Video overview: Have you ever considered how much God wants us to be hospitable to him? Today's readings challenge us to look at how we invite the Lord into our hearts each day. Are we as gracious and open as a hospitable host, or do we go through most of our day forgetting to keep company with the Lord, rushing from one thing to the next? Many of us Christians are so busy trying to serve in our families, our children's schools and activities, and even our local churches that we forget who we are serving. We often lose sight of the Lord himself. The Gospel reading for today portrays this beautifully in the person of Martha, who is so busy serving her guests that she becomes upset and loses sight of why she is serving in the first place: to make a place of welcome for Jesus. It isn't that we are unwilling to offer hospitality to God. It's just that so often the Lord comes in disguise, as a poor person, a child, someone in need. If we aren't alert, we can miss the Lord as he passes by. Each day we need to reflect on the willingness we have to show hospitality to God. And our willingness to see him in the many disguises he wears.

Featured study: Hospitality and Hospitality Continued

Reflection: Although it's not uncommon to see interpreters of this passage portray Martha as the "bad guy" in this Gospel scene, many others suggest that Martha and Mary taken together—and not just Mary alone—represent a composite of what the Christian life ought to look like. Martha, like Abraham in the first reading from Genesis, is the picture of love acting in hospitality, while Mary is the picture of pure contemplative love, gazing upon the Lord. Many religious orders since the Middle Ages, like the Franciscans, Dominicans, and Jesuits, have striven to be both active and contemplative in their approach to the service of Christ. But in keeping with the Lord's clear declaration that "one thing is needful" (RSV), the Church has always stressed that prayer itself is the lifeblood of service. Without that foundation, service, however extensive, becomes formal and stale because it won't be fed by love. And we must recall that the simple contemplative gaze is also a representation of our heavenly goal, the beatific vision, when we shall see God as he is in himself. Contemplation is, we could say, heaven practice, where the one needful thing will be the one object of our constant attention and joy. With no offense meant to the Marthas among us (and within all of us), our lives as Christians should rightly express a growing simplicity of focus and less troubling of ourselves about the "many things" of life. And it is only prayer that will enable us to serve without anxiety and to care for others without getting lost in the complexities of life.

WHY IS NOW SUCH A CRITICAL TIME IN THE CHURCH IN THE UNITED STATES TO HAVE A EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL?

We are excited to witness what God has in store for his Church in the U.S. through the National Eucharistic Revival! Our world is in desperate need of the love of God. Geopolitical crises, social unrest, increased polarization, and the need for recovery and renewal from the pandemic have created the opportunity to "open wide the doors to Christ" through Eucharistic Revival. The difficulties and challenges over the last few years have shed lights on the Church's need for healing, unity, formation, and conversion. More than 30 percent of Catholics have not returned to the pews post-pandemic, and recent data reveals that the majority of Mass-going Catholics do not believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The past decade has also seen the rise of the "nones" among the millennial generation, with more than 40 percent now self-identifying as "unaffiliated" with any religion. Many young Catholics find the faith to be irrelevant to the meaning of their lives and challenges.

In the midst of these challenging times, we must increase our ability to provide to those inside the Church and to the world a credible witness of the difference Jesus Christ makes in the life of every individual. As the people of God, we must be reminded that the Eucharist truly is the living God, Jesus, with us, "always, until the end of the age," (Mt 28:20).

As we set out to meet the needs of the world and culture around us with the love of Christ, we must first take time to experience our own Eucharistic Revival with a renewed encounter and love for Jesus in the Eucharist, "for the life of the world" (Jn 6:51).

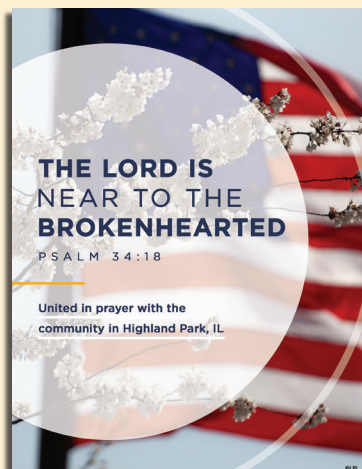

Youth & Young Adults Corner

Hello Youth & Young Adults of SJV!

In today's readings, we have a very important lesson to learn. Jesus visits the house of Martha and Mary, and Martha quickly gets busy to work. Meanwhile, Mary is sitting at His feet, listening to Jesus speak. When Martha becomes upset about this, Jesus responds that there are many things that she is anxious about, but there is only one thing that she should be anxious about, which is presumably what Mary has chosen. Jesus says that she "has chosen the better part, and it will not be taken from her." So what is it exactly? Let us frame it like this: while Martha was busy doing "the Lord's work," Mary was concerned only with knowing and loving the Lord for whom the work is being done. Note that Jesus does not say that Martha chose something bad. In fact, what she was doing was by all standards a good thing, since for one thing to be the "better" implies that the other part is itself also good. In church life, it is far too easy to get carried away with being so busy "doing the Lord's work" that we can easily forget to focus on the Lord Himself. We forget, in part or entirely, the God for whom we are supposedly working. So, who then are we truly working for? God, or ourselves? Remember, busy-ness does not equal holiness. Always put your relationship with Jesus before all else. Otherwise, it is all in vain. Prayer must be at the heart of all we do.

POPE FRANCIS CONDEMNS 'SENSELESS SHOOTING,' CALLS FOR END OF VIOLENCE AFTER JULY FOURTH PARADE ATTACK

The Pope Francis has expressed shock and sadness over the mass shooting that led to the death of at least six and wounded some 30 others at a Fourth of July parade in the Chicago suburb of Highland on Monday.

In a telegram sent on behalf of the Holy Father to Cardinal Blase Cupich, the Archbishop of Chicago, the pope condemned the "senseless shooting," appealing for a rejection of all forms of violence.

The telegram was sent on his behalf by Vatican Secretary of State, Cardinal Pietro Parolin, reported Vatican News.

Pope Francis asked the Cardinal to convey his spiritual closeness to all affected by this attack.

Robert E. Crimo III, a 22-year-old from Highland Park, was apprehended late Monday in connection with the shooting.

Crimo had been identified earlier in the day as a person of interest in the shooting.

The pope's telegram said he joined "the entire community in praying that Almighty God will grant eternal rest to the dead and healing and consolation to the injured and bereaved."

"With unwavering faith that the grace of God is able to convert even the hardest of hearts, making it possible to depart from evil and do good," the message continued, Pope Francis prayed "that every member of society will reject violence in all of its forms and respect life in all of its stages."

Pope Francis concluded his message with an Apostolic Blessing "as a pledge of strength and peace in the Lord."

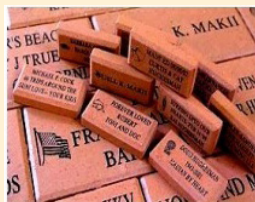
