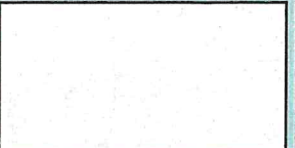

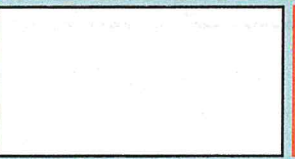

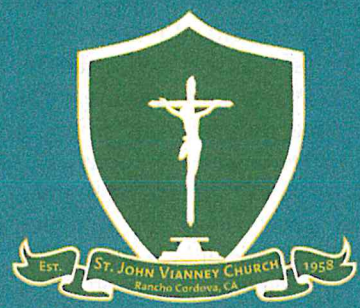

Review: Jesus was very clear about the cost of discipleship. He didn't mince words when he talked about the hardships his followers would face. And yet, at the same time he says, "Do not be afraid." Isn't this a bit of a contradiction? Does it seem odd that Jesus warns us about future difficulties but then tells us not to worry? However, the key to understanding this Sunday's Gospel reading lies in what Jesus means by "fear." First, Jesus is telling us that we should not fear our enemies in this world. We needn't have the kind of stomach churning, heart-pounding fear that comes from being terrified of the persecutions we may face. God the Father knows us even down to the hairs on our head, and he will be with us to help us face whatever sufferings we might encounter. In today's Gospel, the Lord encourages us, instead of fearing persecution, to have instead a healthy fear of the Lord—which is the fear or awe that a person might have in the presence of a good, noble, and magnificent king. That kind of fear empowers us to live out the Christian life in a heroic, unfeared manner. By trusting in such a good God who will be with us in whatever obstacles we might face, we are free to be bold in our witness to the Gospel. Now while it's true that some Christians may be asked to give up their lives as a result of following Jesus, for most of us our call to heroism will consist of the daily sacrifices that ordinary life calls for. The sacrifice of forgoing gossip, of enduring insults, of being misunderstood, of holding our tongues and our tempers. While today's Gospel might seem foreboding, we have nothing to fear. Even the worst thing that could happen—death—has been conquered by Christ's Resurrection.

Featured study: Discipleship in the Church. You need to read this.

Reflection: Our passage from chapter 10 of the Gospel of Matthew falls after Matthew presents Jesus first as prophetic teacher in the Sermon on the Mount (chapters 5-7) and then as a miracle worker (chapters 8-9). This reading shows us Jesus sharing his own authority and mission with the Twelve Disciples. What this tells us, is that, just as figures like Adam and Jeremiah speak through their lives and actions of the coming of Jesus, those of us on the other side of his coming who are sent into the world in his name to continue his mission express that same principle of repetition or echoing of the divine message. Being true to that mission, even with all the trials it will bring, unites us vitally with Christ, both now and in Heaven. The Catechism, quoting St. John Eudes, tells us: We must continue to accomplish in ourselves the stages of Jesus' life and his mysteries and often beg him to perfect and realize them in us and in his whole Church For it is the plan of the Son of God to make us and the whole Church partake in his mysteries and to extend them to and continue them in us and in his whole Church. This is his plan for fulfilling his mysteries in us.'9+ (CCC 521) All of history has been prepared by God to grant us this wonderful place in his plan: to manifest him by fearlessly taking up the prophetic mantle ourselves.

INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK



Let's find a way to understand Jesus' words to his disciples this Sunday, when he says, "Don't be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna." Fear, in this sense, refers to where we find our deepest identity and our highest love. That's why Jesus says next that when we acknowledge him before others, he will acknowledge us before the Father. It doesn't mean we're brash or boastful. But rather we unhesitatingly and humbly embrace our identity as followers of Jesus and children of God the Father. After all, if we love who we are and where we come from, who cares what the others think about us?

Christ promises to acknowledge us before his Father if we will acknowledge him. In what ways are we called to acknowledge Christ today? In what ways are we tempted to deny him, to distance ourselves from him?

'Honour Grandparents': Pope's Message for World Day of Grandparents and Elderly'

"Let us honour them, neither depriving ourselves of their company nor depriving them of ours. May we never allow the elderly to be cast aside!" This is Pope Francis' heartfelt invitation in his Message for the Third World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, which the Church will celebrate on Sunday, 23 July....

The Church observes the World Day each year on the fourth Sunday in July, close to the feast of Jesus' grandparents, Saints Joachim and Anne. On the World Day, the Holy Father ... invites parishes, dioceses, associations and ecclesial communities from all over the world to celebrate the Day in their own pastoral context. Pope Francis instituted this Day in 2021 since, he believes, grandparents are often forgotten, yet they "are the link between generations, passing on the experience of life and faith to the young."

Pope Francis chose as this year's theme "His mercy is from age to age" (Lk 1:50), which he recalled, takes us back to.... the Magnificat, in which [Mary] proclaimed that the Lord's mercy is from generation to generation.

That same Spirit, the Pope observes in the Message, "blesses and accompanies every fruitful encounter between different generations: between grandparents and grandchildren, between young and old."

Anointing of the Sick:
By appointment.

Baptisms:
English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held online.

Bautizos:
Bautizos en Español son cada 3er Sábado del mes a las 9:30 am. Clases pre-bautismales son el Domingo anterior al bautizo de las 9am-1pm.

Marriage:
As a minimum requirement, couples must contact the parish office and set an appointment at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Marriage preparation classes online.

Matrimonio:
Se requiere que las parejas contacten a la oficina parroquial cuando menos seis meses antes de la fecha de matrimonio. Clases prematrimoniales son en persona.

First Eucharist:
A two year family formation program preparation is required. Children must be a minimum of 6 years old. Classes run from September-May and registrations are open June-August.

Primera Comunión:
Programa de dos años en el programa de formación familiar es requerido. Los niños deben tener 6 años cumplidos o más. Inscripciones son Junio-Agosto y las clases son Septiembre-Mayo.

Youth Confirmation:
Candidates for Confirmation must be at least 12 years old and in 7th grade to start the program. A two-year religious education preparation is required prior to receiving the Sacrament.

Confirmación para Jóvenes:
Candidatos para Confirmación deben de tener los 12 años cumplidos y cursar el séptimo grado. El programa es de dos años de educación religiosa antes de recibir el Sacramento.

OCIA and Adult Sacramental:
