

Video overview: Today's readings are the midway point in our Lenten journey, about the great Exodus of the Jewish people out of Egypt. For many of us, we see Moses parting the Red Sea, the burning bush, or the famous cry, "Let my people go!" Particularly in this week's second reading, St. Paul gives us a crash course on what the Exodus story has to do with Christians. He says that all of the generation that was released from slavery in Egypt saw the amazing works of God. Unfortunately, most of them fell away from their faith. Perhaps we've heard the saying "to whom much is given, much is required." The Exodus generation was given many gifts, which made the consequences all the more dire when they fell into great sin. Like that generation, we, as Christians, have been given a lot: the Church, the Sacraments, and the Holy Scriptures. Paul is warning us that we must not presume that because we have these gifts we're home free. We must be on guard against desiring evil things lest we fall like the Israelites in the desert did.

Featured study: Daily reflections June 21, 2021

Reflection: We all have a tendency to see the faults of others and sometimes secretly relish their misfortunes. However, reform is the first imperative of the Gospel. Without the daily consideration of our failings, we can easily lose our compassion for others. In our second reading, Paul was speaking to Greeks about the failures of the Jews, and in our Gospel reading, Jesus is speaking to the Jews who believed that the sufferings of the Galileans were somehow deserved. Jesus warns the Jews to beware of judging others. The fig tree was a symbol for Israel, and so Jesus tells a story of the owner of a fig tree who found no fruit on it for three years. It's likely no accident that Jesus' ministry lasted for three years and that he found little fruit among his own Jewish people. His warning to Israel is that it must reform in the coming season or be cut down. The Church always hears the warnings Jesus delivered to the Jews as being delivered to herself. As the new Israel, we're always in need of reform.

An Introduction to the Holy Week

What is it and how is it celebrated?

It is the reenacting, reliving and participation in the Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Dates:

Holy Week is the last week of Lent.

Colors:

In most churches, the decorations are red to symbolize the blood of martyrdom. Some churches remove all decorations on Good Friday, veiling anything that can't be removed in black or purple. Holy water is also removed from the fonts in churches on Good Friday and Holy Saturday in preparation for the blessing of the water at the Easter Vigil. This removal also corresponds to those days on which the Eucharist is not celebrated.

Palm Sunday (or Passion Sunday)
Holy Thursday (or Maundy Thursday)
Good Friday
Holy Saturday
The time from sundown on Holy Thursday to

The time from sundown on Holy Thursday to sundown on Easter Day is also known as the Triduum, which is Latin for "three days."

I know many of you are going through difficult times, and as a result, you might be questioning your faith but perhaps you are afraid to ask or you have no one to ask. There are two things I'd like to say: First, Praise God, for that shows you are open to seeking the truth! After all, we question those things which we take seriously and view as important. Second, you are not alone. I have been there, and many others are there too.

If you are in Middle School or High School, I invite you to join our Youth Ministry every Wednesday at 6:30p in the Unity Room. If you are a young adult (18-39yrs), I invite you to join the Young Adults Ministry every 4th Thursday for Adoration and "Fire Pit Fellowship," where we have food and fellowship over a nice warm fire.

Annointing of the Sick

By appointment.

Baptisms:

English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held online.

Bautizos:

Bautizos en Español son cada 3er Sábado del mes a las 9:30 am. Clases pre-bautismales son el Domingo anterior al bautizo de las 9am-1pm.

Marriage:

As a minimum requirement, couples must contact the parish office and set an appointment at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Marriage preparation classes online.

Matrimonio:

Se requiere que las parejas contacten a la oficina parroquial cuando menos seis meses antes de la fecha de matrimonio. Clases prematrimoniales son en persona.

First Eucharist:

A two year family formation program preparation is required. Children must be a minimum of 6 years old. Classes run from September-May and registrations are open June-August.

Primer Comunion:

Programa de dos años en el programa de formación familiar es requerido. Los niños deben de tener 6 años cumplidos o más. Inscripciones son Junio-Agosto y las clases son Septiembre-Mayo.

Youth Confirmation:

Candidates for Confirmation must be at least 12 years old and in 7th grade to start the program. A two-year religious education preparation is required prior to receiving the Sacrament.

Confirmación para Jóvenes:

Candidatos para Confirmación deben de tener los 12 años cumplidos y cursar el séptimo grado. El programa es de dos años de educación religiosa antes de recibir el Sacramento.

RCIA and Adult Sacramental:

For adults seeking one or more Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, First Eucharist, or Confirmation). Sessions begin in the fall. Please contact the parish office for more information.

Vatican News

Did You Know ...

His Holiness Pope Francis (elected March 13,2013)

- As archbishop of Buenos Aires, he lived in an apartment, cooked his own meals and took public transit
- Each year during Holy Week as archbishop, he washed the feet of different social outsiders, including AIDS patients and the incarcerated, according to Bloomberg News
- When elected Pope, he chose not to wear the red shoes made specifically for him, but rather, chose to continue wearing his old, worn-out black shoes from Buenos Aires
- After his election as Supreme Pontiff, he decided to go back to the hotel where he had been staying to pay the bill himself, and chose to ride in the bus with the rest of the Cardinals, rather than in the limo provided for him
- He celebrated his first Holy Thursday Mass in a youth prison in Rome, and forbid any media to attend, asking that the Mass be private
- During his pontificate, Pope Francis lived in the Santa Marta house with the Vatican employees instead of staying in the usual Papal Apartment
