

May 28, Pentecost Sunday - Formed.org.

Review: This week we celebrate Pentecost, the feast of the Church's birth. With a roaring of the heavens and in tongues of fire, the Holy Spirit comes and enlightens the Apostles. Peter begins to preach with boldness and authority what Christ's life and Death truly means. From that moment, the great mission of the Church begins. The Apostles were emboldened to spread the Gospel, not on their own, but through the power of the Holy Spirit who descended on the upper room that spring day. Who and what is the Holy Spirit? In many ways, the Holy Spirit is the most difficult of the three Persons of the Trinity for us to comprehend, yet he is fully and truly God, co-equal with the Father and Son. Indeed, the Holy Spirit is the bond of love between the Father and the Son. The mutual, eternal, perfect love of the Father and the Son is the third Person of the Holy Trinity the Holy Spirit. When we are baptized, the Holy Spirit is breathed into our souls, but the Spirit's work within us is intensified in the Sacrament of Confirmation. When we are confirmed, like the Apostles, we are strengthened to give greater witness to the faith. The Holy Spirit comes to each of us, bestowing his gifts. He directs us in a particular way, as a member of the Body of Christ, for the common good of the entire Church. **Featured study:** Jesus gave the Apostles and the Church the power to forgive sin

Reflection: On the feast of the Ascension we noted that the Gospel reading for that day actually reported an event prior to the Ascension, a meeting after the Resurrection of Jesus and his disciples in Galilee, during which Jesus told them that they were to disperse throughout the world baptizing and making disciples. Similarly, in the readings for Pentecost we hear about a post-Resurrection appearance of Jesus to his Apostles prior to Pentecost, in which he tells them about a critical part of their future ministry. Though on the Ascension Jesus instructed the Apostles in their ministry of teaching and Baptism, today he gives them the power to forgive sins in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Jesus breathes the Spirit on them for this purpose, saying to his bishops, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Here Jesus echoes what he had said earlier to them: "Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatsoever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven" (Matthew 18:18). Now they receive the gift of the Spirit to perform that ministry. Of all the wonderful gifts that the Spirit bestows upon the Church, this is perhaps one of the greatest, coming to us through the ministry of our bishops and priests. The mission of Son and the Spirit is to free us from sin, that slavery that binds us beyond our own power to loose. And the Son and Spirit are still working in the hierarchical ministry of the Church-which is a ministry, not of power as the world speaks of it, but of the divine power of mercy.

MEDITATION: PENTECOST SUNDAY



hope you'll acknowledge with me have tongues of fire "part and come to rest" on people. It is actually pretty strange. Yet that is precisely Pentecost. How can this mean something to us in our daily lives?

Jews had a tradition that heaven is a temple made of bricks of fire. So, through the apostles, the heavenly temple is coming to earth. But this fire looks like tongues, not bricks. That means that heavenly speech will be crucial to building a dwelling place for God on earth among men and women. So, it's no surprise when the apostles begin to speak in a miraculous way that is understood by all language groups. They are speaking of what God has done in and through Jesus: bringing heaven to earth and uniting all peoples to God and to each other. How often our speech divides: gossip, slander, insults, and so on. How strange and rare it is when people speak in ways that

truly unite instead of divide. Imagine how powerful it would be community in a way that made people hear heavenly speech. Imagine if you spoke of the mighty deeds of God in a way that everyone could understand. That's precisely what the Holy Spirit descends upon us to do. Ask Him to come as a tongue of





Vatican News

'Pope at Audience: May we never forget our roots as we build bridges of humanity'

Addressing the faithful gathered in St Peter's Square for his weekly General Audience, Pope Francis recalled his recent trip to Hungary and decided to focus on two images: roots and bridges. Pope Francis stressed how he saw "so many humble and hardworking people proudly cherish the bond with their roots" during his Journey to Hungary, adding that "among these roots are first and foremost the saints: saints who gave their lives for the people, saints who bore witness to the Gospel of love, saints who were lights in times of darkness; so many saints of the past who today exhort us to overcome the risk of defeatism and the fear of tomorrow, remembering that Christ is our future"....

Pope Francis then turned to the second image: bridges. Budapest, the Pope noted, is famous for three bridges "that cross and unite its parts". He noted how he had stressed, in Hungary, "the vocation of Europe, which is called, a "bridge of peace," to include differences and to welcome those who knock on its doors. In this sense, the humanitarian bridge created for so many refugees from neighbouring Ukraine, whom I was able to meet while also admiring the great network of charity of the Hungarian Church, is beautiful".

Finally, the Pope recalled "with gratitude" the beautiful liturgical moments, and reflected on the "beauty of building bridges between believers".

Let us ask ourselves, the Pope concluded, whether we too are building bridges in our daily lives..."

This past Sunday, our church all over the world celebrated the Ascension of our Lord Jesus into Heaven. Then we will pray to God and say, "Thank you Jesus for sending us the Holy Spirit." During the procession we will sing, "Veni Santi Spirtus". We are happy to be children of the light of Christ and temples of the Holy Spirit. Let the love of God always burn in your hearts!
