Video overview: Today we celebrate the greatest of all Christian feasts: Easter Sunday. We come together rejoicing in the goodness of God, knowing that Christ's resurrection from the dead gives us the hope that we too will rise someday with him. And yet, this one Sunday of the year should not be our only day of rejoicing in our risen Lord. We take on the identity of an "Easter people" because we believe that each Sunday echoes the greatest of all Christian feasts. Each Sunday we celebrate "mini-Easters," remembering in a special way the day the Lord rose so that we might have life. Just like the early Christians, we have the hope that the God who made us is waiting to remake us through the incredible transforming love of Jesus. This love, which culminated in his Passion and Resurrection, can and should convert our hearts to joyful praise. Just as Mary Magdalene's heart changed from sorrow to joy when she encountered her risen Lord, so are we called to enter into that same joyful spirit as we approach Christ risen this Easter— the spirit of a new creation.

Featured study: The Augustine Institute show with Dr. Tim Gray 4/6/21 Fr. Brian Larkin

Reflection: John dutifully waits for Peter to arrive before he goes into the tomb. The next bit is a little confusing. We're told that both saw the wrappings that had covered Jesus and that "the disciple," that is, John, "saw and believed." Why does the text say that John "saw and believed," and then, "For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead"? What did John see in that tomb that caused him to believe, even though he was unaware that the Scriptures had foretold the bodily resurrection of the Messiah? Italian priest Don Antonio Persili, by his precise rendering of the Greek, suggests burial cloths that appear as though the body formerly covered by them had disappeared from within them—without disturbing them! Persili's translation answers two questions. First, why the text suggests that there's something odd about the fact that John believed without the prompting of scriptural support. Second, why what John saw prompted him to believe that Jesus had risen rather than simply having been removed from the tomb by someone else. The evidence at the tomb suggested to him that only by a mysterious act of power could Jesus have left the tomb.



From the Pastor

The Paschal Candle

The Paschal candle represents Christ, the Light of the World.

The pure beeswax of which the candle is made represents the sinless Christ who was formed in the womb of His Mother. The wick signifies His humanity, the flame, His Divine Nature, both soul and body.

Five grains of incense inserted into the candle in the form of a cross recall the aromatic spices with which His Sacred Body was prepared for the tomb, and of the five wounds in His hands, feet, and side.

During the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night the priest or deacon carries the candle in procession into the dark church. A new fire, symbolizing our eternal life in Christ, is kindled which lights the candle. The candle, representing Christ himself, is blessed by the priest who then inscribes in it a cross, the first letters and last of the Greek alphabet, (Alpha and Omega 'the beginning and the end') and the current year, as he chants the prayer; then affixes the five grains of incense.

The Easter candle is lighted each day during Mass throughout the Paschal season until Ascension Thursday.

Holy Saturday Prayer

O God, Creator of heaven and earth:

Grant that, as the crucified body of your dear Son was laid in the tomb and rested on this holy Sabbath, so we may await with him the coming of the third day, and rise with him to newness of life; who now lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

Where all the love abides.

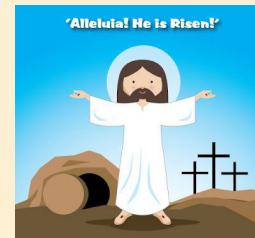

Baptisms:

English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held online.

Bautizos:

Bautizos en Español son cada 3er Sábado del mes a las 9:30 am. Clases pre-bautismales son el Domingo anterior al bautizo de las 9am-1pm.

Marriage:

As a minimum requirement, couples must contact the parish office and set an appointment at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Marriage preparation classes online.

Matrimonio:

Se requiere que las parejas contacten a la oficina parroquial cuando menos seis meses antes de la fecha de matrimonio. Clases prematrimoniales son en persona.

First Eucharist:

A two year family formation program preparation is required. Children must be a minimum of 6 years old. Classes run from September-May and registrations are open June-August.

Primer Comunión:

Programa de dos años en el programa de formación familiar es requerido. Los niños deben tener 6 años cumplidos o más. Inscripciones son Junio-Agosto y las clases son Septiembre-Mayo.

Youth Confirmation:

Candidates for Confirmation must be at least 12 years old and in 7th grade to start the program. A two-year religious education preparation is required prior to receiving the Sacrament.

“ALIVE: WHO IS THERE?”

NEW EUCHARISTIC MOVIE HITS U.S. THEATERS FOR ONE DAY ONLY - MONDAY, APRIL 25!

A new documentary highlighting the transformative power of the Holy Eucharist will be debuting for one day only in more than 700 theaters across the United States on **Monday, April 25.**

Directed and produced by Spanish filmmakers, the Bosco Films and Hakuna Films documentary “ALIVE: Who is there?” features the testimonies of five men and women who share how the true presence of Jesus in the Eucharist has transformed their lives.

“This is not just a movie, but an opportunity for a movement toward greater eucharistic devotion and something that can help create a spark of revival in the United States,” founder of Bosco Films, Lucía González-Barandiarán, said in a press release.

Tickets for the 90-minute-long, Spanish-language documentary, which is subtitled in English, can be bought through the movie’s content distributor in the United State’s, **Fathom Events**, the same company that brought the Christian video series “The Chosen” to theaters for its Christmas special. 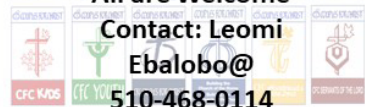
