Review: Destruction is a powerful force. When we hear of it, we often picture devastating events or moments. However, with the death of one thing, newness follows. Take, for example, the seasons. Every year, winter comes and the trees and flowers wither. Their frail, bare appearance is not much to look at. However, as spring comes, those very trees and plants come to life and are made new again. Sometimes in our lives we feel that Christ is asking us to destroy parts of who we are to come closer to him. Why do we feel this way? The short answer is that we lack trust in him. We don't see how fulfilling his will gives us fullness of life. Deep down, we don't truly believe Jesus's words: "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly" (John 10:10, RSV).

Featured study: Discernment of Spirits by Fr. Timothy Gallagher. Good video but be prepared.

Reflection: This story of Jesus exorcising a demon from a man at a synagogue is the very first miracle narrated by the Gospel of Mark. Its placement signifies Jesus's mission to defeat the powers of darkness and free us from their dominion. The demonic power holding this poor man hostage reacts violently to the truth Jesus is teaching, crying out Jesus's name and taunting him. The New Testament provides several examples of the practice of naming demonic and angelic entities in order to gain power over them (cf Mark 5:9; Acts 19: 13). It seems that the demon is trying to assert himself over Jesus by naming him and his role in God's plan (cf Luke 4:41). When Jesus casts the demon out of the man, showing his own God-given power, the witnesses react with surprise. They are awed by his teaching, his spiritual authority, and the fact that even the demons are compelled to obey him. If we put ourselves into this story, we might choose to be in the shoes of the witnesses who are awed by the power of Jesus, but it might be more helpful to see ourselves as the man with the demon. He is chained by the demon and coerced against his will to speak against Jesus; he is no longer in control of himself. Our own sins can become like this demon: enslaving and oppressive. When we lose ourselves in sin, we can be deprived of freedom, trapped in a cycle of bad behavior. But Jesus frees this man and he can free us too, so that we can be "freed from sin" and become "slaves of righteousness" (Rom 6: 18).

Every first Saturday/Sunday of the month at each Mass,



Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS)



From Advent to Christmas and to Ordinary Time.

In the **Advent Season**, we were in preparation for the Celebration of **the Birth of Jesus**. In **Christmas**, we celebrated at home with our families, **The Nativity** of our **Lord** and **Epiphany**. Later we joined **the shepherds** and the **Magi** from the **Far East** in adoration of our **New Born King**. We also celebrated the **Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph** and asked **God** to bless our own families on Earth with hope, peace and much love for each other.

Now in **Ordinary Time**, we'll focus on our **Lord Jesus' Public Life**. **John the Baptist** just announced to us that Jesus, is the **Lamb of God** and that He will **baptize with the Holy Spirit**, the **giver of Life**. Now our eyes will be on **Jesus, the Man, God's only Son**, sent to save us from eternal death; sent to

make us **Children of God** and heirs to His Kingdom where we will live eternally in heaven in adoration of the **Blessed Trinity**.

OCIA Adult Faith Formation

"By the power of Jesus' death and resurrection, every human life is transformed and given an eternal destiny. These are reminders to us in stone and in marble that fundamental conviction that death does not have the final say on it,"...This statue points us in the direction of the absolute dignity of every one of those lives, that those lives matter to God and they matter to us, that they are not forgotten, they are not lost and through the power of our prayer, we lift them up to the Lord Jesus." Bishop Donald J. Hying of the Diocese of Madison said at the dedication ceremony of a pro-life sculpture by Slovakian artist Martin Hudáček called The Memorial to the Unborn II; a granite columbarium holding the cremated remains of the unborn. On 4th of February we will discuss a consistent ethic of life and social justice in our twenty-third session of OCIA, the process through which adults are received into full communion with the Church.

Pope Francis: 'In Christianity, there is no condemnation of the sexual instinct'

In a continuation of his catechetical series on vice and virtue, Pope Francis on Wednesday dedicated his general audience to highlighting the difference between love and lust, arguing that "in Christianity, there is no condemnation of the sexual instinct."

Centering his reflection on the "human experience," the pope drew upon the Song of Songs, also referred to as the Canticle of Canticles or the Song of Solomon, which he called a "wonderful poem of love between two lovers" that reveals falling in love "is one of the most astonishing realities of existence."

The pope observed that in this process there is an altruistic factor in which "a person in love becomes generous, enjoys giving gifts, writes letters and poems. He stops thinking of himself to be completely focused on the other."

"To love is to respect the other, to seek his or her happiness, to cultivate empathy for his or her feelings, to dispose oneself in the knowledge of a body, a psychology, and a soul that are not our own, and that must be contemplated for the beauty they bear," the pope said to the faithful gathered in the Paul VI Audience Hall.

Reflecting on the modern paradigm of dating and romance, the pope asked: "How many relationships that began in the best of ways have then turned into toxic relationships, of possession of the other, lacking respect and a sense of limits?"

"These are loves in which chastity has been missing: a virtue not to be confused with sexual abstinence, but rather with the will never to possess the other," the Holy Father continued.

The pope closed his reflection by noting that the "battle" against lust and the objectification of human beings is a "lifelong" process. However, it is one that preserves "that beauty that God wrote into his creation when he imagined love between man and woman."

"That beauty that makes us believe that building a story together is better than going on adventures, cultivating tenderness is better than bowing to the demon of possession, serving is better than conquering," the pope said.
