


FORMED

January 21, 2024 3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time - formed.org

Review: When we are young, time can seem almost non-existent. It goes so slowly that it can feel like we'll always be alive and young. But as we get older, time seems to speed up. Every year passes more quickly than the last, and the way time seemed to stretch to infinity in our youth seems like an illusion. Think back to the summers when you were young and you'll remember that illusion. We often find ourselves in that same kind of illusion as Christians. Time still seems never to pass in the sense that we forget to look for the coming of Christ. Every day of our life can blend into the next with no sense of urgency to truly follow Jesus and live the Gospel. Our readings for today challenge that illusion. Though it can be easy for us to live our days as though Christ hasn't come, he has. And when he came, he fundamentally changed our world and redeemed it. His kingdom has come, and as Christians we are called to shake ourselves from the illusion of this world and to be witnesses to the presence of God that is all around us.

Featured study: Proclaiming the Kingdom

Reflection: In this short passage we see another call to repentance and another immediate response. In fact, everything in Mark's first chapter seems to happen "immediately." Mark begins immediately with the events of John's ministry and says nothing about Jesus's birth and infancy. John's ministry abruptly ends and Jesus's abruptly begins. Jesus calls the Apostles, who immediately abandon their nets to follow him. In fact, in the Greek, the word eutheós, meaning "immediately" appears eleven times throughout Mark's Gospel. So we see in Mark the sudden arrival of the kingdom or "reign of God" at the beginning of Jesus's ministry. Jesus says specifically, "This is the time of fulfillment." One would expect the divine power to have an immediate effect, and so it does. At Jesus's word, vocations, exorcisms, and healings happen immediately. Jesus has only to speak the word and miracles happen. But more than that—to borrow from St. John the Evangelist— he is the Word. Just as the divine Word speaks and everything is called into being, so also the Word Incarnate speaks and re-creates all of being. The Kingdom of God is indeed at hand.

CONFESSION & FIRST COMMUNION

Question:

Do children need to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before their First Communion?

Answer:

For centuries the Catholic Church has taught that a person needs to be in a state of grace (free from mortal sins) in order to worthily receive the Eucharist. To that end, Catholics should make an effort to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation any time they recognize the need for the sacrament (and in keeping with the precept of the Church that asks that we celebrate this sacrament at least once each year).

In the case of children preparing for their First Communion, the Code of Canon Law is very clear that they should also celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation before receiving the Eucharist for the first time: "It is the responsibility, in the first place, of parents and those who take the place of parents as well as of the pastor to see that children who have reached the use of reason are correctly prepared and are nourished by the divine food as early as possible, preceded by sacramental confession" (Canon 914).

The Magi, who were they?

The Magi were wise men from the "East" who came probably from Persia and who travel a great distance following the Star. They were so happy to find the child that immediately worshiped Him and presented to the Holy Family the gifts brought to the child: gold, frankincense and myrrh. By tradition we know that their names were Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar and that their gifts had a special interpretation: the gold, associated with His Kingship, the frankincense with

Bautizos:

Pope Francis: If you don't know the date of your baptism. look it up

Pope Francis said Sunday that if you do not know the date of your baptism, you need to look it up so that you can celebrate the anniversary of becoming a child of God and heir to the kingdom of heaven.

Speaking from the window of the Vatican's Apostolic Palace, the pope said on Jan. 7 that the anniversary of one's baptism should be celebrated each year "like a birthday."

"At baptism, it is God who comes into us, purifies and heals our heart, makes us forever his children, his people and family, heirs to paradise," Pope Francis said. "Let us ask ourselves: Am I aware of the immense gift I carry within me through baptism?" he added. The pope spoke on the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which commemorates Jesus' baptism in the Jordan River by St. John the Baptist.

Pope Francis urged people to reflect and ask themselves: "Do I acknowledge, in my life, the light of the presence of God, who sees me as his beloved son, his beloved daughter?"

He also encouraged Catholics to thank God for their parents who brought them to the baptismal font and gave them the gift of the sacrament.

"It is important to remember the day of our baptism and also to know the date. I ask all of you, each one of you to think: 'Do I remember the date of my baptism?'" he said.

"If you do not remember, when you go back home, ask what it is, so as not to forget it anymore because it is a new birthday, because with your baptism you were born into the life of grace."
