**Video overview:** The Gospel of John tells of a woman who was caught—caught not just in the sin of adultery, but even more so, caught in God's mercy and love. The account provides a striking example of Jesus' mercy and at the same time, his call to conversion. His encounter with the woman caught in adultery does not end in condemnation, but rather forgiveness, healing, and new life. The twentieth century Polish mystic, St. Faustina Kowalska, was told by Christ that mercy is the greatest attribute of God. That says a lot when you consider that God is all-powerful, all-knowing, and omnipresent. God's mercy, as revealed in Jesus Christ, is of tremendous value to us because even when we have turned away from him in sin and turned our hearts against him, Jesus is always there, ready to extend mercy and forgiveness. As we enter into the final days of Lent, the message of today's Gospel reading affords us one of the most intimate and telling pictures of Jesus as our Messiah, a Messiah who comes, not to judge us in our sinfulness, but to help us rise above our own natures and enter into a healing and restorative relationship of love.

Featured study: Could God ever love someone like me? Fr Mike Schmitz

**Reflection:** The theme of the merciful love of Christ is the key point to the story, but the scribes and Pharisees intended to trap Jesus. The Pharisees brought the adulteress to Christ and asked what he thought about Moses' command that such women be stoned. If Jesus says she shouldn't be stoned, then he's guilty of breaking the Torah. And the Jews were prohibited by Roman law from enforcing the death penalty on criminals. So the insidious trap gives Jesus two choices, stone the woman and be guilty under Roman law, or release her and break the Mosaic Law. The trap seems flawless. But Jesus says, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Many of the Pharisees saw themselves as sinless. If they refused to stone the woman, they'd be refusing to obey the Torah. When the Pharisees left, the rest of the crowd followed with the sense that the Pharisees were not quite as pure under the Law as they had thought. Not only does Jesus show mercy to the woman caught in adultery and escape a deadly trap, he springs it on his enemies to reveal their hypocrisy.

#### The Significance of Holy Thursday

On Holy Thursday, the Catholic Church celebrates a special Mass of the Lord's Supper – that commemorates the institution of the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper. On the night before Jesus Christ was crucified, he changed the bread and wine into his own Body and Blood, and he commanded the Apostles – and their successors through the centuries – to act in his stead and represent this sacrifice. So at every Mass, by way of transubstantiation, the bread and wine offered by the priest becomes Christ's Body and Blood again.

Just as Christ did for his 12 Apostles at the Last Supper and as he commanded them to do likewise, during the Mass of the Lord's Supper, the priest – who represents Christ – ceremoniously washes the feet of 12 people in the congregation.

This Mass stresses the importance Jesus puts on the humility of service, and the need for cleansing with water, a symbol of baptism.

At the conclusion of the Mass, the faithful are invited to continue Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament throughout the night, just as the disciples were invited to stay up with the Lord during His agony in the garden before His betrayal by Judas.

After Holy Thursday, no Mass will be celebrated again in the Church until the Easter Vigil celebrates and proclaims the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ.

During the Lenten season, SJV School encourages students and families to serve their families, school, and greater community. We invite you to join us! On Monday, call an extended family member whom you haven't spoken to in a while. Tuesday, write a letter or make a card for someone in the armed forces. Wednesday, pick a neighborhood spot where you can pick up trash for ten minutes. Thursday, buy someone in need something to eat. These small acts of service create an extraordinary amount of love, so let's spread that SJV love together during the remainder of Lent.

## **Youth & Young Adults Corner**

Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days. In Jesus' time, four days meant the decaying process had begun. In this way, saying he was in the tomb four days communicated decisively that Lazarus died. The Church Fathers taught that the four days also represented the four stages of spiritual death: original sin, violation of the natural law, violation of the law of Moses, and refusing the gospel of grace given by Jesus. Thus, raising Lazarus was symbolic of how Jesus was going to raise a fully rebellious mankind.

We also read that "Jesus wept." This simple verse shows how suffering and death are not punishments from God; rather, they are the symptoms of the disease of sin, which at its root is pride and choosing to love the world more than God. In other words, suffering and death are ultimately self-inflicted. Jesus is looking upon His creation, seeing what we are doing to ourselves, and revealing the sadness this brings God's heart. We are all fallen, broken, and in need of raising by Jesus. A common cliché says "God loves you just the way you are." This is a half truth, friends. Yes, He loves you just the way you are, but He also loves you too much to leave you that way. Invite the risen Jesus into your hearts and let Him raise you to new life.

## POPE FRANCIS: MY GRANDFATHER TAUGHT ME TO LOATHE WAR

Pope Francis recalled at his Wednesday general audience how his veteran grandfather taught him to loathe war.

Speaking in the Vatican's Paul VI audience hall on March 23, the pope offered a "personal testimony" to the power of hearing an elderly person tell their life story.

He said that he heard about the horrors of the First World War directly from his grandfather, Giovanni Bergoglio, a radio operator caught up in fighting at the Piave River in northern Italy.

"I learned hatred and anger for war from my grandfather, who fought at the Piave in 1914, and he passed on to me this rage at war, because he told me about the suffering of a war," the pope said.

"And this isn't learned in books or in other ways... it's learned in this way, being passed down from grandparents to grandchildren. And this is irreplaceable."

"Today, unfortunately, this is not the case, and we think that grandparents are discarded material: No! They are the living memory of a people, and young people and children ought to listen to their grandparents."


