Review: How many times have we heard the expression, "Render unto Caesar that which is Caesar's and render unto God that which is God's"? Today's Gospel gives us the origin of that phrase. The Pharisees, who have been attempting to trap Jesus for some time, have joined forces with some of their opponents, the Herodians, to pose a tricky question: Is it lawful to pay the census tax? Since the Pharisees didn't believe it was lawful and the Herodians did, no matter what Jesus answered, someone was bound to be angered. Jesus' answer shows his acumen and wisdom. Instead of giving a direct reply, he first calls out the Pharisees for trying to trap him. He understands their motive is to find a reason to kill him, and he lets them know that he recognizes that. Then he very carefully gives the reply we are familiar with, saying that some things belong to God and some things belong to Caesar. It is our responsibility to see the difference and respond accordingly. This can be quite the challenge for us who live today in an increasingly secularized world. Many want to see how far they can push the limits and have us render unto Caesar that which belongs rightly to God. We must be ready for the test and continue to render unto God that which is God's while still being actively engaged in the secular domain with the good news of the Gospel. Not an easy task by any means, and one that can be accomplished only with the grace of God himself.

Featured study: King Lear. Ok, this will humble you to no end. To render unto Caesar, wow.

Reflection: This reading represents a turn of the Jewish authorities from defense to offense. The extent of their ire is demonstrated in that the Pharisees and Herodians team up on Jesus in this passage. These are two factions whose *only* common interest would have been stopping Jesus. Interestingly, the dilemma that the Pharisees put to Jesus expresses the difference between the two factions. The Pharisees would've opposed the paying of taxes to the emperor, and the Herodians would've supported such an action. So Jesus, in the presence of each, is being asked by both to offend one or the other. Jesus' answer is stunning. Jesus asks the Pharisees for "the coin used for the tax,"-the tax required payment in a Roman coin minted by Caesar. The fact they had such a coin suggested their intention was to pay the Roman tax. Jesus rightly calls them "hypocrites." He then says, "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's." What Jesus is saying to the Pharisees is this: "The coin you own owns you. By your sympathy with the Herodians, whom you oppose, you violate the very principle by which you sought to trap me." The last part of Jesus' retort could well have been addressed to both factions: "Give to God what is God's."

Pope Francis calls for immediate release of Israeli hostages held by Hamas

Pope Francis appealed for the immediate release of more than 100 hostages being held by Hamas in Gaza on Wednesday and expressed concern for the safety of Palestinian civilians living in the Gaza Strip.

Some 130 Israeli hostages were taken by the militant Islamist group Hamas during its attack on Israel last weekend. The terrorist group has threatened to kill one hostage every time that Israel's military bombs civilian targets in Gaza "without warning," according to the Associated Press.

Speaking to thousands of people in St. Peter's Square for his Wednesday morning audience, the pope underlined that "terrorism and extremism do not help to reach a solution to the conflict between Israelis and Palestinians, but they fuel hatred, violence, revenge, and only make both suffer."


The pope said that he has been following "what is happening in Israel and Palestine with tears and apprehension." After Hamas' attack on Israel killed 1,000 people, the Israeli government vowed retaliation and launched airstrikes on the blockaded Gaza Strip.

Francis said: "It is the right of those who are attacked to defend themselves, but I am very worried about the total siege in which the Palestinians live in Gaza, where there have been many innocent victims." "The Middle East does not need war, but peace, a peace built on justice, dialogue, and the courage of fraternity," he added.

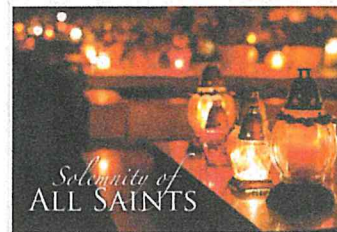

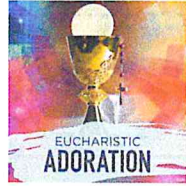

Liturgical Colors and Seasons

When visiting the church, one discovers that the colors in the altar and in the decorations change as our priest changes the color of the cloth he wears for Mass and other celebrations.

The most important colors in our church are:

GREEN, for **ORDINARY TIME**, or the growing season, **PURPLE**, for **PREPARATION**, before the celebrations, **WHITE** for our **CELEBRATIONS**, like Christmas and Easter and **RED** for **PENTECOST**, the Coming of the Holy Spirit. These are our Liturgical Colors and Seasons. Our Church is full of joy and colors! Jesus' Altar is always **WHITE**, because it is the **CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST, OUR MASS.**

Bautizos en Español son cada 3er Sábado del mes a las 9:30 am. Clases pre-bautismales son el Domingo anterior al bautizo de las 9am-1pm.

Marriage:

As a minimum requirement, couples must contact the parish office and set an appointment at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Marriage preparation classes online.

Matrimonio:

Se requiere que las parejas contacten a la oficina parroquial cuando menos seis meses antes de la fecha de matrimonio. Clases prematrimoniales son en persona.

First Eucharist:

A two year family formation program preparation is required. Children must be a minimum of 6 years old. Classes run from September-May and registrations are open June-August.

Primera Comunión:

Programa de dos años en el programa de formación familiar es requerido. Los niños deben tener 6 años cumplidos o más. Inscripciones son Junio-Agosto y las clases son Septiembre-Mayo.

Youth Confirmation:

Candidates for Confirmation must be at least 12 years old and in 7th grade to start the program. A two-year religious education preparation is required prior to receiving the Sacrament.

Confirmación para Jóvenes:

Candidatos para Confirmación deben de tener los 12 años cumplidos y cursar el séptimo grado. El programa es de dos años de educación religiosa antes de recibir el Sacramento.

OCIA and Adult Sacramental:

For adults seeking one or more Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, First Eucharist, or Confirmation). Sessions begin in the fall. Please contact the parish office for more information.

OCIA y Sacramentos para adultos:
