Video overview: In today's Gospel, we see Jesus's reaction to the news that his cousin John has been arrested: he goes into seclusion back at home in Galilee, maybe for one last visit home with Mary; and then begins gathering the band of followers who will become his apostles. In Israel at this time, students sought out their teachers, but Jesus reverses that. He calls first Peter and Andrew, and then James and John, saying "Come, follow me." Apparently, his words strike some deep chord, because these rough, work-hardened fishermen put down their nets and immediately go with Jesus. James and John apparently even got out of the boat they were in, leaving their father behind! These men responded to Jesus's call without hesitation, and their lives, and the history of the world, were changed because of that. Jesus also calls each one of us. Just as he did on the shore of the Sea of Galilee, he meets us where we are and extends the invitation to follow him. We might think that we don't have the necessary gifts or talents to do great things for the kingdom, but who would have thought that ordinary fishermen would become the greatest fishers of men? When we say "yes" to Jesus, when we are willing to drop our nets and turn our lives over to him, he can use us in ways we can't even imagine. However, we have to be willing to put aside what we think we can do in order to do what God truly wants us to do just like the fishermen Peter, Andrew, James, and John.

Featured study: Episode 3: Come, Follow Behind Me

Reflection: Our reading begins with the account of what happened after the arrest of John the Baptist. With the decline of John, Jesus's rise will begin. Next, we see Jesus calling his first disciples, who come immediately from their work and abandon everything to answer his summons. Jesus begins in Galilee, called Galilee of the Gentiles in Matthew's version of Isaiah 9:1. That Jesus should begin a "reconquest" of Israel in the same area where Assyria had begun its conquest of the northern kingdom 750 years earlier is significant—particularly since the ten northern tribes had ceased to exist for all practical purposes. This is just the first of many signals in Matthew's Gospel that Jesus has come to reconstitute Israel. His choice of twelve apostles, who he says will judge the twelve tribes of Israel, is the clearest indication of this (Matthew 19:28). The journey from Galilee to Jerusalem will have its counterpart in the life of the Church when the disciples are told to return to Galilee from Jerusalem after the Resurrection for a meeting with the risen Lord and as a prelude to their own ministry of proclaiming the Gospel. Matthew's Gospel describes a circuit which is closed at its end but opens onto the future of the Church as well.

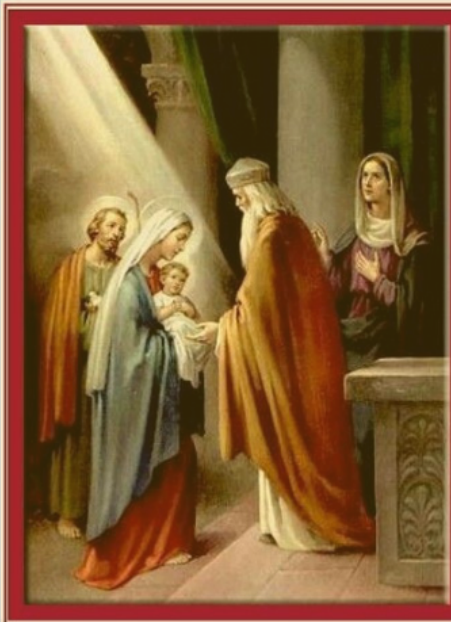

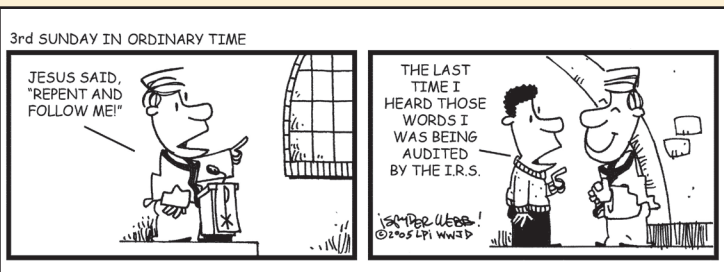

Anointing of the Sick:

By appointment.

Unción de los Enfermos:

Baptisms:

English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held online.

Bautizos:

Bautizos en Español son cada 3er Sábado del mes a las 9:30 am. Clases pre-bautismales son el Domingo anterior al bautizo de las 9am-1pm.

Marriage:

As a minimum requirement, couples must contact the parish office and set an appointment at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Marriage preparation classes online.

Matrimonio:

Se requiere que las parejas contacten a la oficina parroquial cuando menos seis meses antes de la fecha de matrimonio. Clases prematrimoniales son en persona.

First Eucharist:

A two year family formation program preparation is required. Children must be a minimum of 6 years old. Classes run from September-May and registrations are open June-August.

Primera Comunión:

Programa de dos años en el programa de formación familiar es requerido. Los niños deben tener 6 años cumplidos o más. Inscripciones son Junio-Agosto y las clases son Septiembre-Mayo.

Youth Confirmation:

Candidates for Confirmation must be at least 12 years old and in 7th grade to start the program. A two-year religious education preparation is required prior to receiving the Sacrament.

RCIA and Adult Sacramental:

Vatican News

'Pope urges faithful to journey together in compassion with the sick'

As the Church journeys along the synodal path, Pope Francis is inviting the faithful to reflect on the fact that "it is especially through the experience of vulnerability and illness that we can learn to walk together according to the style of God, which is closeness, compassion, and tenderness". He makes the call in his Message for the 31st World Day of the Sick, which was released on Tuesday.

The Catholic Church marks the annual day on 11 February, the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. The theme of this year's observance is "Take care of him: Compassion as a synodal exercise of healing", drawn from the Gospel of Luke on the Parable of the Good Samaritan.

In his message, Pope Francis highlights compassion and care for the sick "as a synodal exercise of healing", to which God calls us, noting that if illness is part of our human condition, when "experienced in isolation and abandonment, unaccompanied by care and compassion, it can become inhumane".

"Experiences of bewilderment, sickness, and weakness are part of the human journey. Far from excluding us from God's people, they bring us to the center of the Lord's attention, for He is our Father and does not want to lose even one of his children along the way." The "condition of loneliness and abandonment" of the man beaten and robbed by bandits in the Parable of the Good Samaritan, is the same experienced today by "too many of our brothers and sisters" who "are left at a time when they most need help", the Pope writes.

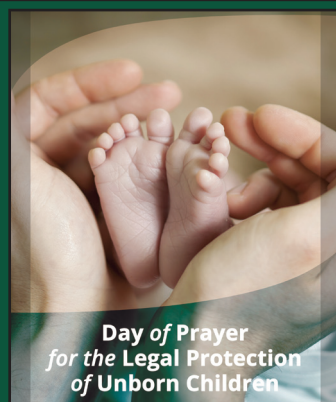
