. All too often, we are quick to make requests, but slow to return in thankful prayer. Like the nine lepers who did not come back, we neglect to express our thanks to God when our prayers are answered. However, thankfulness is a hallmark of a true disciple. As 1 Thessalonians 5:18 says, "In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus." Meister Eckhart, a medieval mystic, once said, "If the only prayer you ever say in your entire life is thank you, it will be enough." How often do you remember to say "thank you" to God?

Featured study: The Aim of Life is appreciation by Fr. Joseph Fessio

Reflection: It's important to note that this episode is set on the border between Galilee and Samaria, both of which were avoided by pious Jews. The fact that Jesus is skirting Samaria may indicate that his destination, Jerusalem, makes him unwelcome even by the outsiders in Samaria. So, the location itself suggests that Jesus is addressing the needs of covenant outsiders and as an outsider himself. The "distance" between Jesus and the lepers is, like the setting of the story, more than a simple question of geography. Leprosy didn't simply impose a physical distance upon its victims but a religious one as well. Leprosy left one unable to participate in Jewish ritual practices and was considered symbolic of the ravages of sin. Jesus invites the ten lepers back into the covenant family of Israel and in so doing, was invoking Levitical Law which required that someone cured of leprosy present himself to the priest for examination. The one leper who returned to thank Jesus was a Samaritan—the outcast among the leprous outcasts. He receives the faith that brings him into communion with Jesus and the new covenant community. Jesus declares to him, "your faith has been your salvation." Ironically, it's the ultimate outsider who's received by Jesus into the kingdom.

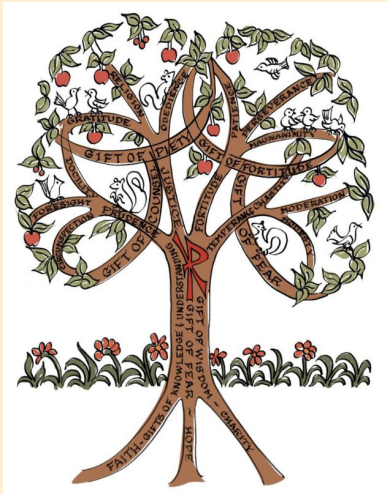

Youth & Young Adults Corner

Happy Sunday, Youth and Young Adults of SJV!

Did you know that you are a priest? That's right! Not the same as Fr. Gio, who has a sacramental priesthood, but a very real priest nonetheless! When you were baptized, you were baptized into the Body of Christ in the same offices He occupies of Priest, Prophet, and King. But how are we to exercise this priesthood? Well, a priest is one who offers sacrifice. Jesus offered Himself on the cross; Fr. Gio offers the Body and Blood of Christ in the Holy Eucharist in persona Christi. So what is the sacrifice we offer? Our sacrifices are those of our everyday crosses that we have to carry: the hardships we endure, the persecutions we experience, the temptations we face, even our failures, and we offer them up to God during mass. "My sacrifice," says Psalm 51, "is a contrite spirit; a contrite, humbled heart, O God, you will not scorn." We bring all of this to the altar, and when Fr Gio, acting in the person of Christ, lifts up that consecrated host that has become the Body and Blood of Christ, we spiritually place all our sacrifices on that host, and we give it to God the Father in Jesus Christ. This, my brothers and sisters, is true participation in the mass. It is not singing the loudest, reading the best, or distributing the host most often; it is participating in the mass proper to our role in the Body of Christ – as baptismal priests. Through this, we are sanctified. Through this, we may sanctify the world.

St. John Vianney, St. John Paul II, St. Joseph, and Mary, Seat of Wisdom, pray for us.

Baptisms:

English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held online.

Bautizos:

Bautizos en Español son cada 3er Sábado del mes a las 9:30 am. Clases pre-bautismales son el Domingo anterior al bautizo de las 9am-1pm.

Marriage:

As a minimum requirement, couples must contact the parish office and set an appointment at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Marriage preparation classes online.

Matrimonio:

Se requiere que las parejas contacten a la oficina parroquial cuando menos seis meses antes de la fecha de matrimonio. Clases prematrimoniales son en persona.

First Eucharist:

A two year family formation program preparation is required. Children must be a minimum of 6 years old. Classes run from September-May and registrations are open June-August.

Primer Comunión:

Programa de dos años en el programa de formación familiar es requerido. Los niños deben tener 6 años cumplidos o más. Inscripciones son Junio-Agosto y las clases son Septiembre-Mayo.

Youth Confirmation:

Candidates for Confirmation must be at least 12 years old and in 7th grade to start the program. A two-year religious education preparation is required prior to receiving the Sacrament.

Catholics in Poland and around the world pray Divine Mercy Chaplet to end war

On Wednesday, Catholics recited the Divine Mercy Chaplet in the streets of 173 cities in Poland and 44 localities worldwide, according to organizers of the prayer event.

At 3 p.m. local time, street intersections and public squares in towns and villages throughout Poland turned into places of prayer for peace and for those affected by war.

With rosaries in hand, the faithful asked God for mercy for all humanity. "We believe that 10 minutes of supplication to God can change our families, cities, and the whole world," the organizers said.

The event was held under the auspices of the Polish community Spark of Divine Mercy Team.

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy was recited on six continents for families, priests, and those holding any power in the world.

The faithful prayed for peace, especially in Ukraine. They prayed for refugees fleeing war, that they may return to their countries — and that people may be found to help them rebuild their war-damaged homes.

On official count, 173 towns and cities in Poland joined in praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet.

People prayed in the Presidential Palace in Warsaw and the largest Polish cities: Gdańsk, Poznań, Katowice, and Lublin. Organizers said that prayer events were also held on the streets of Papua New Guinea, Croatia, Argentina, Mexico, the United States, and the Ivory Coast.

The chaplet event, including the prayer on the streets of several cities, was held for the first time on Sept. 28, 2008, in Łódź.

Since then, the initiative has continued to take place every year on the anniversary of the beatification of Blessed Father Michael Sopoćko, confessor of St. Faustina Kowalska (1905-1938).

The consecration and entrustment of the world to the Divine Mercy represented the fulfillment of a mission for the poor, young Polish nun.

She experienced visions of Jesus in which he asked her to make his message of infinite love and mercy known to the world.

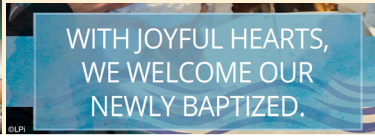

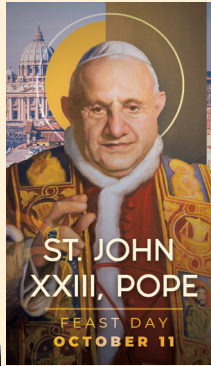

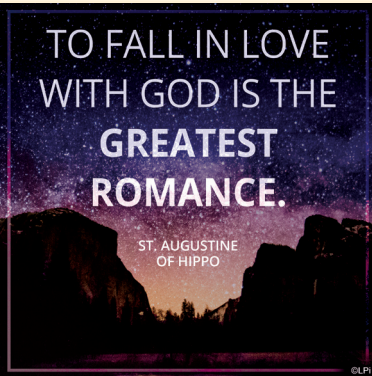
