Review: Jesus' enemies were always looking for ways to trap him. In Matthew 22, where today's Gospel comes from, Jesus is tested three times. The test in this week's reading centers on the Pharisees asking Jesus what is the greatest commandment of the law. In response, Jesus quotes the *Shema*, the great prayer from Deuteronomy 6:4, which begins, "Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God is one Lord" (RSV). That alone wouldn't have surprised his audience. In fact, they would have expected him to say something like that. What does surprise them, however, is that Jesus subtly changes the wording. Instead of saying that we are to love the Lord with all our heart, soul, and *might*, he says we must love with our heart, soul, and *mind*. *So what's the big deal? What's the difference between might and mind? One insight we can take away is that we must use our intellect to study the truth about God-not just to have "head knowledge," but because in order to truly love someone, we have to know them. And in order to know someone, we have to know about them. If we are really to love God, we have to know what God is like; his character and his actions. How can we come to know God? By reading the Scriptures. For if we have never read the Bible, especially the Gospels, we cannot truly say that we love God with our whole mind (as well as heart and soul).*

Featured study: Love unveiled. The Catholic faith explained

Reflection: As the opening of this episode indicates, the Pharisees have come to Jesus having heard that he has confounded the Sadducees, a rival religious faction to the Pharisees, in an argument over the resurrection of the dead. In that exchange, Jesus came down on the side of the Pharisees, who believed in such a resurrection, accusing the Sadducees of knowing neither the Scriptures nor the power of God. The Pharisees haven't come to try to "trip him up" but to "test" his wisdom further, as one would any rabbi. The question Jesus is asked by the scholar in the law-"Which commandment of the law is the greatest?"-seems not to be aimed at tricking him or leading him into a rhetorical trap. He responds in a way that wouldn't have surprised a faithful Jew. Jesus' answer is, likewise, straightforward, yet magisterial. He answers with authority and without indictment, as is the case when he knows a questioner is sincere. Jesus is really describing the attitude of one who has entered into the kingdom of God, which is precisely God's sovereignty in the human soul, by virtue of this covenant faithfulness. This passage demonstrates the continuity of Jesus and His message with His and our-Jewish roots.

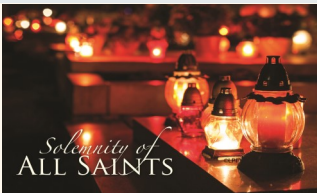

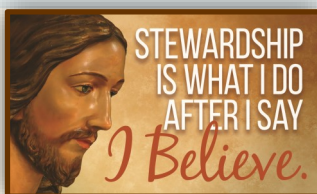


St. Vincent de Paul Special Collection

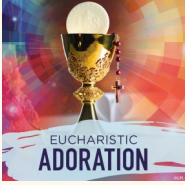

On **Thursday, November 2**, we are visiting again the **Big Atrium**, our Church. Why?

Our Pastor, Father Giovanni will show us how he prepares himself for the celebration of the Mass. Yes! Father will be vesting for us in the church before Mass. We will see how he puts on first the **Amice**, the **Alb**, and the **Cincture** which are white and then the **Stole** and **Chasuble** that can be in any of the Liturgical Colors: purple, white, green or red, according to the Season we are in or the celebration. The Cincture can also have any of these colors, but most of the time is White.

Father says special prayers as he puts each item on. Our Mass is the most important prayer of the Church and our priest dresses up for this Holy Celebration. We too should dress up to come to Mass every Sunday, in honor to the Lord!

Baptisms:

English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held online.

Bautizos:

Bautizos en Español son cada 3er Sábado del mes a las 9:30 am. Clases pre-bautismales son el Domingo anterior al bautizo de las 9am-1pm.

Marriage:

As a minimum requirement, couples must contact the parish office and set an appointment at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Marriage preparation classes online.

Matrimonio:

Se requiere que las parejas contacten a la oficina parroquial cuando menos seis meses antes de la fecha de matrimonio. Clases prematrimoniales son en persona.

First Eucharist:

A two year family formation program preparation is required. Children must be a minimum of 6 years old. Classes run from September-May and registrations are open June-August.

Primera Comunión:

Programa de dos años en el programa de formación familiar es requerido. Los niños deben tener 6 años cumplidos o más. Inscripciones son Junio-Agosto y las clases son Septiembre-Mayo.

Youth Confirmation:

Candidates for Confirmation must be at least 12 years old and in 7th grade to start the program. A two-year religious education preparation is required prior to receiving the Sacrament.

Candidatos para Confirmación deben de tener los 12 años cumplidos y cursar el séptimo grado. El programa es de dos años de educación religiosa antes de recibir el Sacramento.

Catholics around the world join in prayer for peace in the Holy Land



Catholics around the world this week united in a day of prayer and fasting for peace and reconciliation in the Holy Land as war continues to devastate the region.

Cardinal Pierbattista Pizzaballa, the Latin Catholic patriarch of Jerusalem, called on Catholics to devote time to prayer with Eucharistic adoration and recitation of the rosary on Tuesday, Oct. 17, “to deliver to God the Father our thirst for peace, justice, and reconciliation.” The day of prayer fell on the feast of St. Ignatius of Antioch, the first-century bishop and martyr from Syria.

Pope Francis has called for another day of prayer and fasting next week for peace in the Israel-Hamas war. It will be “a day of penance to which I invite sisters and brothers of the various Christian denominations, those belonging to other religions, and all those who have at heart the cause of peace in the world, to join in as they see fit,” the Holy Father continued.

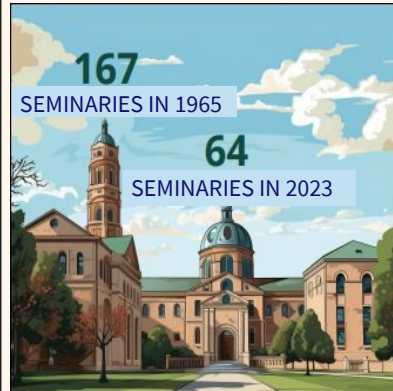

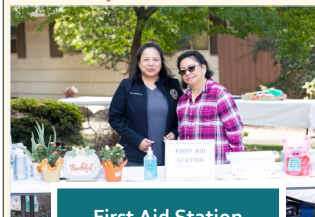
