



Review: Humility seems like such a contradiction. We are easily tempted to think that the way to greatness involves letting everyone know all that we do well. There is a constant temptation for most people to put forward their best face and to hope others will see that and admire it. We want to be noticed and praised. And we often try to make that happen by the little things we do and say, and often we tend to exaggerate who we are. On the flip side, if someone criticizes us and thinks ill of us it has the potential of being devastating. If we hear that someone said something negative about us, we may go home and be depressed or angry about it the rest of the day, or even the rest of the week! Why? Because our pride is wounded and that wound can hurt. It can hurt unless we have discovered the incredible gift of humility. Humility is a virtue that enables us to be real. It enables us to cut through any false persona we may have and simply be who we are. It enables us to be comfortable with our good qualities as well as our failures. Humility is nothing other than being honest and true about our lives and being comfortable with that person. Jesus gives us a wonderful lesson in the Gospel passage above that is very hard to live but is absolutely key to living a happy life. He wants us to be exalted! He wants us to be noticed by others. He wants our light of goodness to shine for all to see and for that light to make a difference. But He wants it done in truth, not by presenting a false persona. He wants the real "me" to shine forth. And that is humility. Humility is sincerity and genuineness. And when people see this quality in us, they are impressed. Not so much in a worldly way but in an authentic human way. They will not look at us and be envious, rather, they will look at us and see the true qualities we have and enjoy them, admire them, and want to imitate them. Humility enables the real you to shine through. And believe it or not, the real you is someone who others want to meet and get to know.

<u>Featured study</u>: Daily Reflections-September 26, 2021 Have the humility to not control how the Spirit works in other people's lives.

Reflection: Reflect, today, on how genuine you are. Make this time of Lent a time when the foolishness of pride is shattered. Let God strip away every false image of yourself so that the true you can shine forth. Humble yourself in this way and God will take you and exalt you in His way so that your heart can be seen and loved by those around you.

Pope Francis consecrates war-torn world to Virgin Mary in Eucharistic prayer vigil


Pope Francis consecrated the Church and the world to the Blessed Virgin Mary in a Eucharistic adoration prayer vigil for peace in St. Peter's Basilica on Friday, Oct. 27, amid the ongoing Israel-Hamas war in the Holy Land.



Invoking the Virgin Mary as the Queen of Peace and Mother of Mercy, Pope Francis implored her to "intercede for our world in danger and turmoil" and to "convert those who fuel and foment conflicts."


"To you we entrust and consecrate our lives and every fiber of our being, all that we possess and all that we are, forever. To you we consecrate the Church, so that in her witness to the love of Jesus before the world, she may be a sign of harmony and an instrument of peace. To you we consecrate our world, especially those countries and regions at war." The prayer was the culmination of a worldwide day of fasting, prayer, and penance for peace in the world called for by the pope amid the escalating war between Israel and Hamas in the Gaza Strip. Pope Francis presided over the prayer of the sorrowful mysteries of the Rosary, the Litany of Loreto, and Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.



The Land of Israel

Israel, the smallest country in the Middle East, was chosen by God to be the land of His only Son, Jesus. The main cities in Israel are Nazareth, Bethlehem and Jerusalem. The most important events in the life of Jesus occurred in these cities. In Nazareth, Mary was told she was to have a baby, and to name Him Jesus, in Bethlehem, Jesus was born in a stable, and in Jerusalem Jesus was apprehended, sentenced to death, suffered His Passion, Death and Resurrection. God many times referred to this land as the "Land of Milk and Honey". This land is known by most people as the Holy Land.

Mary the Mother of God

To Saint Irenaeus she was the Untier of Knots. To those attending the Council at Ephesus she was the *Theotokos*, the God-Bearer. To Muslims she is *Ma'suma* - "She who never sinned" or *Mustafi'a* - "She who is chosen". To the poet/priest Gerard Manley Hopkins she was the *Rosa Mystica*, the Mystical Rose; "Mary the Virgin, well the heart knows, / She is the mystery, she is that rose". To Lúcia dos Santos and her cousins Francisco and Jacinta Marto she was Our Lady of Fatima. To Saint Pope John Paul II she was the Mother of the Church. To Jesus she was His mother. But, who is Mary to you? This week we will be discussing Mary the Mother of God in our twelfth session of OCIA, the process through which adults are received into full communion with the Church, on Sunday, 12 November 2023.

Are you a non-Catholic, or a Catholic who has never received the sacrament of confirmation and do you seek full communion with the Catholic Church? Baptisms:

English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held online.

Bautizos:

Marriage:

As a minimum requirement, couples must contact the parish office and set an appointment at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Marriage preparation classes online.

Matrimonio:

Se requiere que las parejas contacten a la oficina parroquial cuando menos seis meses antes de la fecha de matrimonio. Clases prematrimoniales son en persona.

First Eucharist:

A two year family formation program preparation is required. Children must be a minimum of 6 years old. Classes run from September-May and registrations are open June-August.

Primera Comunion:

Programa de dos años en el programa de formación familiar es requerido. Los niños deben tener 6 años cumplidos o más. Inscripciones son Junio-Agosto y las clases son Septiembre-Mayo.

Youth Confirmation:

Candidates for Confirmation must be at least 12 years old and in 7th grade to start the program. A two-year religious education preparation is required prior to receiving the Sacrament.

Candidatos para Confirmación deben de tener los 12 años cumplidos y cursar el séptimo grado. El programa es de dos años de educación religiosa antes de recibir el Sacramento.

OCIA and Adult Sacramental:
