



Review: Many of us fear death. It brings sadness and an unknown. We may have experienced the grief of losing a loved one, and we may be angry that God allows death. But today's Gospel lends itself to hope. Jesus tells us that we must die in order to have new life. What a strange command. Let's pause a minute though to reflect on the nature around us. Every year, we see death come to the plants around us. The weather becomes cold and often gloomy and the trees are bare and flowers unfold. As we wait though, we slowly notice the days warming, the sun shining, and new life springs forth. There's a hustle and bustle with the birds chirping and the plants coming back to life with their colorful vigor. So too with us. We must experience a death of things in our lives that hold us back from blooming into the creation God has called us to be. We must allow these parts of ourselves to be put to death so that we may bloom in full color as we become fully alive, the man or woman God created us to be.

Featured study: Into your hands Father by Fr. Wilfrid Stinissen

Reflection: This Gospel reading finds Jesus in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover. A group of Greek worshippers, likely Greeks who regularly attended the synagogue, seek to speak with Jesus. When Jesus hears of it, since the inclusion of the Gentiles would be the final stage of God's plan of salvation, he solemnly announces "the hour has come." He means that the moment of the fulfillment of his earthly mission is at hand, the "hour" that had been delayed up until this point (2:4; 7:6, 8, 30; 8:20). Jesus cryptically predicts his own Death and Resurrection again with the metaphor of the wheat grain. He acknowledges a universal truth that applies in a particular way to himself at this time, that if you "love your life," then you will lose it, but if you "hate your life," you will keep it. He does not mean we should all be miserable but that we should be willing to lay down our lives, to "hate" our lives, for the sake of a greater purpose, for God's glory. Jesus then notes his own emotional disturbance over the prospect of death (12:27) but resolves to go through with it. Indeed, he says "for this purpose, I have come to this hour," meaning that all of his messianic mission has been leading up to this point, the time of his Passion and Death. Once he affirms his resolve, God speaks from Heaven for all to hear (v 28). The witnesses marvel at the voice while Jesus explains he will be "lifted up" on the Cross as he had earlier indicated (3:14) and thus draw everyone to himself.







Baptisms:

English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held once a month on Sunday from 11:30am-2:30pm.

Bautizos:

Bautizos en Español son cada 3er Sábado del mes a las 9:30 am. Clases pre-bautismales son el Domingo anterior al bautizo de las 9am-1pm.

Marriage:

As a minimum requirement, couples must contact the parish office and set an appointment at least 6 months prior to the wedding date. Marriage preparation classes online.

Matrimonio:

Se requiere que las parejas contacten a la oficina parroquial cuando menos seis meses antes de la fecha de matrimonio. Clases prematrimoniales son en persona.

First Eucharist:

A two year family formation program preparation is required. Children must be a minimum of 6 years old. Classes run from September-May and registrations are open June-August.

Primera Comunión:

Programa de dos años en el programa de formación familiar es requerido. Los niños deben tener 6 años cumplidos o más. Inscripciones son Junio-Agosto y las clases son Septiembre-Mayo.

Youth Confirmation:

Candidates for Confirmation must be at least 12 years old and in 7th grade to start the program. A two-year religious education preparation is required prior to receiving the Sacrament.

JESUS IS OUR GOOD SHEPHERD

Jesus knows each of us by name. He calls us and we follow Him because we know his voice. Jesus cares for us and provides us with everything we need. Jesus, our good shepherd, protects us and He even gave His Life for us! In Lent we pray more, we fast, and show more love and care for our family, friends and neighbors out of our love for Jesus. Lent reminds us of the great love of Jesus for us and how He suffered, gave His life and opened the closed doors of heaven for us. Jesus wants us to be with Him eternally. Let's make this Lent the best time of the year and show Jesus just how much we love Him too. Prayer, fasting and almsgiving, we are meant to repent. This is Lent.

OCIA Adult Faith Formation

It begins with Palm Sunday, commemorating Jesus' 'triumphal entry' into Jerusalem where he was greeted with crowds waving palm branches and crying 'Hosanna! Moving from the enthusiastic shouts of 'Hosanna' to the somberness of Holy Wednesday and Maundy Thursday, to the horrors of the agony and death of Jesus on Good Friday, to Saturday, Easter Vigil, commemorating Jesus' female disciples keeping watch at the tomb of Jesus to the joyous celebration of the first Eucharist of Easter.

This week we will be discussing The Meaning of Holy Week in our twenty-eighth session of OCIA, the process through which adults are received into full communion with the Church, on Sunday, 17th of March 2024.

Pope to children: Changing the world starts with 'please' and 'thank you'

Pope Francis has sent a message to all the children of the world, ahead of the very first World Day dedicated to them. World Children's Day, which will be held in Rome on 25-26 May this year "is fast approaching" he tells them. In his message, Pope Francis writes that he wants to speak to "each" of them because each individual is precious. At the same time, he continues, the message is addressed to "all" of them, because all children, everywhere, "are a sign of every person's desire to grow and flourish".

The Holy Father goes on to remind the children they are a source of joy for their parents and families "but also for our human family and for the Church" in which we are all connected. For this reason, the Pope encourages the children to pay attention to the stories grown-ups tell them....The Pope continues, if we want our world to flourish, being close to each other is not enough. "We need, above all else, to be united with Jesus", he says, explaining that with Jesus we can dream of the renewal of our human family and work for a more fraternal society that cares for our common home. Pope Francis explains that creating a caring and fraternal society starts with little things "like saying hello to others, asking permission, begging pardon, and saying thank you". If we are not ashamed to take small steps, one at a time, our world will change, he says.
