



Review: Jeremiah is angry in today's first reading. So angry, he says that God had duped him. The connotation is that God has somehow let him down and deceived him. If you know something about Jeremiah's life, it's easy to see why he feels this way. God called him to be a prophet and then appointed him to bring very bad news to the Israelites: they were going to be sent into exile for their sins. Needless to say, such a message wasn't very popular and the prophet has to bear the brunt of the people's anger. In turn, Jeremiah becomes angry with God for saddling him with such a thankless task. In the end, however, Jeremiah concedes that even if he wanted to, he couldn't deny the Word of God that burns within him. We can find ourselves in a similar place. When the Word of God burns within us, it can be sweet, but sometimes it can be very difficult. If we are to faithfully pronounce that Word, we must be totally in love with the Lord, for it is only when we are enamored with God that we can do what St. Paul says: offer our entire lives as a sacrifice to God to be consumed. Just as Jeremiah was consumed and transformed by the Word that burned within him, we likewise need to be transformed until we become completely pleasing to the Lord. This transformation then leads us from thinking in human terms to thinking as God thinks and putting on the mind of Christ, as St. Paul says, so that we can unite ourselves fully and completely with Our Lord.

Featured study: Into His Likeness with Dr Edward Sri

Reflection: Our Gospel passage follows directly upon the text from last Sunday, where Peter is raised to the loftiest position in the kingdom after that of Jesus himself. And what do we see this week? He is called "Satan!" Assuming that both of these passages together comprised only several minutes of conversation, Peter must have felt like he was on a roller coaster. Notice that Jesus first talks about the fact that he must suffer. Then, after Peter puts his foot in his mouth-probably quite innocently thinking that he was expressing his love for Jesus, Jesus tells Peter that anyone who would follow him must suffer, too. We can easily misunderstand Jesus to be saying to Peter, or to us, "No, don't you get it? Being crowned and celebrated the messianic king would be bad, and suffering an ignominious death is good." Jesus isn't really turning the world upside down. He isn't saying that pleasure is bad and pain is good. He is telling us the unvarnished truth that in a world of sin, love will suffer. And if we choose to love as he did, we suffer as he did. The really revolutionary and revelatory element here is that the reward will far surpass the sacrifice, such that what we call "life" will seem pale next to that new kind of life that love will gain. But, again, we ought not to think that suffering is the point; it is love that gains the prize of glory.

Vatican News

Pope invites Christians to join together in witnessing the Gospel'

Pope Francis has called upon fellow Christians to bear witness to the Gospel together.

He did so in a telegram sent on his behalf, by Vatican Secretary of State, Cardinal Pietro Parolin, to the Synod of the Union of Methodist and Waldensian Churches, taking place this week in northern Italy.

The telegram began by expressing the Pope's delight to greet the synod members, and conveying his hope that the "meeting may be, for each one, an occasion of a profound experience of Christ who welcomes, guides and leads to the fullness of communion with Him and with the brethren."

Pope Francis raised a prayer of praise to God the Father "for the gifts bestowed through ecumenical dialogue," as well as for the "harmonious collaboration" between Christian confessions. He also expressed his desire "to remain spiritually present at this important event, so that we may grow in mutual knowledge in order to bear witness together to the Gospel of Jesus." The Holy Father concluded by offering his best wishes for the work of this synodal assembly, and invoking the Lord's blessing. The Union of Methodist and Waldensian Churches is an Italian united church founded in 1975, which brings together the Waldensian Evangelical Church and the Evangelical Methodist Church in Italy.

Prayer for Peace in Our Communities:


Let us Pray,



A group from the Holy Land will be selling religious articles after masses to support the Catholic Christian minorities in Bethlehem. As a tradition, many of the Catholic families in the Holy Land work in small workshops to produce religious articles from olive wood. These articles represent the Christian art of the Holy Land. In the past, they used to sell their artwork to pilgrims who visit the Holy Land. However, these days they are facing an economic hardship, as there are not many pilgrims visiting the Holy Land. Many of the Catholic families immigrated and left the Holy Land. The struggle to preserve the Catholic identity of the birthplace of our savior; Jesus Christ is a serious concern

for Catholics around the world. Sales will be used to help and support the Catholics in the Holy Land and to encourage them not to immigrate.



The Silver Rose Pilgrimage




Annual Diocesan Collection for Priests Retirement






