Video overview: When Joseph and Mary came to the Temple forty days after Jesus was born in order to fulfill the ritual of the presentation of the firstborn, Mary was adjusting to life with a new baby and a husband. She probably wasn't thinking about all the struggles and hard times that would lie ahead for her baby boy. At least not until Simeon comes up to her and tells her that her son is destined for the fall and rise of many and that a sword will pierce her own heart, causing profound suffering. At that moment Mary might have begun to wonder just what she had agreed to when she had said "yes" to the angel's request a little less than a year before. As Simeon, and later Anna, spoke to her, Mary must have begun to realize that, as Venerable Fulton Sheen put it, "from that moment on, every time she would lift infant hands, she would see fall across them the shadow of nails." In her role as Jesus' first and most perfect disciple, Mary shows us that suffering lies at the heart of being a Christian. Almost from the moment of his birth, she was aware of his ultimate destiny. She was willing to follow her son to the cross. Are we willing to follow him to our own Calvary?

Featured study: "Jesus' Death in Light of Old Testament Sacrifices" and "Was Jesus' Sacrifice Enough?" by Karlos Broussard

Reflection: Luke paints a remarkable scene for us. A soft footfall on the pavement of the Temple interrupts the cacophony of official and private prayers, said or sung in Hebrew, as a couple approaches the small altar where the offerings of the poor are made. Then the Passover of the firstborn of Israel during the tenth plague of Egypt is recalled by an offering of the first fruits of the womb. But unlike all the other ransomings of the firstborn of Israel in this Temple, which have been symbols or recollections of the older Passover or ransoming, this offering and ransom is the event of which all the others were merely prophecies. All the offerings made on sand-scoured desert altars or barren heights, all the offerings made in the echoing chambers of this Temple-through thousands of years-point only to this offering, which passes through the hands of a poor provincial girl. Perhaps she knows that her offering is really his offering and that its fulfillment is yet to come. In this first representation of the new and eternal sacrifice, which will be offered until the end of time in the Mass, the Liturgy of the Word is proclaimed by Anna, and by Simeon in his hymn of answered faith and hope fulfilled; and then a Jewish priest, whose name is entirely lost to us, but whose very anonymity is itself a type for all the Christian priests to come, becomes the first to hold the Christ on an altar before the faithful who await the redemption of Jerusalem, as we do today at our Mass. And in that moment, we see that the One that Mary and Joseph ransom for a pair of birds, has, in fact, ransomed us all.

Baptisms:

English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held online.

Bautizos:

Bautizos en Español son cada 3er Sábado del mes a las 9:30 am. Clases pre-bautismales son el Domingo anterior al bautizo de las 9am-1pm.

Marriage:

As a minimum requirement, couples must contact the parish office and set an appointment at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Marriage preparation classes online.

Matrimonio:

Se requiere que las parejas contacten a la oficina parroquial cuando menos seis meses antes de la fecha de matrimonio. Clases prematrimoniales son en persona.

First Eucharist:

A two year family formation program preparation is required. Children must be a minimum of 6 years old. Classes run from September-May and registrations are open June-August.

Youth Confirmation:

Candidates for Confirmation must be at least 12 years old and in 7th grade to start the program. A two-year religious education preparation is required prior to receiving the Sacrament.

Vatican News

'Pope at Angelus: Be free from attachments, make way for the Lord'

In his customary address before leading the Sunday Angelus prayer in Saint Peter's Square, Pope Francis spoke about the witness of John the Baptist we hear in today's Gospel where after baptizing Jesus he says "After me comes a man who ranks before me, for he was before me." These words reflect John's spirit of service, the Pope observed, as John has prepared the way for the Messiah and is now ready to step aside.

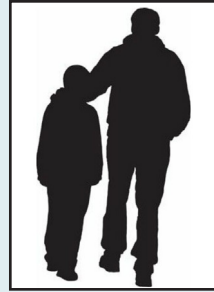
One might think that John the Baptist would have been given a "prize," or prominent place in Jesus' public ministry, the Pope said, but instead John knew he had accomplished his mission and, having seen the Spirit descend upon Jesus, he indicates him as "the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world." John has preached to the people, gathered and trained disciples, but he has not bound himself to anyone, "the sign of a true educator," the Pope went on to say, as he has done his job, and is not interested in holding on to a following or being praised for his success. John "bears witness and then steps back, so that many may have the joy of meeting Jesus."

John's spirit of service and the ability to step aside, mission accomplished, shows the importance of the need to be free from attachments, the Pope explained, as it is easy to become "attached" to our positions in life, and the need to be esteemed and rewarded.....The Pope said, like John, we can cultivate the virtue of stepping aside at the right time and so bear witness that Jesus is the point of reference in our lives.

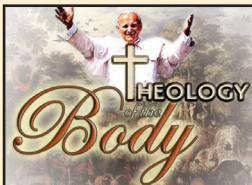
