Review: At the sight of the crowds, Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." Then he summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness. The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew, Thomas and Matthew the tax collector;

James, the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddeus; Simon from Cana, and Judas Iscariot who betrayed him. Jesus sent out these twelve after instructing them thus, "Do not go into pagan territory or enter a Samaritan town.

Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."

Reflection: The Gospel of Matthew does not include the story of the calling of the Twelve perhaps because he assumed that this event was known to his readers. Here is the only time that the Twelve are called Apostles, which means "those who are sent." Matthew wrote for a community that included many believers of Jewish background. The naming of the twelve apostles echoed the twelve tribes of Israel and established the new Israel. Because of the number of Jewish Christians in Matthew's community, it is not surprising that he describes the mission of the apostles as "gathering the lost sheep of the house of Israel." This may also reflect an original Jewish-Christian refusal to include the Gentiles in the mission of the Church. Matthew used two images to indicate that discipleship always implies mission: people are like sheep without a shepherd and like a harvest that needs laborers to get the work done. Today's reading offers three significant messages: • Discipleship involves mission. • The disciples' mission continues that of Jesus in preaching the coming of the Reign of God and healing the sick. • As Jesus calls and gifts us freely, the gifts we have received are likewise to be given freely.

God's "Special Possession"

What does it mean to be God's "special possession"? Our world is dominated by things, objects, possessions. To say we are a materialistic culture is an understatement. In that context, it can be really hard to fully appreciate the meaning of being "possessed" by God.

I have so many possessions, after all. I acquire and discard them without thought. I am even overwhelmed by them. Sometimes, it feels like they possess me.

But then I think of the week after Christmas in a house with small children. In that week, there is always The Toy. The Toy that won the heart of your child under the tree, The Toy to which they emotionally attached themselves in a whirlwind of twinkle lights and sugar cookies. For that one week, The Toy is all there is. There were many gifts, but The Toy is special, and there can only be one.

So, what does it mean to be "possessed" by God? What does it mean to be of his people? It means you will be cherished and protected in ways you do not deserve and cannot understand. It means you are distinguished not by your own merit, but by the love with which you are beheld.

It means that you are always The Toy, and every day is Christmas. "Therefore, if you hearken to my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my special possession, dearer to me than all other people, though all the earth is mine." — Exodus 19:5

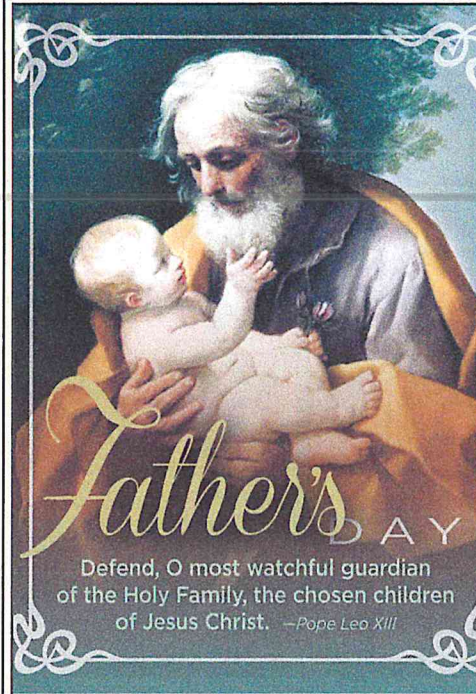

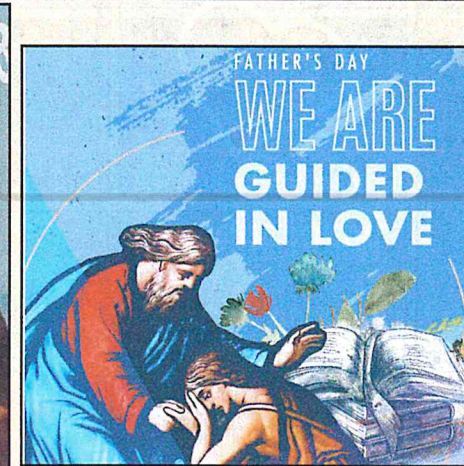

'Pope: We have responsibility before God to protect Common Home'

The catastrophic effects of climate change hold us accountable before God. Pope Francis stressed this on Monday in the Vatican as he addressed participants in and organizers of the Green&Blue Festival, coinciding with World Environment Day, today, 5 June 2023, as he appealed for recognizing our shared responsibility to take concrete action to protect the planet.... During the audience, the Pope encouraged them in their commitment to protect the environment. He also drew attention to the ever-more violent natural disasters devastating the globe, as he urged the International Community, and all people of good will, to do their part in safeguarding our Common Home.

"This," the Pope insisted, "has also increased our sense of responsibility before God, Who has entrusted us with the care of Creation, before our neighbors and before future generations."... The phenomenon of climate change, the Holy Father said, reminds us insistently of our responsibilities, especially to the poorest and most fragile, who contribute the least to the phenomenon, but suffer from it the most.

"It is necessary today," the Pope urged, "for the entire international community to put as a priority the implementation of collegial, solidarity-based and forward-looking actions," recognizing "the magnitude, urgency and beauty of the challenge before us."

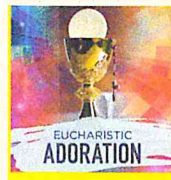

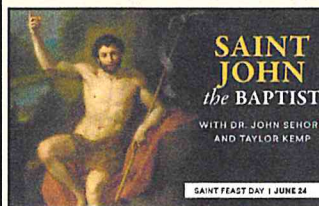
